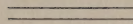

WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Knights of Pythias Hall in said town, on Tuesday the 11th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, and other necessary charges arising within the town.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking roads during the winter of 1919 and 1920.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to build State Highways.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintaining State Highways.
7. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of schools.
8. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the purchase of books, and other expenses of the Public Library.
9. To choose a Library Trustee for three years.
10. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the proper observance of Memorial day, and appropriate the same to the Grand Army.
11. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation, for a term of ten years; a mill for manufacturing lumber, to be built on the Androscoggin river, on land formerly owned by Lorenzo Pea-

body; also all machinery installed therein, also all booms and piers for the benefit of said mill, the same to be built within a period of two years.

12. In compliance with chapter 162, Session Laws of 1915 relating to trust funds held by towns.

To elect by ballot a board of three Trustees, one for one year, one for two years, and one for three years.

Report of School Board

As the retiring member of the schoolboard; I herewith submit my report.

On the whole the work done by both teachers and pupils has been very satisfactory. The State Superintendent advised combining all schools where possible, and on account of the difficulty of obtaining good teachers we found it best to combine the Jewett school with the village; and last fall as there were only four scholars we brought the Milan Hill school to the village.

We find it has been quite a saving, though we cannot tell just how much has been saved as the price of everything is so much higher.

I think there is also more interest in the schools where there are larger classes.

I should like to see the ninth grade in our schools changed to correspond with the first year of high school, which I think could be done with very little expense. Then in time I think we could have the village school houses built over and an extra room added so that with one more teacher in each place, we could have another year, and by bringing the children to a central school and the saving in tuition, we could give our children two years high school with only a little if any extra expense after the first year, but first I think we should have a superintendent.

I think it will be necessary to raise about \$2,000.00 in addition to the amount raised in town meeting, which would include the sum for books and supplies. \$700.00 for tuitions and \$185.00 for officers salaries.

I want to thank all who have helped me in my work in the past year.
