Dear Sir :

As you know, the government, through the Forest Service, has spent some money in each of the last two years on the Swift River road, it occurred to me that the tax payers of Albany might be interested in knowing to what extent the Government was aiding in keeping up this road. There follows a summary of the amounts expended in each of the two years and the nature of the work done. This can be printed in the town reports if thought desirable.

For the year 1917, the United States Dept. of Agriculture, through the Forest Service, allotted \$240.00 for maintenance and improvement of the Swift River road. The labor of forest officers at \$2.50 per day amounted to \$97.50, making a total outlay by the Government of \$337.50. This

money was spent in repairing and surfacing the Albany Intervale end of the road and in constructing a stone culvert near Swift River Falls.

For the year 1918, \$260 was allotted. Labor of forest officers at \$3 per day amounted to \$225. The stumpage value of timber cut and used in constructing railing amounted to \$75.60. The total outlay by the Government was \$560.60. This money was spent in widening to an average width of 15 feet, the nearly half mile of dugway just beyond the residence of Dixie Smith and in building 1800 feet of railing for the same. This rail will be completed during the coming spring.

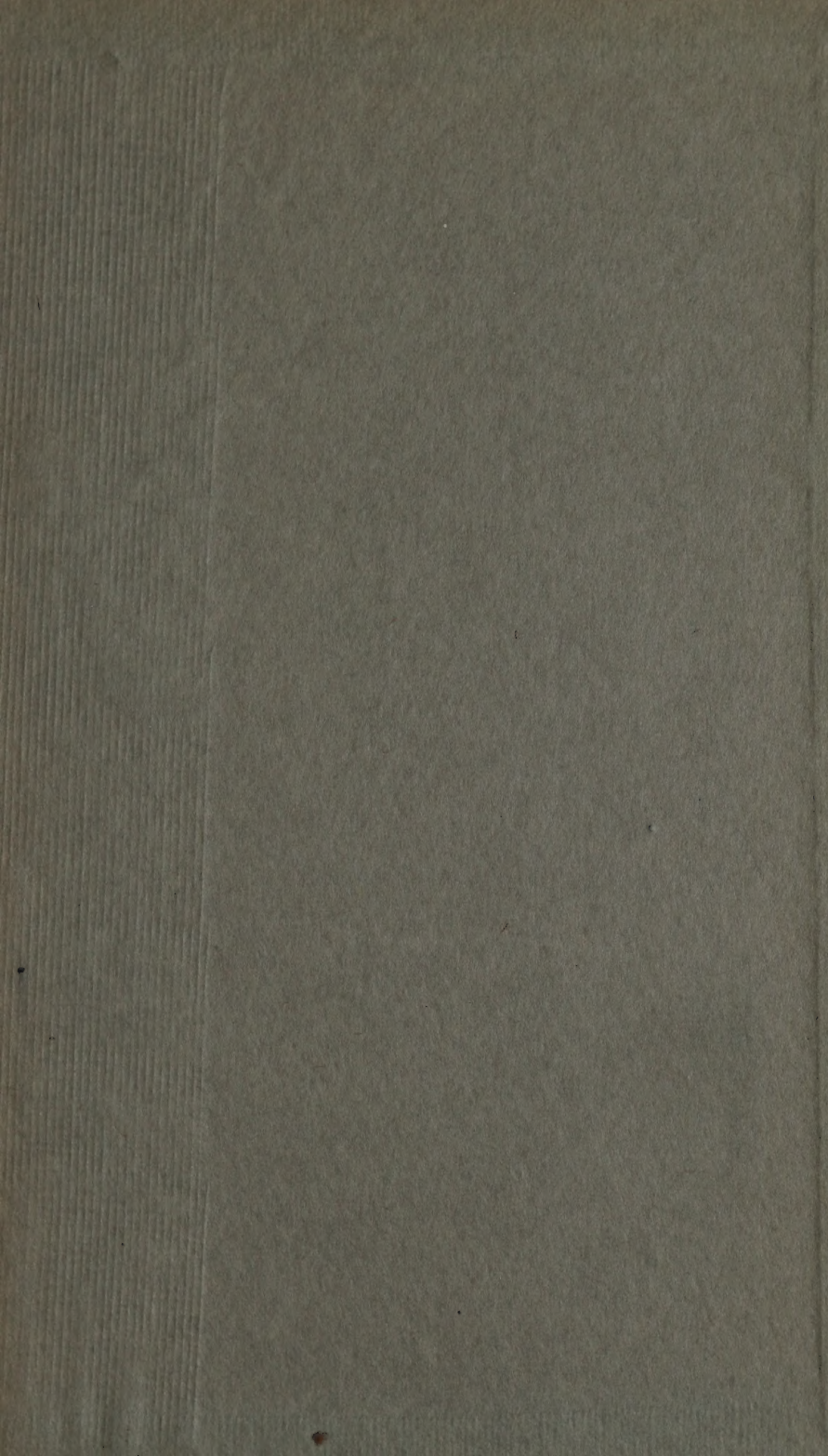
