## CLINTON CONTINUES TO LEAD, BUT SUPPORT SOFTENS

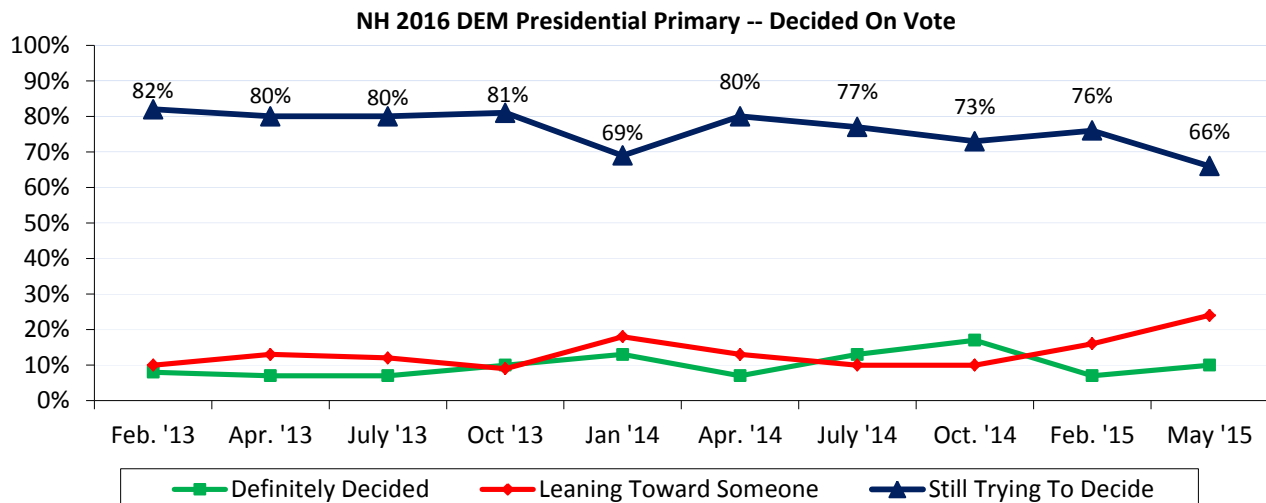
DURHAM, NH –Hillary Clinton remains the frontrunner in the 2016 New Hampshire Primary although support for her has dipped somewhat in recent months. Her favorability ratings among Democratic primary voters have dropped significantly since February.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Seven hundred and six (706) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 24 and May 3, 2015. The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.7 percent. Included were two hundred twenty-nine (229) likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (MSE = +/-6.5), two hundred ninety-three (293) likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (MSE = +/-5.7), and six hundred and twenty-seven (627) likely 2016 presidential election voters (MSE = +/- 3.9).

### NH Voters Not Engaged

2016 is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the New Hampshire Presidential Primary, and with months remaining before the election, prospective Republican and Democratic candidates have been testing the waters here. However, most voters have not yet engaged. While many of the candidates discussed in this poll will decide not to run, and others may enter who were not discussed, candidates who are the early identified frontrunners have usually won past New Hampshire primaries.

New Hampshire primary voters typically decide who they will vote for in the last weeks, or days of the campaign and it is no surprise that very few voters have made up their minds about who they will support in 2016. Currently, only 10% of likely Democratic primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 24% are leaning toward a candidate, but the great majority of voters (66%) are still trying to decide who to support.

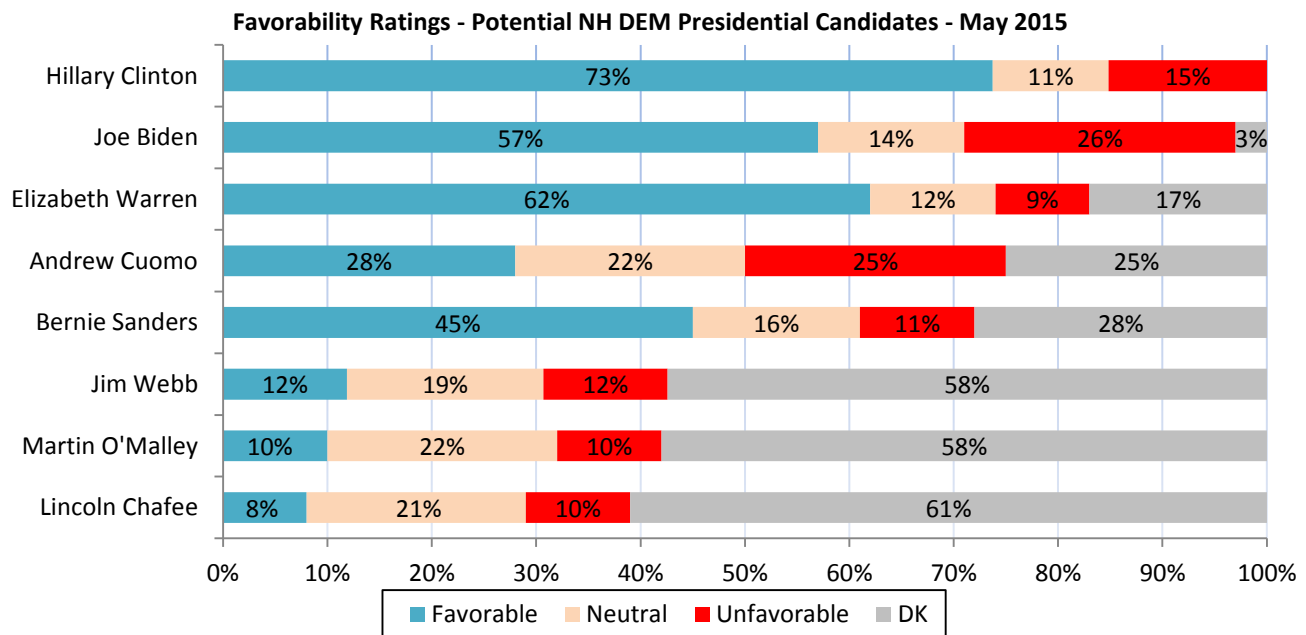
Currently, 35% of likely Democratic primary voters say they are extremely interested in the election, 35% are very interested, 21% are somewhat interested and 10% are not very interested. This is similar to this point in the 2007 cycle, when 39% of likely primary voters said they were extremely interested in the 2008 Democratic primary, 38% were very interested, 17% were only somewhat interested, and 5% were not very interested.

However, it appears that the electorate is more interested in the Republican primary than the Democratic contest. Undeclared voters, often erroneously referred to as “independents”, are much less likely to say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary than they were in 2008. Currently, 40% of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Republican primary, only 23% plan to vote in the Democratic primary, and 37% say they will not vote in either primary. At this time in 2007, 54% of undeclared voters said they would vote in the Democratic primary, only 20% said they planned to vote in the Republican primary, and 26% said they would not vote in either primary or were unsure which primary they would vote in.

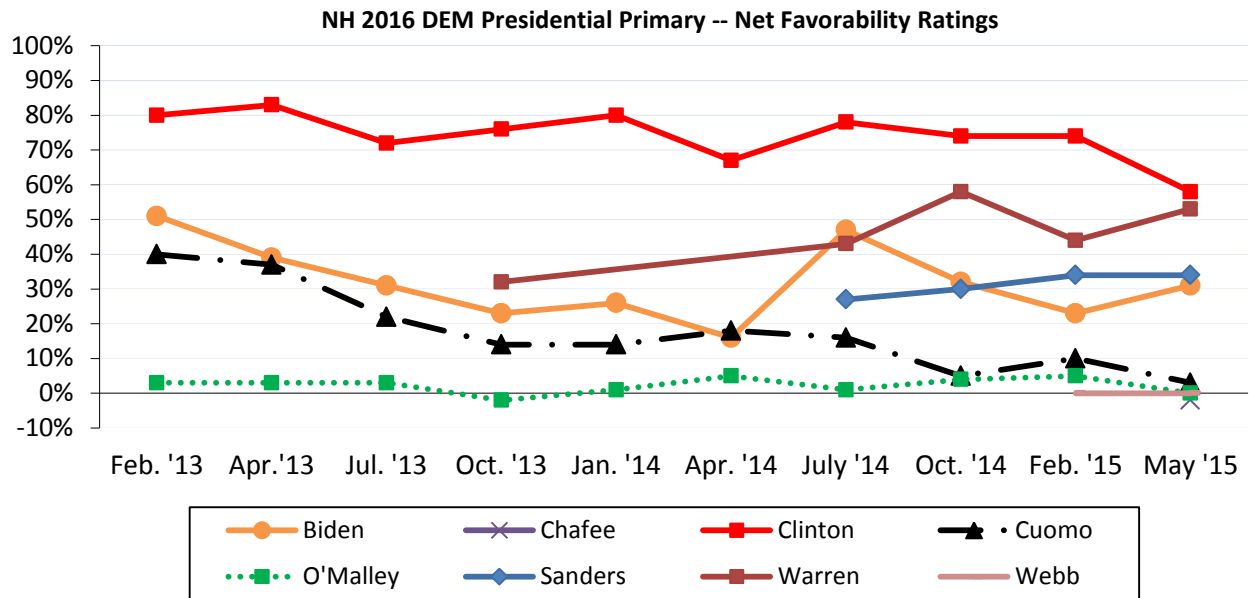
### Democratic Favorability Ratings

2008 New Hampshire Primary winner Hillary Clinton remains the most popular Democratic candidate. Most likely Democratic Primary voters, 73%, have a favorable opinion of Clinton, only 15% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 11% are neutral or unsure. Her net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus those who have an unfavorable opinion, is a high +58%. Massachusetts Senator Elizabeth Warren who has not indicated she will run, has high net favorability as well (+53%).

Potential candidates with moderate net favorability ratings include Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders (+34%) and Vice President Joe Biden (+31%). Former Maryland Governor Martin O’Malley (+0%), former Virginia Senator Jim Webb (+0%), and former Rhode Island Governor Lincoln Chafee (-2%) and are less well known and have lower net favorability ratings. Despite being relatively well-known, New York Governor Andrew Cuomo (+3%) continues to have a low net favorability rating.



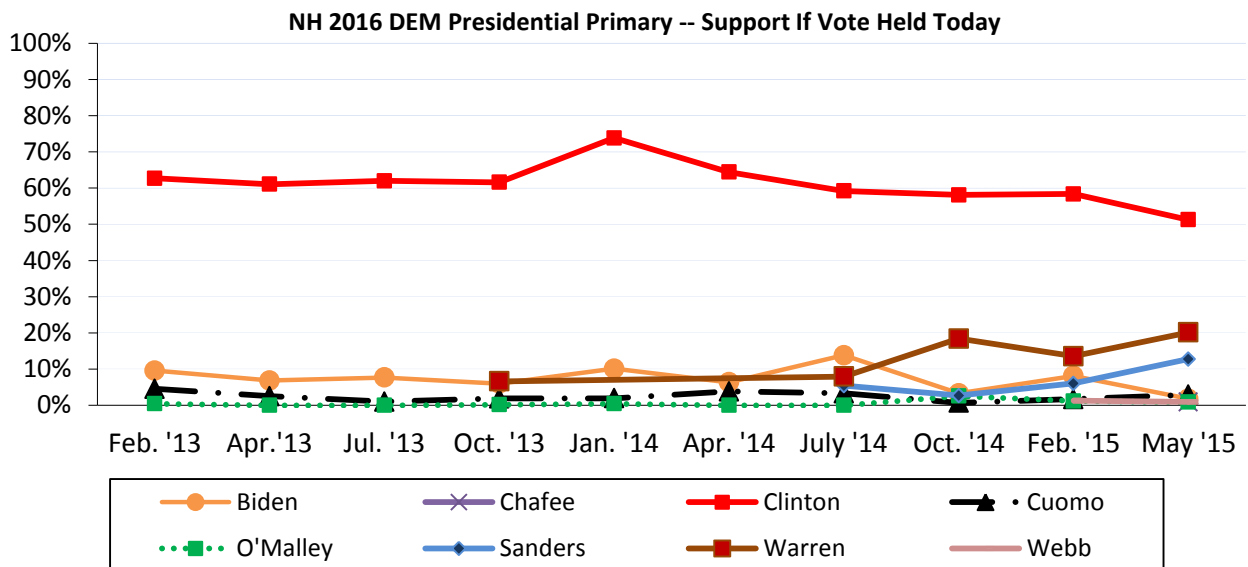
Clinton has been the most popular Democratic candidate over the past two years, but her net favorability has dropped from +74% to 58% since February.



### 2016 NH Democratic Primary Trial Heat

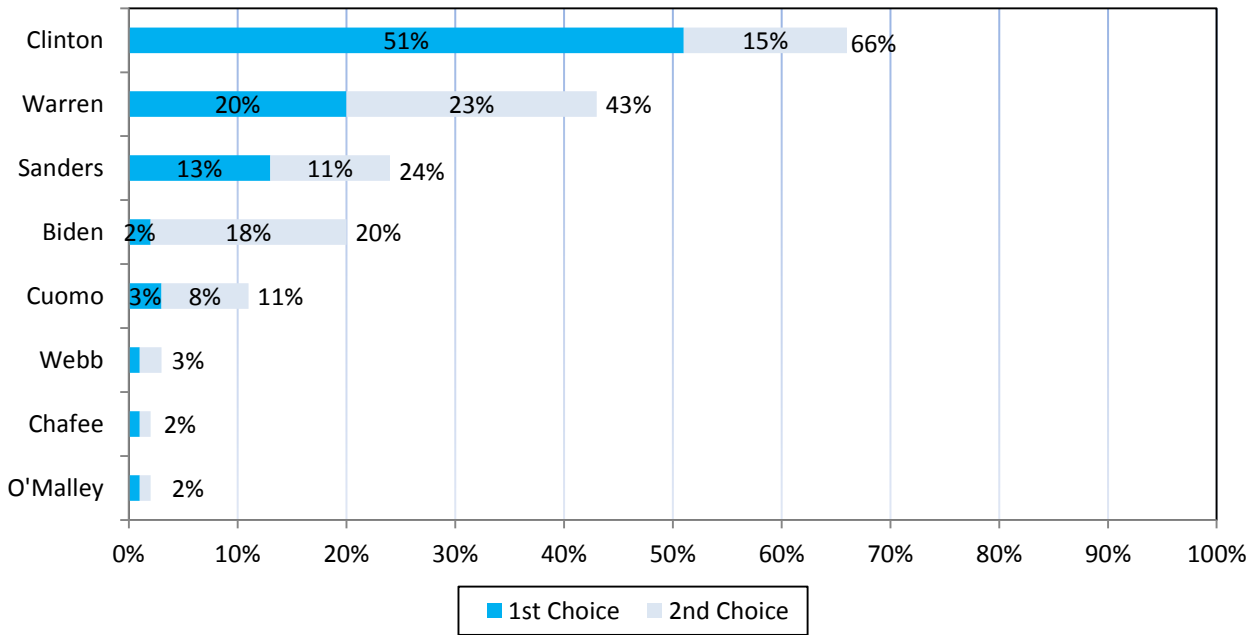
Clinton remains the clear favorite among Democratic voters when they are asked to choose from a list of prospective candidates. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 51% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would vote for Clinton if the election were held today, 20% prefer Warren, 13% prefer Sanders, 3% prefer Cuomo, 2% prefer Biden, 1% prefer Webb, 1% prefer Chafee, 1% prefer O'Malley and 8% are undecided.

While Clinton still gets a majority of primary voters, her support has dropped 7 percentage points since February.



### 2016 NH Democratic Primary with Second Choice

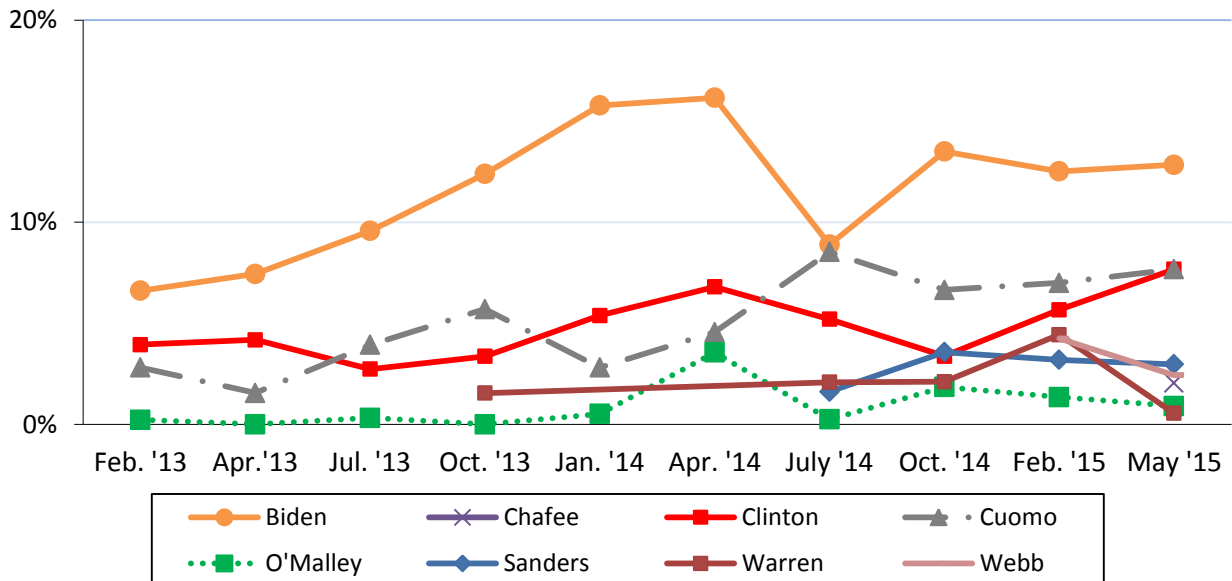
While Hillary Clinton is currently the frontrunner in the Democratic field, likely Democrat Primary voters also view Elizabeth Warren, Bernie Sanders and Joe Biden as potential options. When the top two choices are combined, 66% of likely primary voters favor Clinton, 43% favor Warren, 24% favor Sanders and 20% favor Biden.



### Most Unpopular Democrat Candidate

Nominations typically go to candidates who are acceptable to most members of their party and not to polarizing figures. When asked which potential candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 13% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would not vote for Biden, 8% would not vote for Cuomo, 8% would not vote for Clinton, 3% would not vote for Sanders, 2% would not vote for Webb, 2% would not vote for Chafee, 1% would not vote for O'Malley, 1% would not vote for Warren, 24% think that all of the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 39% are unsure.

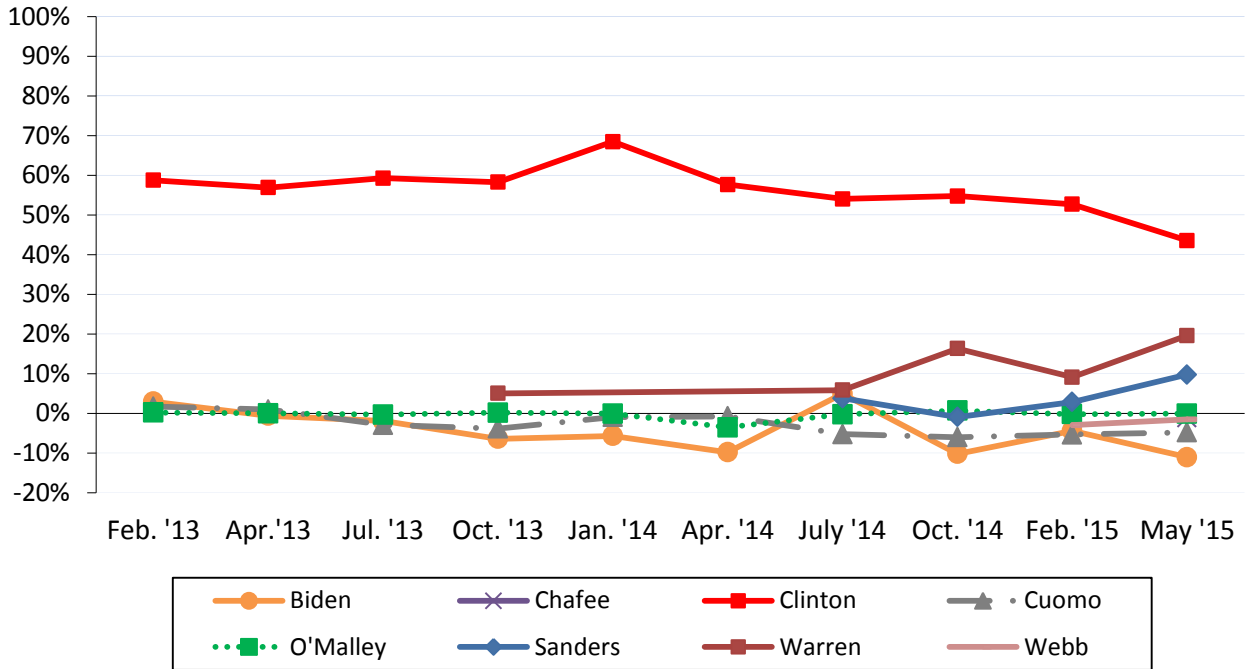
### NH 2016 DEM Presidential Primary -- Would Not Vote For



### Democrat Net Electability

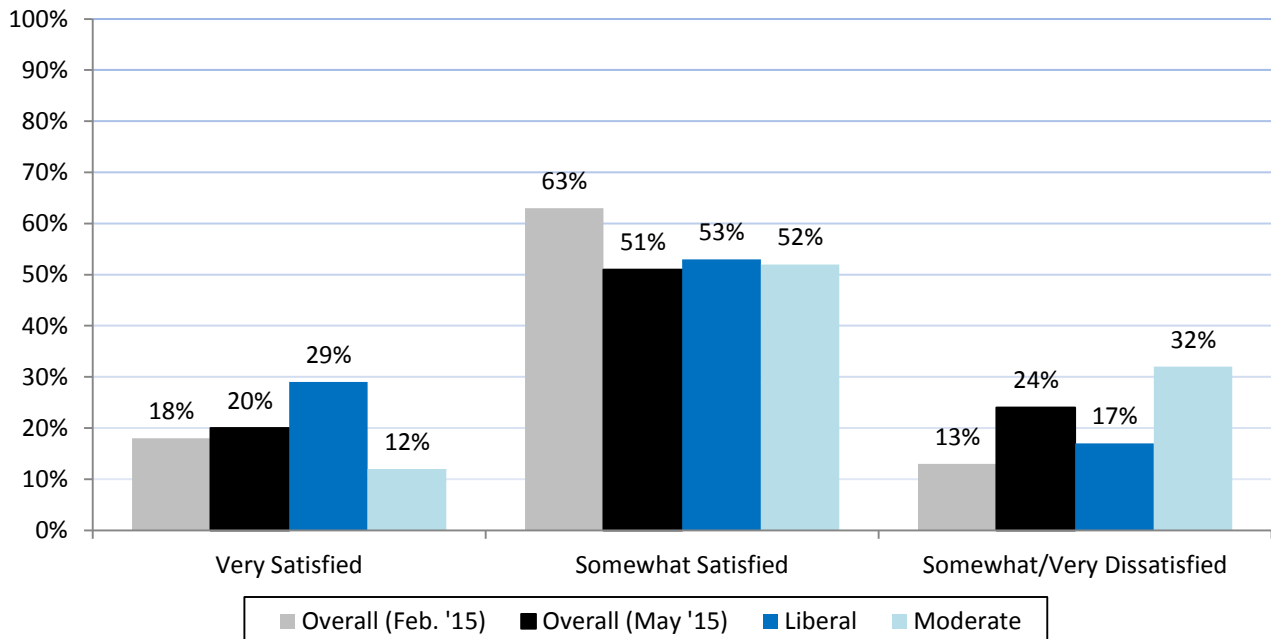
Clinton has a wide lead in net electability (the percentage who support a candidate minus the percentage who would not vote for that candidate under any circumstances) at +44%. Warren (+20%), and Sanders (+10%) have positive electability ratings while O'Malley (0%), Chafee (-1%), Webb (-2%), Cuomo (-5%), and Biden (-11%) have neutral or negative electability ratings.

NH 2016 DEM Presidential Primary -- Net Electability Ratings



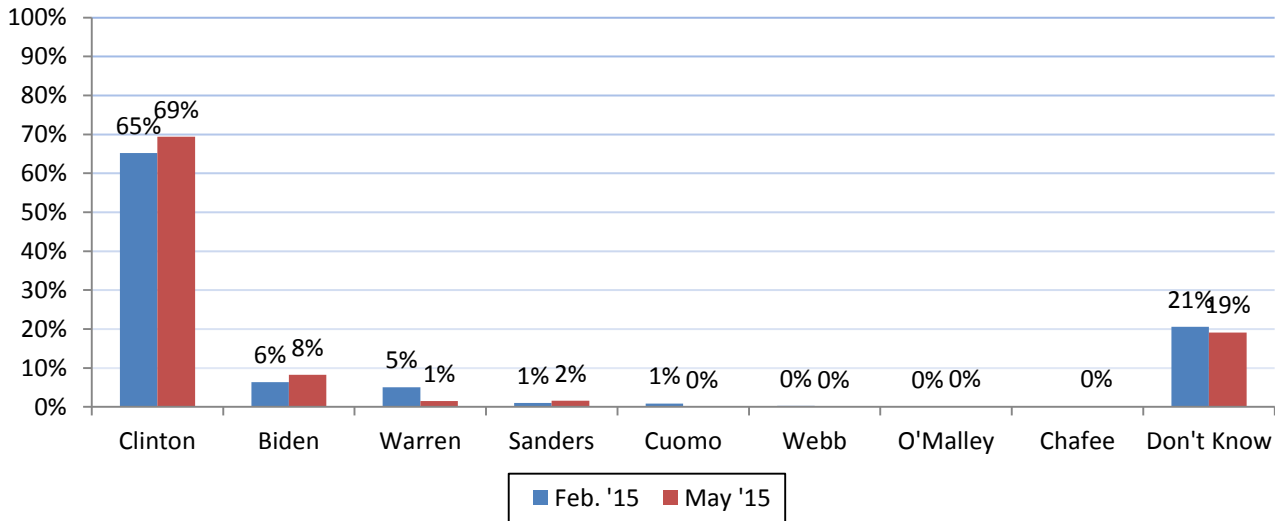
### Satisfaction with the Current Primary Field?

Just 20% of Democratic Primary voters are very satisfied with the current field of candidates, 51% are somewhat satisfied and 24% are somewhat or very dissatisfied. Liberals primary voters are more likely to be satisfied with the field than moderates.



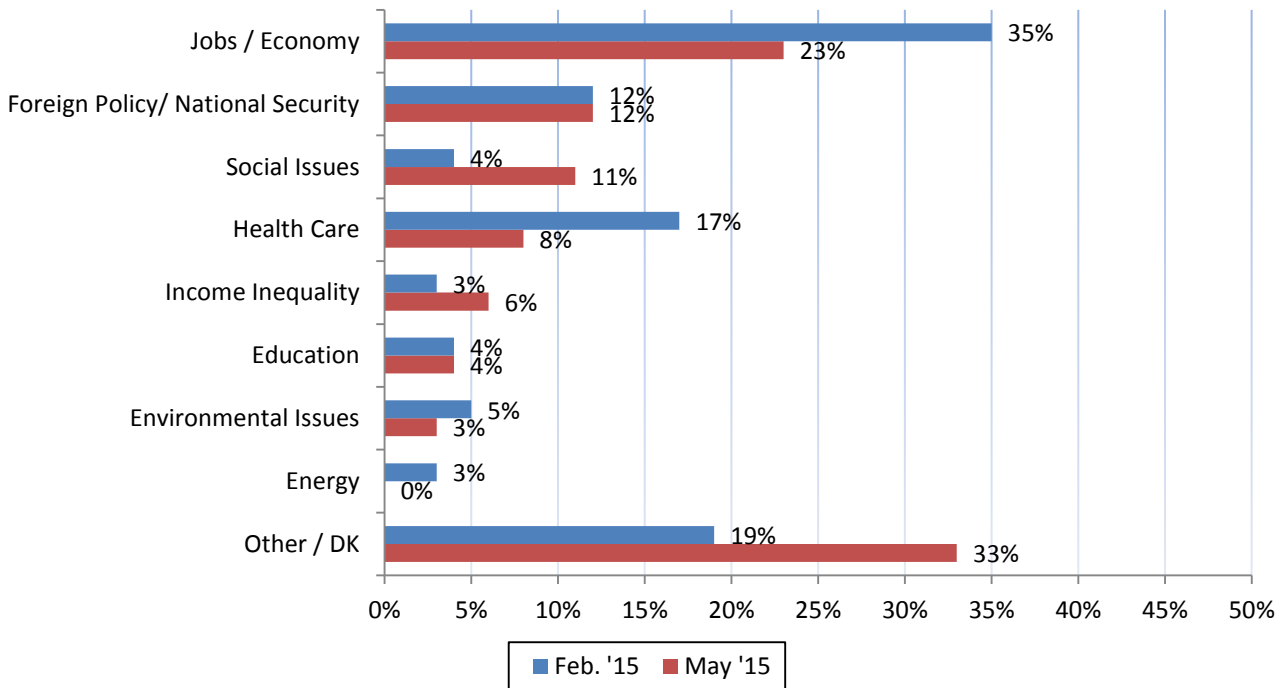
### Who Will Win Primary?

Clinton is seen as the likely winner of the New Hampshire primary by most Democrats. Among likely Democrat Primary voters, 65% believe that Clinton will win the New Hampshire primary, 8% believe Biden will win, 2% believe Sanders will win, 1% believe Warren will win and 19% are not sure.



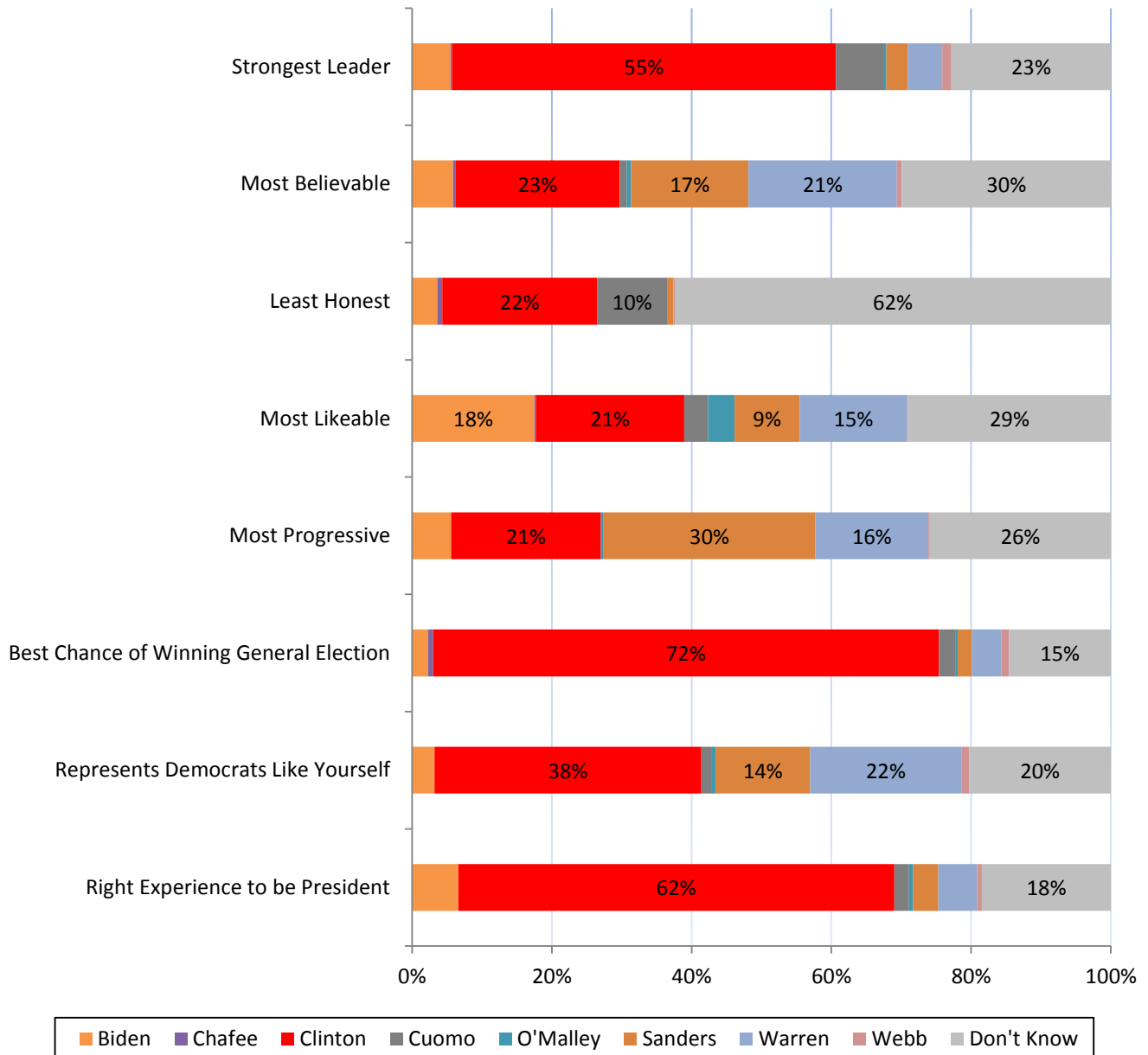
### Most Important Issues to Primary Vote

What asked what issue is the most important facing candidates in the presidential primary, 23% of likely Democrat Primary voters cite jobs or the economy, 12% cite foreign policy or national security, 11% cite social issues, 8% cite healthcare, 6% cite income inequality, 4% cite education, and 3% cite the environment.



## Candidate Qualities

A majority of likely primary voters (72%) view Hillary Clinton as having the best chance of winning a general election, having the right experience to be president (62%) and being the strongest leader (55%). Thirty eight percent (38%) of primary voters say Clinton best represents Democrats like themselves, 22% chose Warren and 14% chose Sanders. A plurality (30%) chose Bernie Sanders as the most progressive followed by Clinton with 21% and Warren with 16%. Twenty-three percent (23%) say Clinton is the most believable, followed by Warren at 21% and Sanders at 17%. Twenty-one percent (21%) say Clinton is the most likeable, followed by Biden at 18% and Warren at 15%. Twenty-two percent (22%) say Clinton is the least honest, followed by Cuomo at 10%. Twenty-two percent (22%) say Clinton is the least honest, followed by Cuomo at 10%.



## Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Seven hundred and six (706) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 24 and May 3, 2015. The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.7 percent. Included were two hundred twenty-nine (229) likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (MSE = +/-6.5), two hundred ninety-three (293) likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (MSE = +/-5.7), and six hundred and twenty-seven (627) likely 2016 presidential election voters (MSE = +/- 3.9).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
