The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To choose one selectman, one trustee of trust funds, one library trustee for the ensuing three years.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on temporary loans.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sum of money, as is necessary to accept Trunk Line Maintenance, agreeable to Chapters 80, 84, and 85 Public Laws.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sum of money as is necessary to accept State Aid Maintenance.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 a year, for two years, the

State to appropriate \$7,500 a year for a like time, in support of joint resolution No. 68 (Jeness Pond Road).

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,068 to accept State Aid Construction.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,050 for street lighting.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Forestry.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in excess of the amount required by law for the Northwood Public Library.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for care of Cemeteries as provided in Chapter 55, Section 4, Laws of 1925.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 to purchase a fire proof safe for the Town Clerk's records.

16. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 20 passed at the Annual Town Meeting in 1926, so that it will read: To use the Australian Ballot at all Town elections in the election of Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Selectmen, Tax Collector, Road Agents, Fire Chiefs, Library Trustees, Trustees of Trust Funds, Auditors and Prohibition Officers.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to replace temporary loans.

18. To see if the Town will vote to discount two per cent. on all property tax paid on or before August 1st.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for Pine Blister eradication.

20. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Citizens of Northwood:

At the last district meeting, a special appropriation was voted for the purpose of remodeling the Ridge Schoolhouse. This project has been completed, with the result that this building now has three modern classrooms, one large room that can be used for assembly or practical arts, a convenient library, and a stock room. Indoor chemical toilets on both floors have replaced the old unsatisfactory arrangements. Parents, teachers, and pupils have expressed their delight at the cheerful surroundings provided. The district may well feel gratified that all three buildings now in use conform to approved specifications. The remodeling of the Ridge building is also making possible a considerable saving in fuel.

Only one change in elementary teachers has taken place, Miss Ruth B. Brown of Strafford, Keene Normal School, '30, coming to take charge of grades I-III at the Ridge school. At the dental clinic held last March, 69 persons were treated, with a total of 216 operations. Hot lunches are being served at the Mountain School this year for the first time, and are proving a great success, with the co-operation of pupils, teacher, and the district.

It is worthy of note that every one of the twelve graduates of the eighth grade in Northwood last June entered high school, either at Coe's Academy or elsewhere. Seven of the eleven graduates of Coe's Academy have already entered post-secondary institutions

for further training. This shows good guidance on the part of parents and teachers, and a fine ambition on the part of the young people.

Our eighth grade teachers have made commendable progress in the direction of so-called "vitalized graduations," in which is demonstrated the bearing of school training on citizenship and life. Our school programs have been enriched in recent years along the lines of health, music, and self-expression through the arts; nevertheless it is a striking fact that more minutes a year are spent on Reading, 'Riting, and 'Rithmetic in the schools than were spent on the same three R's one or two generations ago.
