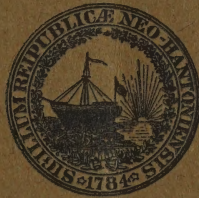

9. To see if the town will raise and appropriate money for White Pine Blister Rust control, with State aid.

10. To raise and appropriate money to pay part of pier loan.

11. To raise and appropriate money to construct new road on Brook Road.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Piermont:

I take pleasure in presenting my first annual report as Superintendent of the Schools of Piermont.

During the year 1926-1927 the total enrollment was 98. The schools were in session 175 days out of a possible 180. The percent of attendance was 94.70, a little higher than the average for the whole State, which was 94.57%. As the child, when absent, is always a loser, parents are urged to have their children, unless sick, present at every session.

This year the enrollment so far has been 93, which shows that the schools are fulfilling the same need in the community as in former years.

The teachers for the present year are as follows: Village Grammar, Dorothy Marshall; Village Primary, Loleta Moore; River Road, Evelyn Little; Brook Road, Estelle Holden; Clay Hollow, Jean Bickford; Rodimon, Velma Campbell.

Following the established custom Miss Underhill, the school nurse, has continued to look after the health of the pupils. The registers show that 47 school visits were made last year. An earnest endeavor upon the part of the parents to cooperate with the school in maintaining healthful conditions in the home will bring lasting benefit to the children.

There are two things of particular interest to which I would like to call especial attention. First, we had only one change in the teaching staff for this year. By paying fully as well as other towns we have been able to keep our teachers, to the decided advantage of the schools. Second, the five pupils who finished the eighth grade last June are all attending high school. This is a hundred percent record and could not be better. It is my firm belief that every boy and girl who graduates from the grammar school should pursue with earnestness the high school course, and that the time so spent will prove a valuable investment.

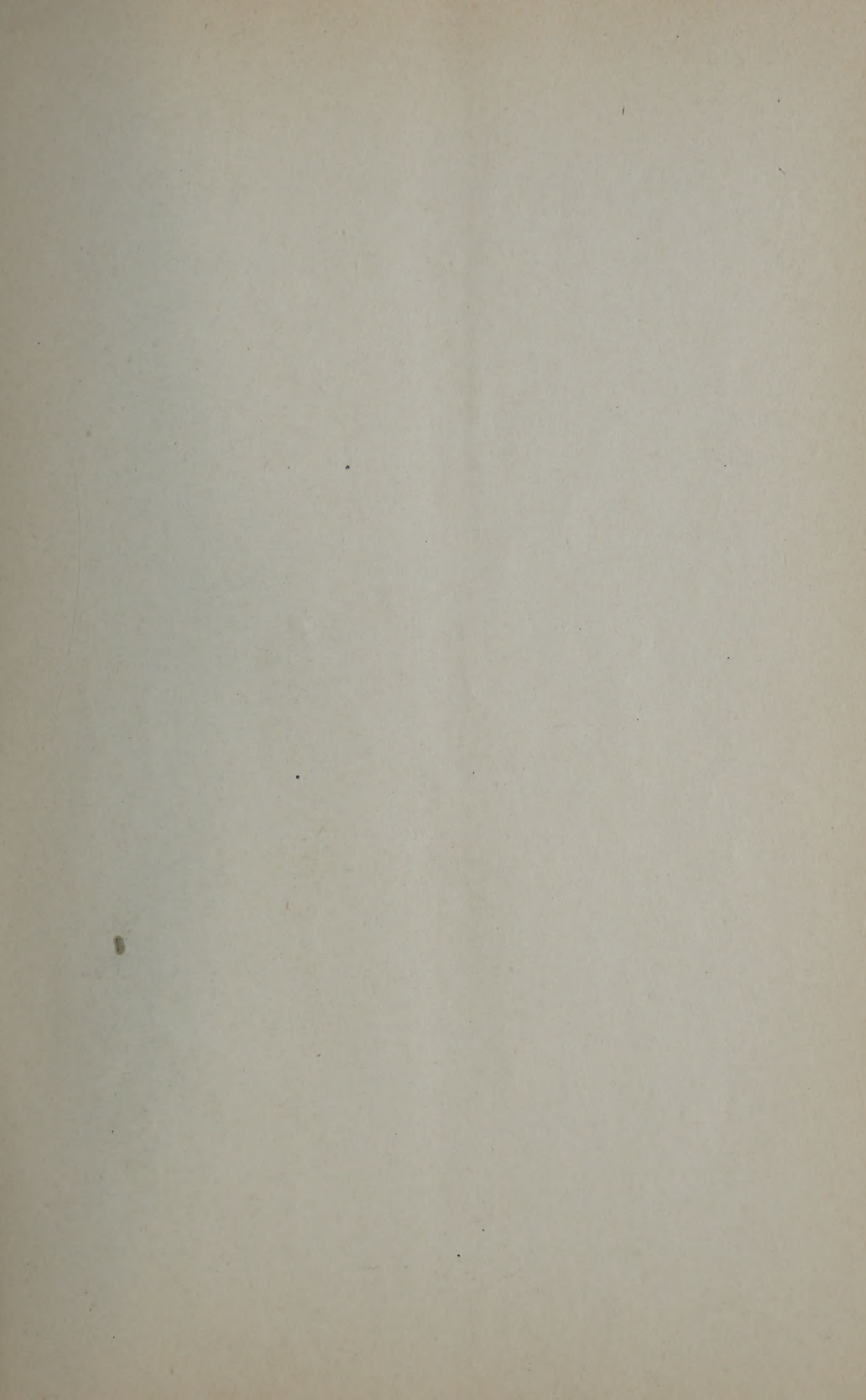

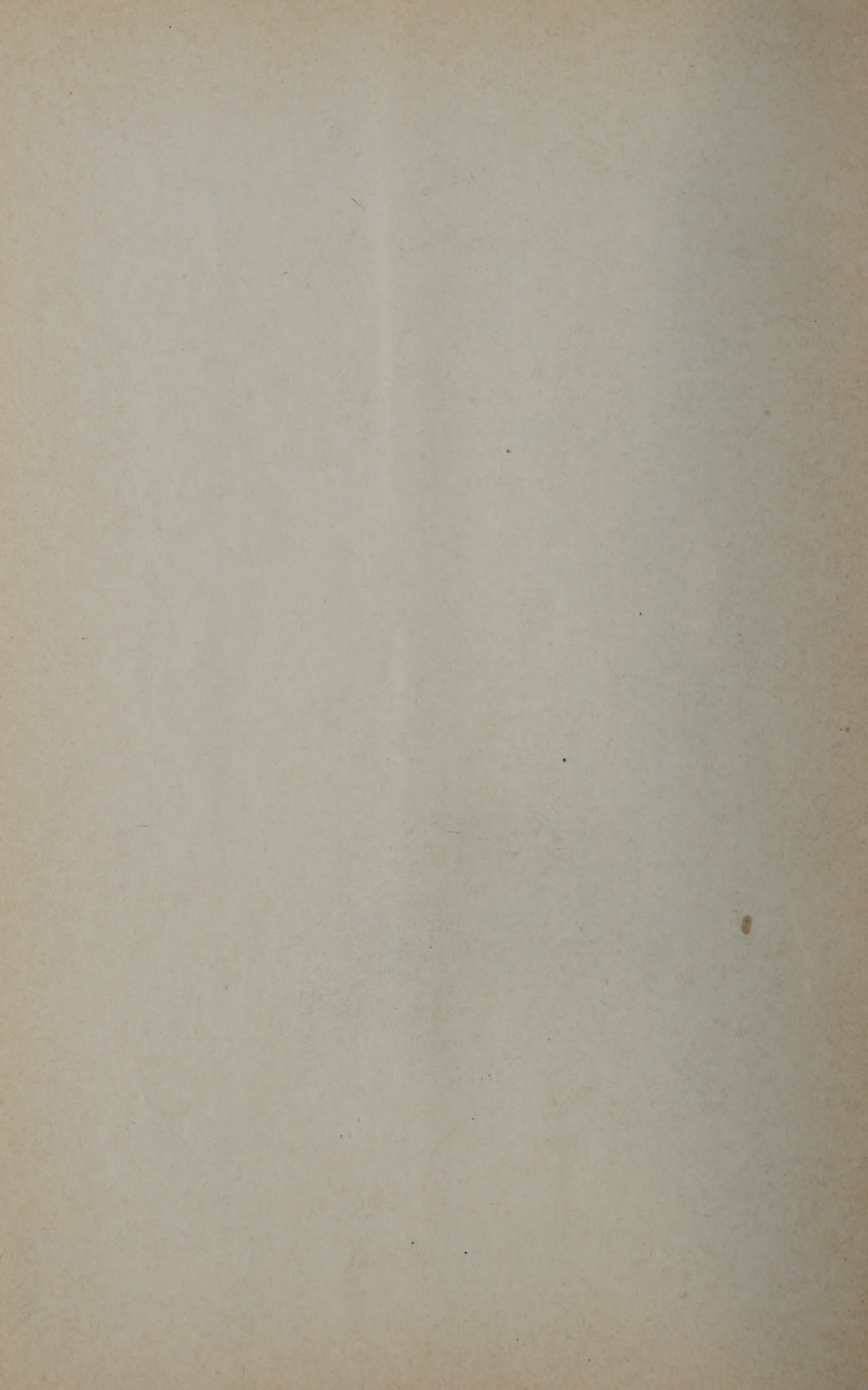
