Article 2

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

Article 3

Voted to table article 3 until action was taken on article 16.

Article 16

Voted unanimously to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$11,300 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V Roads within the Town; (Road #63 South Road) such Sum to be raised through the issuance of Bonds or Notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 31, Laws of 1953, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such Bonds or Notes, and to determine the rate of Interest

thereon, and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such Bonds or Notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Sullivan.

Article 3

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500 for building and maintaining highways and bridges for the year ensuing.

Article 4

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$368.72 for Town Road Aid.

Article 5

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 for the Winter maintenance of Highways.

Article 6

Voted to pass over article 6.

Article 7

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55.00 for the support of the Public Library.

Article 8

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for Memorial Day.

Article 9

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to take from general funds an amount not exceeding \$50.00 for any organization desiring to run an Old Home Day.

This Motion Passed by a rising vote. Yes 34 No 8

Article 10

Voted to pass over Article 10.

Article 11

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the Fire Company.

Article 12

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for fire protection.

Article 13

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$205.00 for the Aid of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 14

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 15

Voted by ballot to pass over Article 15. The whole number of votes given in was 46. Yes 37 No 9

Article 17

Voted by ballot to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Town Pound. Whole number of votes given in was 41. Yes 13 No 28

Article 18

Voted to accept the Reports of Agents, Auditors, or Committees as printed in the Town Report.

Article 19

Voted by ballot to have the Minutes of the Town Meeting printed in the Annual Town Report. Whole number of votes given in was 43. Yes 34 No 9. So declared by the Moderator.

Voted that this Meeting be dissolved.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day, or take any action thereon.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Old Home Day, or take any action thereon.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the fire company or take any action thereon.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for other fire protection, or take any action thereon.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00, to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the Town.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$230.00, for the aid of the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, New Hampshire, or take any action thereon.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

16. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors or Committees heretofore chosen, or take any action thereon.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before the said meeting.

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Sullivan qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are herby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the fifth day of March 1959, at eight o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income: the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will approve a high school tuition contract with the Keene School District for 1959-60 at \$458 per pupil or with other approved secondary schools.

10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 to be used as matching funds for money available under provision of the National Education Defense law, such funds to be used for science and math equipment and improvement.

11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600 to pay the cost of equipment and installation of the stand-by electric power plant at the school.

12. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 as support for TV station WENH and for guides for use of TV programs in the school, as their share of union support for educational TV.

13. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred dollars (\$500) as a deficit appropriation caused by fuel purchase and playground areas at the new school during 1958.

14. To see if the district wishes to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 to be deposited in the capital reserve fund.

Condensed Copy of the Sullivan School Board Meeting Sullivan, New Hampshire

March 10, 1958

The meeting was called to order and the warrant read by the moderator with balloting proceeding for the following:

- 1. For Moderator-Edward L. Jewett.
- 2. For Clerk—Mary K. Parker.
- 3. For Member of the School Board for ensuing three years: Whole number of votes cast was 65, necessary for choice 33. Wayne A. Wyman—48. Declared elected.

For Member of the School Board for one year: Whole number of votes cast was 65, necessary for choice 33. Mary K. Parker—43. Declared elected.

- 4. For Treasurer—Mary A. Hammond.
- 5. Voted to accept as written in the Town Report the salaries of the school board and other officers of the district.
- 6. Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees as printed in the Town Report.
- 7. For Auditor—Lucile Cordingley.
- 8. Voted to Table Article #8 until Article #11 has been acted upon.
- 9. Voted to use any balance on hand June 30, 1958 for the payment of outstanding obligations on the new school project.
- 10. Voted to authorize the school board to enter into tuition contracts with other school districts for the education of high school pupils.

- 11. General discussion concerning the employment of a helping teacher on a union wide basis followed. Balloting proceeded. Whole number of votes cast was 52, necessary for choice 28. There were 6 opposed and 46 in favor of employing a helping teacher.
 - 8. Voted that the school district raise and appropriate \$24,877.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 12. Motion made and seconded that the district raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars to be deposited in the Capital Reserve Fund. Balloting proceeded. Whole number of votes cast was 48, necessary for choice 25. Opposed—16, in favor—32. The vote was affirmed.

Mr. Wyman, chairman of the school board thanked the School Study Committee for their cooperation and other residents who gave freely of their time on the school project.

Mr. Wyman stated that the name "Sullivan Central School" has been suggested and he asked for an expression of opinion about it. The majority agreed to use the title.

Mrs. Frank Glazier requested that if possible a provision be made to obtain water at the school during the dry season. A discussion followed.

It was voted to dissolve the meeting.
