

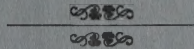

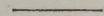

7. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
10. To hear the reports of town officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
11. To bring in your votes for a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

School Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne:

Herewith is presented the annual report:

Schools opened this fall with 26 pupils, Boys 15, Girls 11. Miss Florence B. Lamkin of North Chesterville, Me., a graduate of Farmington Normal with three years experience was elected for the coming year. The school work was going very well when it was interrupted by serious sickness in the school and community. During the Christmas vacation the school house was thoroughly fumigated and cleaned under the direction of Dr. Johnson who has been appointed school physician.

The school census shows 31 pupils in town, Boys 16, Girls 15, between the ages of 5-16. There are five pupils attending Gorham High School.

Although nature has provided a wonderful playground in the vicinity of the school house for sliding, skiing and skating in winter and baseball and other games the rest of the year, still we have no playground apparatus. Satisfactory swings and tecters could be made very reasonably.

This is my seventh and last report and I wish to express my enjoyment of the work both with the pupils and with the School Board and Citizens. Next year Union No. 20 will be increased in size by the addition of Dummer and Milan. This is in pursuance of the State policy to increase the size of the unions and decrease the number. You will then have over thirty teachers but with the improved highways the new union can be effectively handled.
