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# TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$362.74 to add to the net earnings of the truck to meet the note due on said truck.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Road Agent for the ensuing year.
5. To see if the Town will maintain the pay schedules adopted at the 1954 Town Meeting for Officers, Employees, and Equipment while working for the Town
6. To see what sums of money, including that required by law, the Town will raise and appropriate for buildings and maintaining highways and bridges, for the year ensuing.
7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$303.55 for Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$2,023.66
8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Winter Maintenance of highways.
9. To see if the Town will raise or borrow and appropriate any money for the purchase or hire of equipment for use on the highways or take any action relating thereto.
10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for painting the Town Hall or take any action relating thereto.
11. To see what sum of money, including that required by law, the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for a memorial or honor roll for Veterans, or take any action thereon, or take any action relating to the money already raised.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day, or take any action thereon.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Old Home Day or take any action thereon.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$43.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Company, or take any action thereon.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for other Fire Protection, or take any action thereon.

18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the aid of the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, New Hampshire, or take any action thereon.

19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money in anticipation of taxes.

20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to help stamp out White Pine Blister Rust, or take any action relating thereto.

21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$158.00 for Street Lights, or take any action thereon.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for a Town Dump, or take any action thereon.

23. To see if the Town will vote to accept a Trust Fund of \$200 00 to be known as the Charles Wellman Cemetery Trust Fund, the income to be used for the care of his lot in the Meeting House Cemetery.

24. To see if the Town will vote to dispose of the Tomb or take any action relating thereto.

25. To see if the Town will vote to enlarge and improve the cemetery near the church, and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

26. To see if the Town will adopt these regulations about burial lots, or take any action relating thereto:

1. Any resident, or former resident, who has paid taxes for at least ten years in Sullivan and needs a lot for any member of his family may have a lot without charge.

2. Any resident, or former resident, who has paid taxes for at least ten years in Sullivan who desires a lot in anticipation of needing it, may have it providing he does one of the two following things:

a. Creates a Trust Fund of at least \$150.00, the income to be used for the care of the lot or cemetery, as the Creator desires.

b. Places a stone of at least \$150.00 value in the lot within six months.

3. Other persons shall pay \$50 00 (less \$5.00 for each year they have paid taxes in Sullivan) in addition to one of the two above requirements.

27. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money for Civil Defense or take any action relating thereto

28. To see if the Town will appoint a Zoning Commission to recommend a Zoning and Building Code, or take any action thereon.

29. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, or Committees heretofore chosen, or take any action thereon.

30. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

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The school year 1954-55 opened in September with Sullivan's school buildings in excellent condition. Both rooms were freshly painted and floors varnished. Fluorescent lights had been installed in the Center school and these met with the hearty approval of the state health inspector. Storm windows were installed on the East School too. These improvements made both buildings more comfortable and healthful for both teachers and pupils.

The educational program was strengthened with some additional new textbooks and an encyclopedia, globe etc. and the program is in the hands of two capable teachers whom the district is fortunate to retain in their positions.

A long range view of school facilities in Sullivan indicates that no increase in enrollment may be expected from children now living in the community, though this condition may change if many new families moved into town. A glance at the grade enrollment chart printed in this report, will show that at least until 1959, our resident pupil population is static.

It is time, however, that the citizens of Sullivan gave serious thought to combining their two buildings into one structure and thus providing up-to-date and modern comforts and conveniences for its pupils. Modern toilet facilities, adequate playground space, running water, central heat, a kitchen and dining space for a hot lunch program and many educational advantages of a combined school, should not be denied to our children because of an expenditure of a few thousand dollars per year.

A careful study of the report of the school study committee appointed at the last annual meeting, should be made, with a view toward taking action in the March 1956 meeting.
