THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Tamworth on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairing highways and breaking snow for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid, as provided for in Section 4, Chapter 35, Laws of 1895.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars for maintenance of Trunk Line.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty Dollars for maintenance of—section already completed—Ossipee, Meredith Road.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for continuation of construction of the Ossipee-Meredith road.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairing and building bridges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars for improving the highway leading from Tamworth Village to West Ossipee.

10. To see if the town will vote to return to the Road

Agency System as provided in Chapter 29, Laws of 1893, as amended by Chapter 14, Laws of 1913.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, in addition to amount required by law, for the support of the Town Library.

12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for decorating soldiers' graves.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for electrical power for street lights.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for alteration and repair of Upper Hall of Town House

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be applied to town debt.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
