## Report of Schools and School Board.

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The village school was in session thirty weeks. The Spring term of ten weeks was taught by Miss Lillie May Cook with her usual good success. A very satisfactory term indeed. The number of registered scholars was thirty-five. On the roll of honor we find John A. McDonald, A. Joseph McDonald, Maude J. Leighton, Mabel E. Hanson, Charles A. Leighton, Edna L. Hanson, Berne H. Leighton, Pearl I. Leighton, Ethel F. Gibson, Mary J. Worthen, Walter S. Downing, Marguerite McDonald. The Fall and Winter terms, twenty weeks, were taught by Miss Florence E. Hawkins. The number of registered scholars, for the fall term, of eleven weeks, was thirty-three. On the roll of honor were Mary S. Avery, Alice S. Downing, Maud J. Leighton, Pearl J. Leighton, Laura H. Worthen, Walter A. Downing, Joe Downing, B. F. George, Chas. A. Leighton, Berne Leighton. For the winter term of nine weeks, number of registered scholars twenty-seven. On the roll of honor were Mabel E. Hanson, Edna L. Hanson, Maud J. Leighton, Pearl J. Leighton, Walter A. Downing, Benny F. George, Berne H. Leighton, Chas. A. Leighton, Percy G. Simpson, Leon W. Simpson, Earl T. Simpson, Daniel S. Worthen, Fred J. Worthen. This was the fifth term of Miss Hawkins' teaching, all having been in our town. She has greatly improved in her work and can rightly be called a first class teacher. About one half of the whole number of scholars for the winter term were on the roll of

honor, and Maud J. Leighton has been on the roll of honor six years in succession.

The Town House school was in session thirty-one weeks. The spring term was taught by Miss Bertha Brown. Number of registered scholars ten. Those on the roll of honor were Agnes M. Collins, Edna L. Smith, Raymond C. Mack, Harvey E. Mack.

The fall and winter terms were taught by Miss Mary Clement; number of registered scholars for the fall term of ten weeks was eight. On the roll of honor were Agnes M. Collins, Raymond Mack, Harvey Mack. The winter term of eleven weeks, number of registered scholars five. On the roll of honor were Agnes M. Collins, Raymond Mack, Harvey Mack, Clarence D. Davis.

This was Miss Clement's first experience in teaching yet the scholars made good progress and on the whole was a very satisfactory term of school. We were sorry that some of the parents did not take interest enough in the welfare of their children to send them to school for the whole year, and receive the benefits of so good a school.

The Cram school was in session thirty weeks. The spring term of ten weeks was taught by Miss Rose J. Clement. Number of registered scholars was eight. On the roll of honor were Rena A. Haney and Leon H. Hawkins. This was Miss Clement's first term in our town yet it was one of good success.

The fall and winter terms were taught by Miss Ethel J. Collins. Number of registered scholars eleven. On the roll of honor were Rena Haney and Leon Hawkins. Winter term of ten weeks, the number of registered scholars was eleven. On the roll of honor was Leon Hawkins. This school was well taught, order good and excellent advancement made.

The Hawkins school was in session thirty-one weeks. The spring term of 12 weeks was taught by Miss Florence Hawkins. Number of registered scholars, was twelve. On the roll of honor were Blanche G. Hawkins, Roscoe H. Hawkins, Nelson S. Hawkins, Reginald C. Hawkins, Earl L. Smith. This school under Miss Hawkins' teaching was in fine condition.

The fall and winter terms were taught by Miss Mina J.

Whitcher. Whole number of registered scholars for the fall term of ten weeks was eleyen. On the roll of honor were Roscoe Hawkins, Reginald Hawkins, Nelson Hawkins, Blanch Hawkins, Earl Smith. The winter term of nine weeks, whole number of registered scholars was eight. On the roll of honor were Roscoe Hawkins, Nelson Hawkins, Reginald Hawkins. Miss Whitcher is a young teacher, but worked hard to make the school a success.

In submitting our report for the year the board wishes to congratulate the town in having good success in all our schools. It is sometimes the case in some of our public schools there is a lack of discipline and interest, but we feel that in our town we have great reason to congratulate ourselves in securing good teachers during the whole year. The teachers and scholars have done their part and the Board have tried to do theirs, but a very important part is for the parents.

It is very discouraging to raise money for school purposes when there is so little interest shown by the parents. It is your money that is being expended and for the children's benefit now and hereafter, for they are to occupy our places in a short time. We do urge the parents and all who pay taxes to interest themselves in our schools and visit them often to see how their money is being used. The Board are strongly impressed that for the interest of our larger scholars there should be something done right away to give accommodations for a graded school in the yillage, or for an assistant teacher.

A truant officer is also needed to compel these children who stay out of school, to go and receive good thereby.
