## Report of the Superintendent of Schools

The usual number of pupils attend the Bartlett school. As the mill at Kearsarge has finished for the time being, a number of the pupils at this place have moved away, and the Kearsarge school at Conway will be able to receive the Bartlett pupils.

The attendance during the fall and winter has been very small. Mumps, measles, and whooping cough have been prevalent, and it has been necessary for many to stay out of school because of sickness, while others have been kept from school, the parents fearing their children might contract the disease.

The work in the schools, so far as those attending is concerned, has been satisfactory. The pupils who have been obliged to lose much time will be retarded and most of them will be unable to complete the work of the year. I wish to speak in highest terms of the work of the teacher at Goodrich Falls, Miss Mabel Pitman. She has visited the homes of those who were unable to attend school, hearing their lessons, and giving her aid and sympathy. In this way all of her pupils are doing the regular work. She has a small school, but

the spirit of devotion to her work should be recognized and commended. Not is this all I find to commend. After the shades had been put into the school house by the school board, the teacher and pupils secured funds, and have placed dainty curtains and pictures in the house, thus giving it an air of refinement.

The state has been more generous with its aid to this town, and has paid to the treasurer the sum of \$1,790.82 for the use of the elementary schools. The same sum will doubtless be available for next year.

## Report of the Superintendent of Schools

*To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett Special District:*

In this my sixth annual report, I again wish to compliment you on the good work done in the schools, upon the good attendance, and the condition of your school houses. The following is a list of the teachers with the number of pupils enrolled:

The high school is doing the same grade of work done in schools with the full four years' course, except that only the first two years' work is given. Two of the pupils who were in the second year last year, are taking the third year's work in the high school at Conway. Their preparation for the third year's work has proved to be good, and they are well up in their work with the other pupils in their class.

In the graded schools the work is very satisfactory. A pupil in one of these schools moved to Portland, Maine, and entered the same grade to which she was assigned in the Bartlett school. The report has come back that she was not only able to go on with her grades, but that she has had two promotions this year.

One of the State Commissioners was in the schools while the pupils were taking their physical exercises, and he was so much pleased that he wished to secure a photograph of the pupils and teachers taking this work. There is a very noticeable improvement in the physical condition of many of the children. I suggest that the exercises be kept up, at least a part of the time.

The school houses are now in very good condition, except the roof of the grade building, which leaks badly at times. This needs attention as soon as the weather permits.

It would seem wise now to seriously consider offering a full four years' course in the high school. A large class will be ready to enter the first year's work

next September. About 12 pupils will be prepared for the third year, and they will either go away to school, or drop out altogether. If they go away to school, the District will have to pay the tuition, and the parents will have to pay the extra expense, while the pupils are subject to undesirable conditions of going away from home. The cost will not be, I trust beyond the ability of the District to pay. An extra teacher, and a moderate equipment in chemistry would need to be provided. It is to be hoped that you will consider it from the standpoint of the greatest good to all your children.

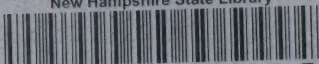
