Superintendent's Report

School Board of Bethlehem Town District :

I beg leave to submit the following statement concerning your schools.

The buildings have been somewhat improved. Blackboards and seats taken from other schoolhouses have been put where they would do the most good. The Gilmanton Hill building has been well painted. Besides the necessary text books and supplies, a small number of books for silent reading, or library use, has been placed in each school.

The teachers are all doing good work and are all Normal school graduates or holders of state certificates. Unless Bethlehem for some reason falls outside the application of the school aid law, this means \$8.00 a week coming to the district in its settlement with the state next December.

Your district will doubtless be called on to consider the question of a new school house at or near Wing Road. It would probably be out of place for me to say anything here as to whether the building should be erected or not. I think I may say that I hope if the house is built it will be put on a lot of good size and satisfy our best knowledge as to heating, lighting, water supply, rooms and other matters. It will cost little, if anything, extra to have the building right in the first place.

The West Hill building is most in need of thorough renovation. It needs better light as well as a new floor and paint. It would pay to put a basement under the building. The school room could be heated with more ease and cleanliness and less expense. The school yard is too small.

In making appropriations for the next year I believe the voters should consider whether they should not extend the school year to 36 weeks, to agree with neighboring districts. I will ask for \$125.00 for text books, supplies and apparatus. I believe this will provide the necessities of school life and leave a little for improvements. If it is desired that the older children have more chance to use their hands in manual training, cooking, plant growing, etc., as is being done in

many of the most progressive districts, a little more will be useful.

During the fall term 78 children were registered in your four schools, the average membership being 71 and the average attendance 67, per cent of attendance 94.3. The total number of tardy marks was 10, Bethlehem Hollow having none of for the term nor for a year. I am credited with 28 visits and parents and others have made 102 visits, of which West Hill has 52. Nineteen children were neither absent nor tardy for the fall term, 10 of them at Bethlehem Hollow.

With thanks for the kindness and consideration so generally extended, I conclude this report.
