Report of the Board of Education.

Length of the school year thirty-eight weeks. The teachers have been faithful and conscientious in their work; scholars who have been regular in their attendance plainly showing this. The record of class work and examinations shows steady progress. \$613.50 has been received from the school fund of the State.

Two of our teachers, Hattie N. Boyd and Katie L. Locke resigned their positions to enter the Newburyport training school; Charles F. Janyrin and Ethel Beckman were selected to fill their places.

Guy W. Chase resigned from the Locke school, and Hattie N. Bowdoin has taught the fall and winter terms.

By request of Channing Folsom, Superintendent of Public Instruction, the following article has been inserted in the warrant for the school meeting:

"To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to unite with one or more town districts or special districts to form a supervisory district for the purpose of employing a superintendent of the public schools therein, under the provisions of Chapter 77 of the Session Laws of New Hampshire, 1899; [and to raise money to carry such vote into effect]."

At the school meetings last March, twenty-seven towns authorized their School Boards to enter into combinations with other towns for the purpose of securing expert supervision of their schools. The towns indorsing this principle were so

scattered that only one-third of the number were able to form districts, viz. :

1. Troy, Fitzwilliam, and Marlborough.
2. Newmarket, Durham, and Alton.
3. Salem, Hampstead, and Fremont.
