*To the inhabitants of the town of Allenstown
qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the selectmen's office in the brick school-house in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a moderator, three selectmen, town treasurer, clerk, collector of taxes, and all other necessary town officers and agents for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools; and for paying tuition of scholars in said town attending Pembroke Academy; for paying the town debts and defraying the interest thereon, and for other necessary charges arising in said town; for laying out and repairing highways and sidewalks, and building and repairing bridges; for the maintenance of the poor; to maintain public library.

3. To see if the town will vote to lay sewers in China and Ferry street, and across lands of the Boston & Maine railroad and the China Mfg. Co., according to a plan prepared by George W. Lane, and adopted by the town of Allenstown in 1897, and will chose a committee of three to purchase supplies and take charge of matters pertaining thereto. Also to instruct the selectmen to hire money, giving the notes of the town therefor to pay for all expense incurred at a rate not exceeding four per cent., and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 each year, until such notes are paid.

4. To hear the reports of the town treasurer and board of selectmen to the town auditors; the reports of the auditors,

agents, committees, or other officers heretofore chosen or appointed, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the town will fund its debt, or any part thereof, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To transact all other business which may come before said meeting.

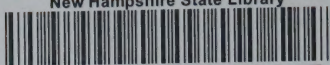
