

- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to make application to the State, for State Aid for highways for the present year.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate fifty (\$50.00) dollars for Grant Post, G.A.R.
- 5. To see what action, if any, the town will take relative to the purchase of additional equipment for plowing snow, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 6. To see what sum or sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of town cemeteries.
- 7. To see what sum or sums of money the town will vote to raise for reduction of town debt.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to pay Etter French damage caused by dredging Saco River and make appropriation for same.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The union of the two school districts by legislative act has presented no unusual or difficult problems of administration. Financially, it should make little or no difference in the total of school costs, and the only difference due to the new situation is that the school tax is spread at a uniform rate throughout the town.

There will be six members of the school board and two vacancies to fill each year until or unless the school district legislates otherwise. The usual number of school board members is three which is doubtless adequate, but it can be said that the present board of six members has worked effectively and in full cooperation.

The proposal to build a central school at Glen has been disposed of for the present. The schools at Glen, Goodrich Falls and at Intervale will be operated probably for a number of years. These buildings have been put into condition to meet the sanitary requirements of the state board of education and are for the present at least fairly satisfactory. All have sanitary toliets and water and Goodrich Falls and Intervale have modern heating and ventilating stoves. The seats are not adjustable and it is impossible sometimes to find a seat to fit each child.

The equalized valuation of the district is \$1,550,975, and the \$5 tax to qualify for state aid is \$7,754.88. The Special District has always received state aid but the Town District has received none for several years. The new district should receive some aid but we could not make a very satisfactory guess as to the amount. This will be known at the time of the school meeting.

The school board is publishing with this report a detailed budget of expected expenditures for the coming year. It is a new departure and is to be commended as a good business procedure. Careful study has been made of the minimum requirements of school operation and of the statutory requirements. This budget will be voted on under article six of the warrant, and while the voters have the right to make alterations in the budget, no change should be made without an intelligent understanding of its effect. The law requires that equal school opportunity of standard grade shall be offered to all children of school age and the selectmen are required to assess a tax sufficient to do the job.

Appropriations for high school tuition, high school

transportation and insurance are not statutory and must be voted as special appropriations. Appropriation was made last year for the payment of tuition in Kennett High School for eight Kearsarge pupils. As it proved, there was no room for them at Bartlett, had it seemed desirable to send them there.

An arrangement with Conway has been in existence for a number of years for the accommodation of the Kearsarge elementary pupils in the Conway school at Kearsarge Village. Bartlett pays Conway one half the expense of this school or approximately \$525 in lieu of tuition and transportation. The situation changes here somewhat from year to year and it is impossible at this date to determine the most economical way of caring for these pupils. However, it is advisable to provide in the budget for a continuation of the present arrangement until some better way is apparent.

The work of the school nurse has been very valuable and deserves the highest commendation. More than half the cost of the nurse is reimbursed to the district as an addition to state aid.

The superintendent believes that this first year of operation as a single district has been marked by a distinct advance in the work of the schools.
