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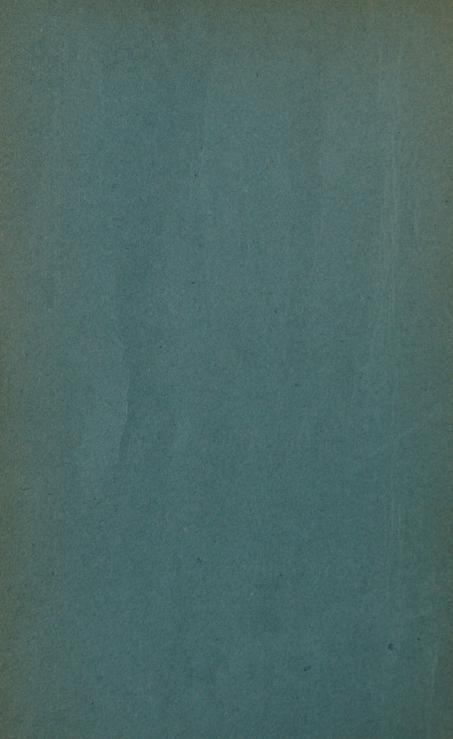

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TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the town of Benton in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Benton, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To choose one Selectman for one year.

Article 4. To choose one Selectman for three years.

Article 5. To choose one or more Highway Agents for the ensuing year not to exceed three.

Article 6. To choose one Library Trustee for three years.

Article 7. To choose one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

Article 8. To choose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and building bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 10. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for trunk line maintenance for the ensuing year.

Article 11. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for state aid maintenance for the ensuing year.

Article 12. To raise such sum of money as may be

necessary to prevent the blister rust on white pine forest of Benton for the ensuing year.

Article 13. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for memorial for the ensuing year.

Article 14. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to pay on town debt.

Article 15. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for other town charges for the ensuing year.

Article 16. To discontinue piece of road on Benton Flats beginning at the south line of Mrs. J. W. Ladue Homestead north side of little bridge going south to Pine Nole where the Moosilauke road leaves the old road.

Article 17. To choose all other necessary town officers and transact any other business thought proper when met.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Benton:

At the present writing there are 13 pupils enrolled at Benton Street, 3 at Glencliff, and 4 at East Haverhill. The town is paying the high school tuition of George Belyea and Lydia Fillian at Haverhill Academy.

The attendance for 1923-24 was not as good as for the previous year. The average attendance was 90%instead of 94% as in 1922-23. There were also twice the number of tardy marks. Marion McKeen was not absent nortardy during the year.

Carrie Campbell has charge of the school this year and the excellent work of previous years has been continued. The attitude of the pupils and of the parents is of the right sort. Benton is justified in taking, pride in its shool. Last year the register showed 112 visits from parents and others besides the superintendent and school nurse.

Miss Underhill, the school nurse, visited the school five times during the year and made six house visits. She reports an unusually well cared for group of children.

The old school houses at Benton Flats and Over East have been sold, leaving only the building at the Street to be cared for. I refer you to my recommendation of last year in regard to needed repairs on the latter building.
