## State of New Hampshire

---

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Milan in the County of Coos in the said State qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are notified to meet at the Knights of Pythias Hall in said town on Tuesday the 12th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects viz:

1st. To vote for Candidate to send to the Constitutional Convention.

2nd. To choose necessary officers for the ensuing year.

3rd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor and other necessary charges arising within the town.

4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for laying out and building and maintaining highways and bridges.

5th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking roads during winter of 1918 and 1919.

6th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for building State Highways.

7th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintaining State Highways.

8th. To see if the town will vote to repair the Hagar Bridge and raise money for the same.

9th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise.

to finish repairing the washout on the East Side near River Side Cemetery.

10th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of school.

11th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the purchase of books and other expenses of the Pubne Library.

12th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the proper observance of Memorial day and Appropriate same to the Grand Army.

13th. To choose a Library Trustee for three years.

# Report of School Board

---

## Chairman Report

To the Citizens of the School District of Milan.

Again I have the privilege of submitting to you a report of our schools.

## Repairs

The Jewett school house has been put in a first class condition, hard wood floors were laid the walls and ceiling papered a platform in front has been built, the shed has been connected to the school house and the closets has been built to meet the requirements ordered by the Board of Health take it as a whole the school house is in as good condition as any to be found anywhere. The Hamlin school school house has had the shed connected to the school house as per order of the Board of Health and so has the shed at West Milan but on account of the scarcity of labor none of them are quite complete.

There is yet the Milan Village shed to be repaired and the Hodgdon and Milan Hill all of which will have to be done as soon as possible.

## Books and Supplies

The schools are short of books on account of the high price of supplies we were not able to purchase as many books as we were in want of but managed to get along only by letting some of the schools go without. Supplies cost as much again in 1917 as they did in 1915 some new slate blackboards have been put in at West Milan which we could not very well get along without. We have a fairly good stock of paper and pencils, etc., on hand and are in

hopes that with the \$600. asked we shall be able to supply the books which we are in want of.

### Teachers

We have a good grade of teachers but on account of the closing of the schools we are unable to say at the present time how many we shall be able to retain out the year.

On account of the low price paid for teachers there are a good many taking up with other work where they get more wages and work 52 weeks instead of 32 as we plan to have in Milan.

When you stop to think that we are not paying but a very little more now than we did two years ago you will understand why it is so hard to get teachers.

The change or the moving out of town of Miss Augusta Nichols which we all regretted very much left us with only two members but by doing the best we could we managed to get along until we were obliged to close the schools.

Mrs. Newell and I have made a careful estimate of the expense of the school for the next 44 weeks and we find that the expense will be about as follows:

For the support of schools now why we have to reckon on 44 weeks of school, you will have to ask those that know. The state superintendent instructed us to make out estimates for 44 weeks or up to Aug. 31, 1918, we have done so, or tried to do so. As I look at the estimate and think of the increase of everything in the past year and a half, I do not think it is enough to run the schools to Aug. 31, 1918.

**Supplies**—I have told you that I think we may be able to get along with the \$600. if not the children will have to go without.

**Repairs**—There should be a hard wood floor in the Hamlin School house, and the roof of the school house in Milan Village has got to be repaired in some way, it has got so that it leaks

badly, so much so that the plastering is dropping in the upstairs room and has started the plastering in the primary room.

**The Salaries of the Officers**—Well of course there is not any one working for the same pay they did four or five years ago, so you cannot expect the school board to do so, or the treasurer, or the truant officer, so a word in this line is not amiss.

**Repairs ordered by the State Board of Health**—The complaint came from the State Supt. He made the complaint to the State Board of Health, and they ordered it done, when we got word that we had to do something we done what we could last fall and must do the balance in the Spring. I told all those that were at the school meeting what ought to be done and now we have to do it.

I am not sure that we have made out estimates large enough, but if it is not, we can do as we had to do to start with, hire enough to finish.

There are some things I should like to see done and that is transportation. I am sure that the parents do not take the proper view of this matter, but I am going to leave that to the next board of Education.

Now in closing, I want to thank every one that has helped me to do the best I could for the children in the town of Milan. I want to thank the boys and girls for trying to do the best they could, and the teachers for helping to make our schools a success as they have been, and the other members of the Board of Education.
