STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hooksett Qualified to
Vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

2nd. To choose a Town Clerk, three Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Collector of taxes and one or more Fish and Game Wardens and all other necessary town officers and agents for the year ensuing.

3d. To hear the reports of the Town Treasurer and Board of Selectmen and Agents, Committees, or other officers heretofore chosen or appointed and to pass any vote relating thereto.

4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools and for laying out and repairing highways and bridges and for other necessary charges arising in said town.

5th. To see if the town will vote to raise the highway tax in money and purchase a town team to work the road machine with, under the direction of the Selectmen.

6th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair the Town House.

7th. To see if the town will vote to have the inventory of the taxable property, both resident and non-resident, printed in the report of the fiscal year ending Feb. 28, 1889.

8th. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

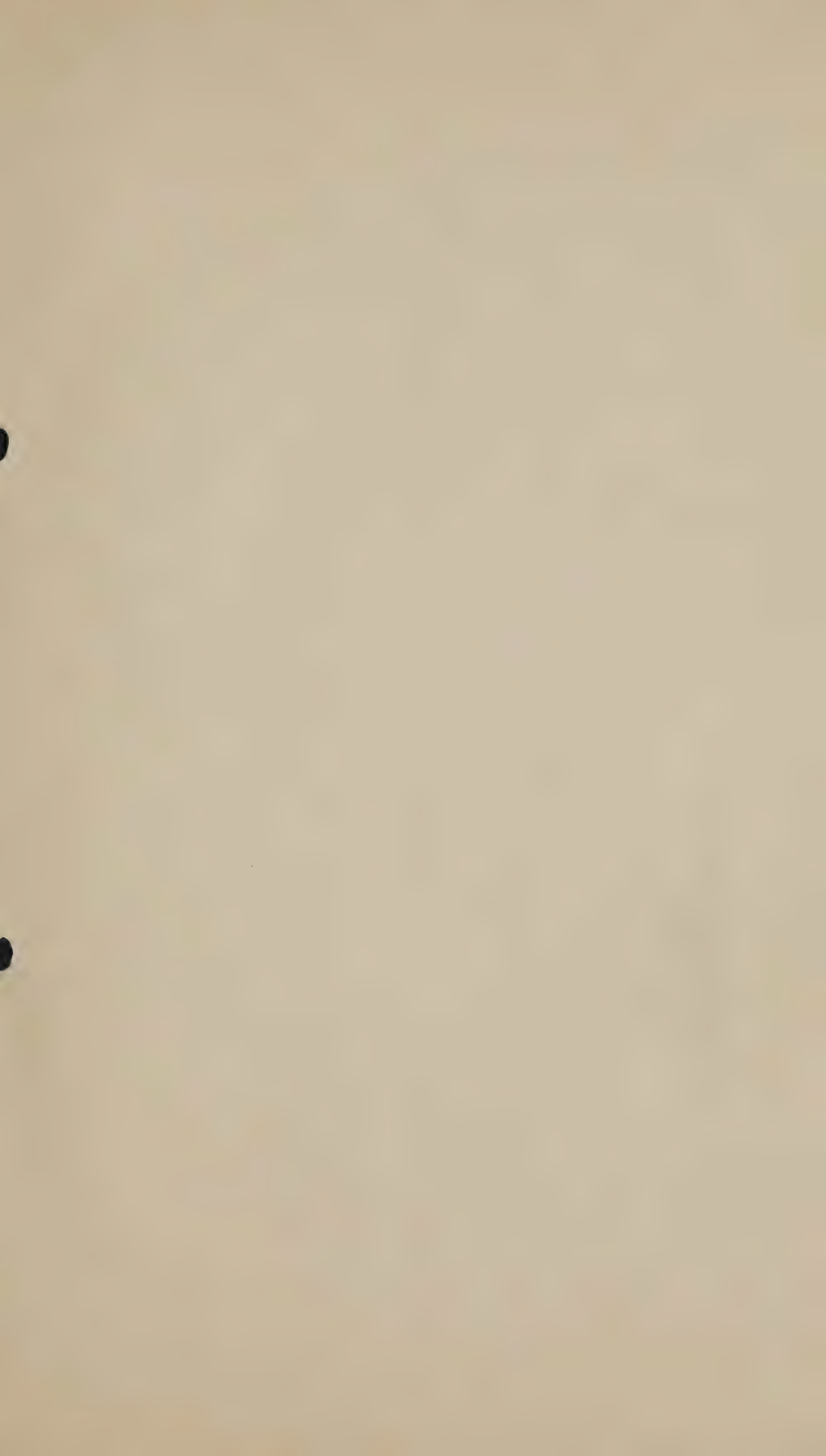

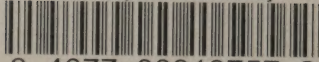
