During the past year I have made 170 visits of Supervision and inspections in the different schools of the town.

Classes have been observed to all subjects, improvements and defects noted and the work of various individuals have been discussed with the teachers.

Standard tests have been given at intervals in both intelligence and achievement. The results noted and corrections made when necessary.

I believe that as far as possible the school should be made to fit the pupil and a pupil who is doing work commensurate with his ability is doing a satisfactory grade of work.

A class of three pupils was graduated last spring from the High School making a total in all of 33 graduates since the school has been in existence. It is proposed to make a follow-up of the work pursued by graduates in order to see how the curriculum can best be made to fit the pupils for their life work.

The school is now approved by the State as a Standard six year High School.

I believe that the incorporations of the seventh and eighth grades into the work of the High School have been beneficial both to the pupils and the school as a whole. Longer class periods are available for these pupils and a system of departmental teaching can be conducted,—a thing which was not possible under the old system. I would recommend that all seventh and eighth grade pupils of the town attend the Junior High for those years whenever at all possible.

Some changes in the teaching force was brought about through resignations last spring. The new teachers have proved themselves to be very capable and well qualified for their work and I believe that a very satisfactory grade of work is being done.

It is hoped that by another year a more sanitary means of obtaining drinking water at the village school may be obtained and that the ceiling of the furnace room may be covered with some form of metal ceiling in order to eliminate the danger of fire. The room in the basement for Manual Training may need slight enlargement in order to accommodate the pupils of next year but this can be easily arranged.

The M. E. Church has been very co-operative in allowing the Domestic Science girls the use of a stove and room and dishes there.

REPORT OF DISTRICT NURSE

I hereby submit my first report of the Pittsburg Public Health Nursing Association covering the 9½ months it has been in operation.

During this time 234 patients have received care. There have been 1256 visits made to sick people while some 767 additional visits have been necessary to carry on the other branches of the work; of these 260 were to schools, making 2023 visits in all to date.

There have been several times when medical aid was impossible to obtain in emergencies and several lives were saved by a prompt and handy emergency kit. At other times, in co-operation with our doctors, serious illnesses have been brought to a happy conclusion. In surgical and maternity cases the service has been especially useful. During the present "flu" epidemic some 89 cases have already been seen by the nurse and a doctor gotten in cases of need.

The people of Pittsburg have been very unselfish and co-operative in their use of the nursing service and very thoughtful of the nurse. It has been a real pleasure to work here. We hope everyone understands a little better the working out of the service recommendations. The small fee charge where the person can pay, has taken care of the upkeep of equipment, supplies and other small expenses of operating and seems a

very satisfactory rate. No small credit for the smoothly operating program is due to the efficient functioning of the committees, thus avoiding unnecessary mistakes in administration.

The school health work has gone on in coordination with the nursing work this year. Because of the heavy demand for bedside work it has been more difficult to accomplish and has been done between times. However we have held six clinics for the correction of physical defects among school children and the state requirements have been met in health work. Stewartstown and Clarksville have also been getting a certain percent of the nurse's time for their health work in schools. Warm lunches have been served the pupils during the colder months.

As a whole the work in Pittsburg has measured up fairly well with the required and accomplished in larger places, and has been very pleasant as well as useful.
