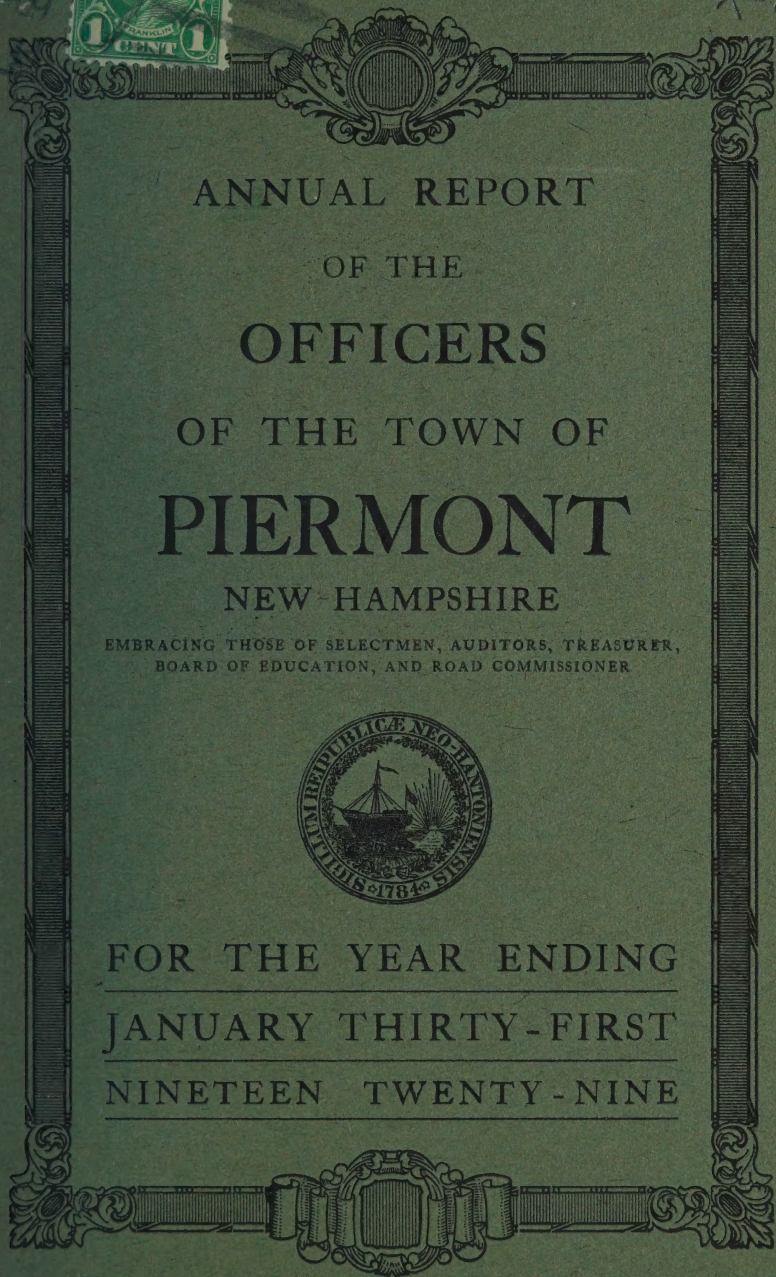

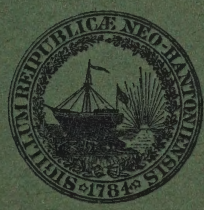

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Piermont, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Piermont on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.

3. To raise and appropriate money to maintain highways and bridges.

4. To raise and appropriate money to maintain trunk line with State aid.

5. To raise and appropriate money to maintain State road with State aid.

6. To raise and appropriate money to construct State road with State aid.

7. To raise and appropriate money for support of Library.

8. To raise and appropriate money for observance of Memorial Day.

9. To raise and appropriate money to control White Pine Blister Rust with State aid.

10. To take action in regard to buying a power shovel.

11. To raise and appropriate money to construct new road on Brook Road.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Piermont:

I herewith present my second annual report as Superintendent of the Schools of Piermont.

Year 1927-1928.

Total enrollment, 96.

Schools in session, 175 days.

Percent of attendance, 94.42%.

Cases of tardiness, 195.

Visits by members of Board, 10.

Visits by superintendent, 201.

Visits by school nurse, 55.

Visits by citizens and others, 275.

The above figures show the size of the schools and the record of attendance for last year. The number of cases of tardiness was far greater than necessary. It is bad for the school and bad for the child when a pupil comes in late. We want our boys and girls to grow up with a strong sense of responsibility, and the habit of promptness is one of the essential factors in developing this ideal.

This year the enrollment has been 86. The following are the teachers: Village Grammar, Josie M. Fadden; Village Primary, Evelyn Little; River Road, Ethel W. Lang; Brook Road, Muriel L. Hardy; Rodimon, Velma C. Campbell.

During the last few months there have been made several improvements at the Village School. The outside has been painted and the ceilings inside whitened. There have also been installed electric lights and the most modern type of window shade for light control. An oil stove has been provided so that it is now possible to have a hot dish to serve at noon. This serving of something hot with the lunches has been the custom in the other buildings for some time.

Attention of those parents, who will have children old enough to enter school next fall, is called to the vaccination law. This law requires all children attending school to be vaccinated. Exception is made in the case of those who are excused by the Board of Health as physically unfit.
