To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State; qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To raise and appropriate the sum \$604.23 to add to the net earnings of the town truck to meet the note due on said truck.
- 4. To see what sums of money, including that required by law, the Town will raise and appropriate for building and maintaining highways and bridges for the year ensuing.
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$303.49 for Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$2023.27.
- 6. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and approrpriate for Winter Maintenance of highways.
- 7. To see if the Town will raise or borrow and appropriate any money for the purchase or hire of equipment for use on the highways or take any action relating thereto.
- 8. To see what sum of money, including that required by law, the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.
- 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day, or take any action thereon.
- 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Old Home Day, or take any action thereon.
- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$45.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Company, or take any action thereon.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for other fire protection, or take any action thereon.
- 14. A:—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$180.00 for a Red Network Telephone System.
- B:—To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Fire Alarm Sirens in conjunction with the Red Network system.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise or borrow and appropriate the sum of \$1600.00 for new equipment for the Fire Truck, or take any action relating thereto.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the aid of the Elliott Community Hospital of Keene, New Hampshire, or take any action thereon.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$158.00 for Street Lights, or take any action thereon.
- 19. To choose a delegate to the State Constitutional Convention, the polls being open for such purpose five hours.
- 20. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors or Committees heretofore chosen, or take any action thereon.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before the said meeting.

To the inhabitants of the school district in the town of Sullivan qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said district on the 12th day of March 1956, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote related thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums of money as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
 - 9. To see if the district will vote to deposit any balance

on hand at the close of the school year, in the capital reserve fund.

- 10. To see if the district wishes to continue the school study committee and increase its membership to four persons.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred (\$100) for expenses and architects services connected with the school study project.
- 12. To see whether the district wishes the school board and study committee to concentrate its report on (a) an addition to the center Sullivan school or (b) a new building located on some other plot of ground.
- 13. To see if the district will vote to transport all children living: A—More than one-half mile $(\frac{1}{2})$ from school, when road conditions make this possible, and to raise and appropriate eight hundred dollars (\$800) for this purpose; or B—to furnish the above transportation for all pupils living more than 1 mile from school and to raise and appropriate seven hundred (\$700) for such transportation.
- 14. To see if the district will vote to have a well drilled at the upper (Center) school with the necessary pump, plumbing and heating, and to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for said purposes and to authorize the school board to borrow on the credit of the district therefor by issuance of serial notes or bonds and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which said notes or bonds shall be issued; including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of The Municipal Bonds Statute, New Hampshire revised laws chapter 72, as amended by chapter 55 laws of 1949 and chapter 5 laws of 1951 and other amendments thereto.
- 15. To see if the district will vote to have a well drilled at the upper school, including necessary pump, plumbing and heating and to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500) for this purpose.

16. To take up any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

SULLIVAN SCHOOL STUDY COMMITTEE REPORT

The improvement of school facilities by a construction and alteration program was the basis of last year's study committee report. At the last March meeting the sum of \$100 was raised to permit the school board and study committee to employ the services of an architect to assist in presenting facts on a building program.

Mr. Norman Randlett, A.I.A. architect, who designed Winding Brook Lodge, The Harrisville, Troy, Chesterfield and Fitzwilliam schools, was asked to study the Sullivan school problem. After examining the schools, land sites, etc., the architect stated:

- 1. A complete new building with two classrooms, activities room, lunch room and modern in all details would cost about \$36,000. Since Sullivan can only raise \$27,000 on a bond issue, a new building is not possible.
- 2. The East Sullivan school is not located on a site which can be developed.
- 3. The upper school is in sound condition and can be re-modeled and with an addition made into an attractive and modern school. This structure would have two classrooms, an activities room, lunch room, assembly room, stage, toilets, central heat, etc. Such construction and alteration could be completed within the funds available.

Mr. Randlett has been asked to present sketches and floor plans for alterations and additions to the upper school and to obtain preliminary bids so that complete information on construction, costs and other features will be available for community study.

The following figures are offered as a preliminary estimate of financial facts related to the above proposed changes.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Sullivan is the last school district in the supervisory union which still continues to operate old-type one room schools, which offer little in physical attractiveness, comfort or health protection to the children of the community. Fitz-william, Harrisville, Chesterfield, Nelson and Troy have all modernized their school facilities during the past six years, Marlboro and Sullivan have citizens study committees examining school building needs. It is hoped that the report of the Sullivan Committee contained in this town report will be carefully examined by all citizens.

There are certain articles in the warrant which have been placed there to give the voters an opportunity to express the direction of their interest in matters of transportation, water supply and school construction. The school board and study committee need the guidance of the district in order to determine when further action should be taken to bring Sullivan school facilities up to a par with other near-by districts.

The Sullivan district is fortunate in being able to retain its teaching staff over the past few years despite low salaries now being paid and working conditions which need improvement. Mrs. Harris is doing an excellent job providing the lower grade children with a sound foundation in basic subjects, especially reading. Mrs. Wilbur is successfully preparing the older pupils for high school, where their scholastic records in the past have been good.
