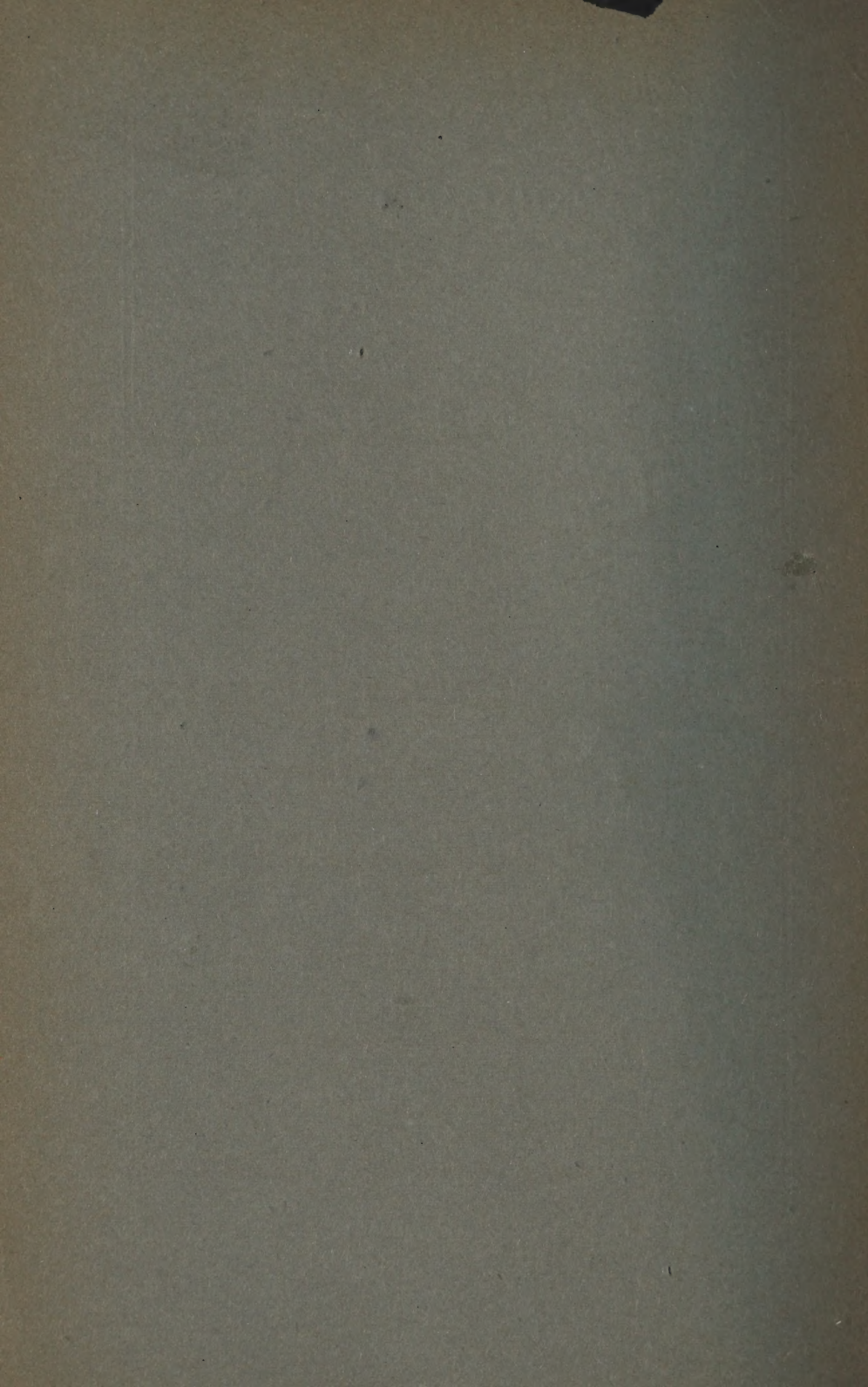

You are hereby notified to meet in Brewster Memorial Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

ARTICLE I.

To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE II.

To choose three Selectmen for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE III.

To choose three Road Agents for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE IV.

To choose two Auditors for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE V.

To choose a Fish and Game Warden for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE VI.

To choose a Collector of Taxes, Treasurer, and all other necessary town officers.

ARTICLE VII.

REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER.

To the Selectmen and Citizens of Wolfeborough:

The past year has been an unusually busy one for the Health Officer, who has made two hundred and thirty-four official visits.

There has been one case of Typhoid Fever; two cases Membranous Croup; Two Scarlatina; three Measles; seven Diphtheria; twenty-two Scarlet Fever, and what is remarkable no deaths from any of said diseases.

My thanks are cordially and reverently given to the physicians of the town for their co-operation and heroic efforts to stamp out what at one time looked like an epidemic.

The diphtheria cases were treated with anti-toxine with wonderfully good results, undoubtedly saving the lives of two at least.

My annual inspection of the surroundings of our public water supply showed some improvement.

A new duty is required of the Health Officer, which is to make a monthly report of births and deaths, sex, age, color and cause of death to Supervising Surgeon General, Washington, D. C.
