It must be conceded by all that with the money at our disposal and the number of schools we are obliged to maintain, we cannot procure Normal trained teachers, yet it has been our endeavor to secure the services of bright, good principled young women and men who take this course of work to carry out plans for their more thorough education. We thank them for the interest they have taken in their work. We think those who have taken the greatest interest in their work have been highly successful.

Deploring the fact that our schools are growing less in numbers we think this should have a tendency toward uniting several of our smaller schools. Parents and others have made more visits to the schools the past year than for several previous years, and with profit to themselves and pupils we believe.

Thanking the many who have given us their generous support and criticising none, we respectfully submit the foregoing report.
