Report of Schools and School Board.

The money raised for school purposes this year, we are confident, has been well expended. In making two schools of one at the village the schools have been greatly benefitted.

They have had more time for work, not the regular routine, but work that makes scholars interested in their school work which, with a crowded, ungraded school, no teacher can accomplish. Our teachers, with one exception, throughout the town have been conscientious and faithful in their work, and the children have shown progress. The parents are awakening, somewhat, to the fact that they, too, must rally around the teacher and scholars in order to have the school what it should be. Parents, bear in mind that in your children you, with the teacher, are moulding the minds of our future men and women. See to it that the teacher is doing her part of the work faithfully.

We should feel proud of the work in the school at the Village.

For the year the Grammar grade has been under the instruction of Mrs. Alice P. Sargent, a teacher of experience and ability. The registered number of scholars for the spring term 19. Roll of honor: Mabel E. Hanson, Edna L. Hanson, Maude

Leighton, Pearl I. Leighton. The Primary Department has been under Miss Ethel J. Collins' instruction. Miss Collins is especially adapted to the smaller children. The Town House school was in session 24 weeks. We have had the same teacher for the year, Miss Stella Hayes. This was Miss Hayes' first experience and she has labored hard for success.
