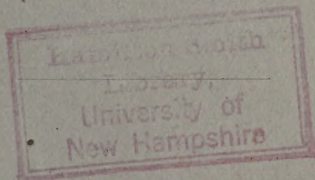

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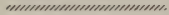

The whole number of pupils between the above ages who have attended school is 264. Several items of interest will be found in the tables annexed to this report. It will be necessary for the town to make a larger appropriation next year if it desires to have longer terms and more efficient schools.

There are comparatively few first class teachers ; to secure these, sufficient inducement must be offered in the direction of salary, etc. In view of the fact that there has been a revision of the school laws, attention of parents and guardians is called to the following section. "Every person having the custody and control of a child between the ages of eight and sixteen years, residing in a school district in which a public school is annually taught, shall cause such child to attend the public school for twelve weeks at least in every year, six weeks at least of which shall be consecutive, unless the child shall be excused by the school board of the district because his physical or mental condition was such as to prevent his attendance at school for the period required, or because he was instructed in a private school for at least twelve weeks during the year in the Common English branches, or, having acquired those branches in other more advanced studies." P. S. Ch. 93, § 14, p. 265.
