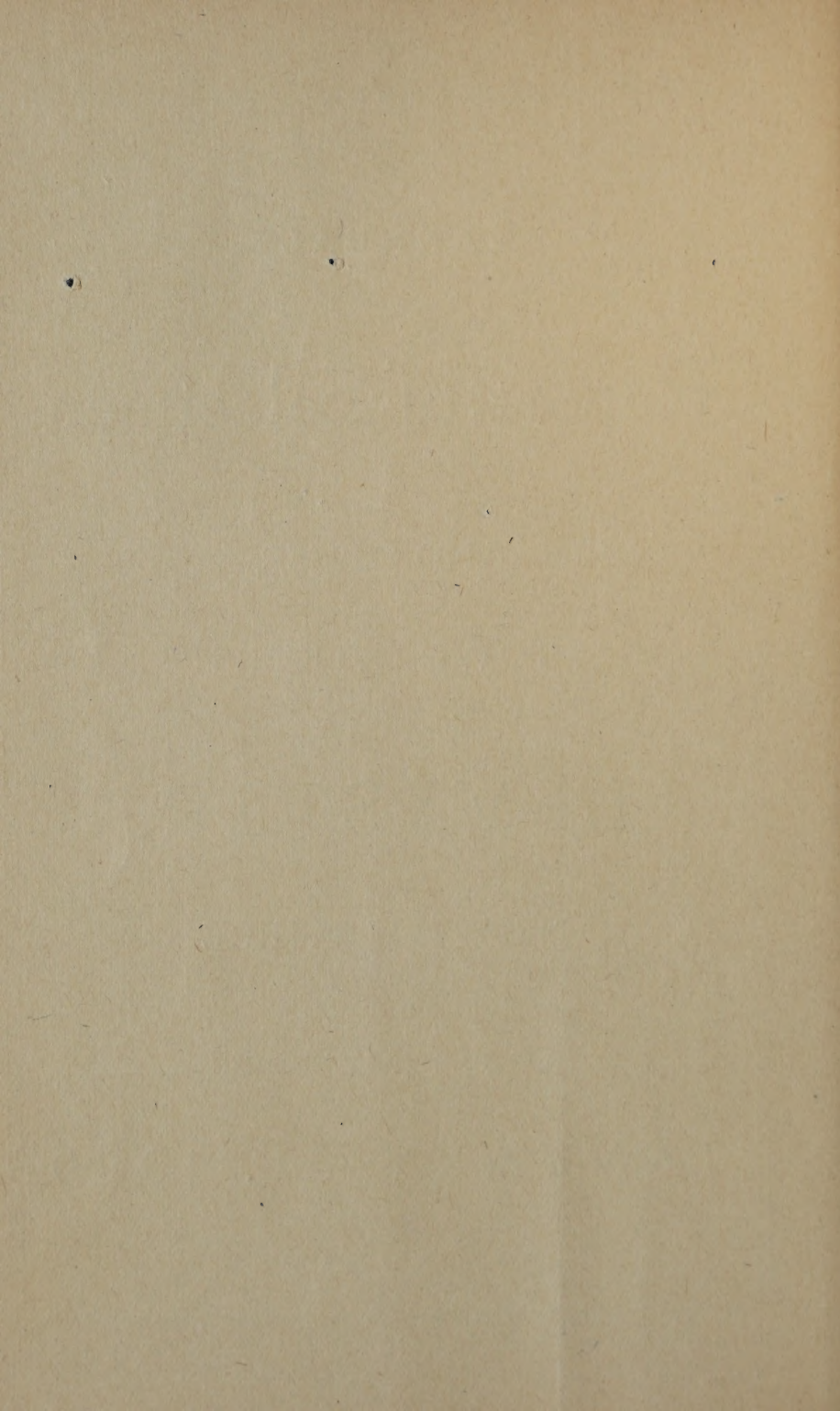

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lempster in the county of Sullivan in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Lempster on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

Art. 3. To see how much money the town will raise or appropriate for Memorial Day and Old Home Day.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the library.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for construction of highway, and raise money therefor.

Art. 6. To see how much money the town will raise to maintain the trunk line and state aid roads.

Art. 7. To see what sum per hour the town will vote for labor on the highway.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to deliver the blank inventories at the time they appraise the property for taxation.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not exceeding \$300.00 to be used for the construction of a cement bridge at some point to be determined upon.

Art. 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise or appropriate to carry out the recommendation of the library trustees in their report in regard to a soldiers memorial.

LEMPSTER TOWN REPORT

Art. 11. To see what sum the town will raise or appropriate to enable it to accept the offer of Mr. A. L. Wright for repairing the highway between the place he now owns and the Marlow line.

Art. 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

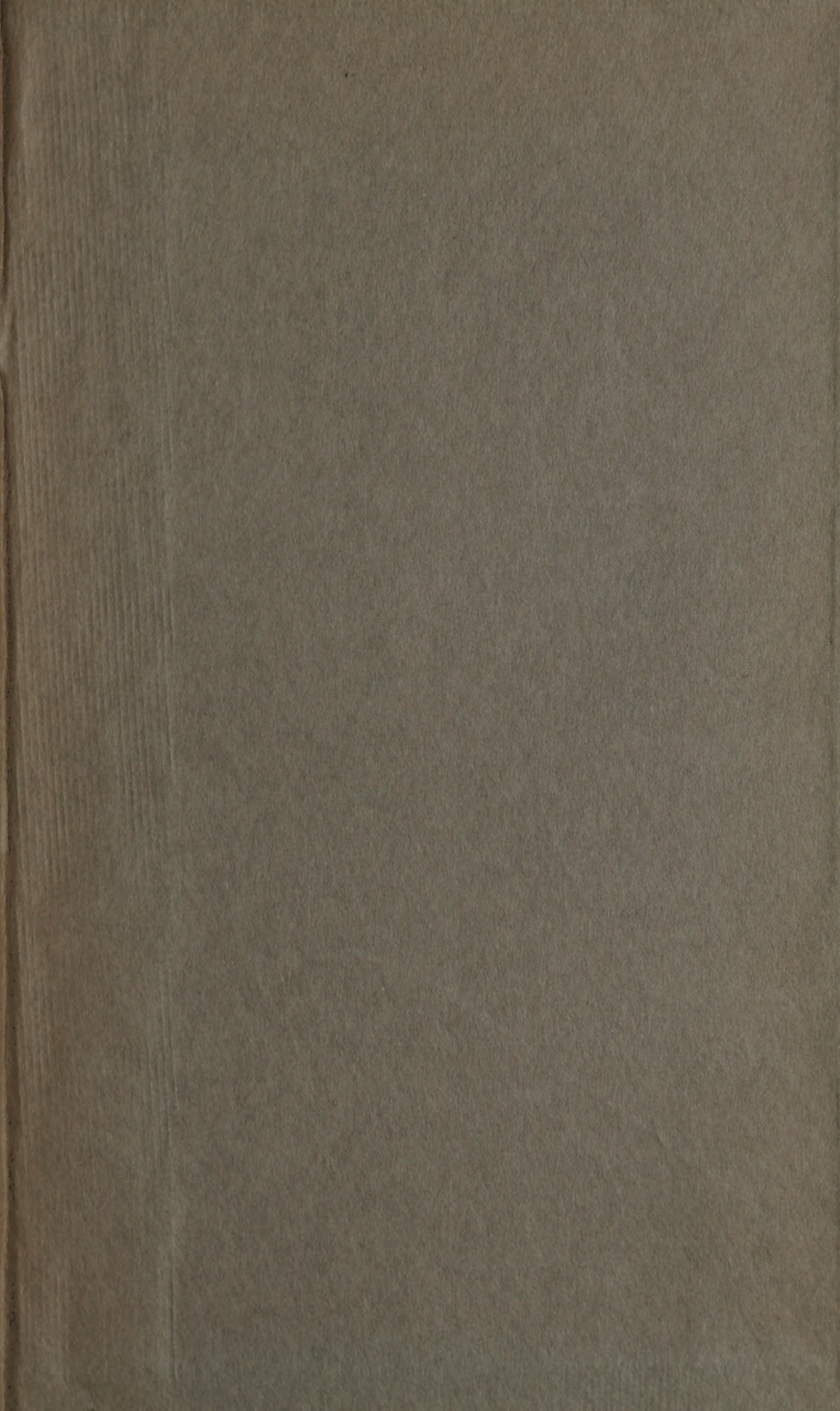
