## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.



To the inhabitants of the Town of Ossipee qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. (1) To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to defray the expenses of the Town.

Second. (2) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repairing highways and bridges and make appropriations of the same.

Third (3) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for decorating the graves of soldiers.

Fourth. (4) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase an iron bridge for the bridge near the house of F. H. Lord, and raise money for the same.

Fifth. (5) To see if the Town will vote to exempt from taxation for a period of years, the business of Wesley I. Nutter, provided he will locate in this Town.

Sixth. (6) To see if the Town will vote to build one or more eight feet snow rollers and raise money for the same.

Seventh. (7) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Highway Agents to let out the breaking of highways in the winter of 1898-9, to the lowest bidders,

Eighth, (8) To hear the reports of any officers of the town and take action thereon.

Ninth. (9) To choose Town Clerk, Treasurer, Selectmen, Highway Agents, Auditors, and all other necessary Town Officers and Agents for the year ensuing.

## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

---

During the past year twenty-nine weeks of school have been taught in all the 12 districts, except at Ossipee where the school is still in session.

The attendance has been fair but not what it should be, owing in part to sickness and bad weather, and in some instances we fear to lack of interest on the part of the scholars and parents.

Towns spend a large sum of money for schools and the scholars should feel an interest and show their gratitude for what the Town is doing to give them an education, and the parents should take more interest in the schools and show it by keeping their children in school all they possibly can, and by visiting the schools as often, as this encourages the teachers and pupils. The best schools are the ones that receive the most visits from parents.

If the parents visited the schools there would be fewer complaints about schools and teachers, and they would know what was being done in the schools instead of relying on the reports of children who are not qualified to pass judgement upon matters of teaching.

Education is the safeguard of this republic and we should do all we can in our schools to make good citizens of the children. They should be taught the history of our nation and the principles of our government.

They should be given historical works and news papers to read instead of trashy novels and stories.

Almost every child now has the chance to get a good education and it is their or their, parents fault if they do not receive it.

Every one should be qualified to think for themselves and study out the great questions of the day and be men, not the tool of others.

There should be grammar schools established at Ossipec and Centerville where the large scholars could receive more attention in advanced studies than they can in the ungraded schools at present.

Our school houses are in good condition except at Browns which building should be clapboarded and painted.

The Chickville house has received extensive repairs this year, and the Ossipec and Lake house's should be painted next year.

We would urge the citizens to continue the liberal support which has been given to the schools in the past.
