## WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING OF 1905.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the town of Wolfeboro qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet in Brewster Memorial Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

ART. 1ST. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 2ND. To choose three selectmen for the ensuing year.

ART. 3RD. To choose two auditors for the ensuing year.

ART. 4TH. To choose one library trustee for the ensuing three years.

ART. 5TH. To choose a collector of taxes, treasurer, and all other necessary town officers.

Art. 6TH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges in addition to that required by law.

ART. 7TH. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January session, 1905.

ART. 8TH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town expenses.

ART. 9TH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and pay on its indebtedness.

ART. 10TH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay for breaking the roads the past winter.

ART. 11TH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and pay each fireman legally returned for the year 1905 in addition to that required by law.

ART. 12TH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and pay James R. Newell Post No. 61, G. A. R. of this town to assist in defraying expenses of Memorial Day, May 30, 1905.

ART. 13TH. To see if the town will vote to assist in the observance of Old Home Day for the year 1905, and what sum of money it will vote to raise and appropriate for that purpose.

ART. 14TH. To see if the town will vote to continue the water system on Sewall Street to the residence of E. B. Dickinson, and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

ART. 15TH. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the highway known as Sewell Street lying between an iron hub set in the ground near the lot of Edward T. Milton and an iron hub set in the ground near the lot of Joseph L. Young.

ART. 16TH. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the lower end of Green Street, beginning at a point where land of Mrs. Adeline Phillips and others joins that of George A. Carpenter, and extending to terminus of said street. "If at any time the town desires to open a highway beyond the said discontinued portion, said George A. Carpenter waives all land damages of said discontinued portion and will give bond, if required, to turn over said discontinued portion, in as good state of repair as it is at the present time."

ART. 17TH. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed five hundred dollars for the purpose of concreting sidewalks on North Main Street, agreeable to a petition signed by Charles H. Johnson and others.

ART. 18TH. To see if the town will vote to have constructed a sewer on North Main Street, adequate for the requirements of residents residing in this section of the town, and what sum of money it will vote to raise and appropriate to carry such measures into effect, agreeable to a petition signed by M. P. Thompson and others.

ART. 19TH. To see if the town will vote to open a summer highway around the end of Lake Wentworth, beginning at a point on the highway near the residence of Charles P. Moore, and continuing so as to intersect with the pond road, near the Charles Whittom homestead, as will best convene the public, and to raise and appropriate money for the same, agreeable to a petition signed by Fred W. Prindle and others.

ART. 20TH. To see if the town will vote to use meters on its water system, and vote to raise by bond, or otherwise, money for the purchase of the same.

ART. 21ST. To see if the town will vote to re-lay the "wild line" of its water system and vote to raise and appropriate money for the same.

ART. 22ND. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate toward the purchase and erection of a soldiers' monument in said town.

ART. 23RD. To see if the town will vote to annually publish a list of the polls and ratable estate or inventory of said town as assessed by the selectmen, and to raise and appropriate money for the same annually.

ART. 24TH. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to revise the rules and regulations governing water rentals.

ART. 25TH. To see if the town will establish a police court and provide a suitable compensation for the judge of such police court therein.

ART. 26TH. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF WOLFEBORO:

Your Selectmen, in submitting their report for the year ending February 15, 1905, desire to bring the affairs of the town, as plainly as possible, before you for examination.

The finances of the town at the beginning of the fiscal year just ended, so far as working capital was concerned, were in a depleted condition.

There was no money in the treasury. There were unpaid bills from last year to the amount of \$860, and the necessary bills contracted in the early part of this year, which had to be paid before any taxes could be collected.

To meet these demands your Selectmen borrowed on the credit of the town \$2,000 until such time as the taxes could be collected in sufficient amounts to meet the running expenses.

Your present Treasurer in displaying his usual good judgment selected a bank in which to deposit the town's money that enabled him to get interest enough on the deposits to a little more than pay the interest on the money borrowed at the beginning of the year.

In nearly every case the town's expenses have exceeded the appropriations.

Under the head of town expenses you raised \$3,000. Under that head \$3,170.54 have been paid out. The larger part of the deficit was caused by expenses on the case of the Town vs. Whitton and Clow, bondsmen for your former Treasurer. As there will be additional expenses on the same case the coming year, your Selectmen would suggest that you raise the sum of \$3,500 for the town's expenses.

Your appropriation for breaking the roads for the winter of 1903 and 1904 was, as you will see by the following report, insufficient for that purpose by about \$250.

The breaking of the roads in the winter is absolutely necessary and must be done.

In the judgment of your Selectmen, it will be necessary, in order to make up this deficit, and to pay for breaking the roads this present winter, to raise \$3,000.

During the past summer there have been extensive and permanent improvements made on our highways, which the Selectmen deemed necessary for the best interests of the town.

To obtain these good results it was necessary to greatly exceed the appropriation for the summer highways.

In order that the permanent improvements be continued it will be necessary to raise more money. For this purpose \$1,500 in addition to what is required by law is recommended.

You raised \$1,500 for the purpose of raising and rebuilding the Twombly and Whitton bridges, which has been done in a most satisfactory manner. The cost did not exceed the appropriation.

Your Selectmen have made it a point to have every outstanding bill against the town brought in and paid as far as possible.

Inasmuch as there were not sufficient funds in the hands of the Treasurer to pay all of the bills presented, an order on the Treasurer was drawn and the bills left in his hands to be paid as soon as there was money enough.

You will find in the report of the Treasurer a summary of all orders in his hands unpaid, which will show the condition of the town's finances, February 15, 1905.

In regard to the case of the Town vs. Whitton and Clow, bondsmen for your former Treasurer, we will say that owing to the somewhat complicated circumstances attending this case there has been as much progress made as your Selectmen could reasonably expect.
