



# Warrant For Town Meeting of 1907.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

[L. S.]

To the inhabitants of the town of Wolfeboro qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Brewster Memorial Hall, in said town on the second Tuesday of MARCH next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- ARTICLE 1. To choose a Town Clerk, three Selectmen, two Auditors, Treasurer and Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, and one Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.
- ART. 2. To see if the town will vote to return to the road agency system.
- ART. 3. To choose all other necessary town officers and agents.
- ART. 4. To see if the town will levy an annual tax upon the Hydrants of its water system and determine the amount of said tax
- ART. 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure State aid for the Permanent Improvement of Highways under the law passed January Session of the General Court of 1905.
- ART. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing Highways, Bridges and Sidewalks in addition to that required by law.
- ART. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray town expenses.
- ART. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on its indebetedness.
- ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay each Fireman legally returned for the year of 1907, in addition to that required by law.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay James R. Newell Post No. 61, G. A. R., to defray expenses of Memorial Day, 1907.

- ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for concrete sidewalks.
- ART 12. To see if the town will vote to adopt Chapter 79, of the Public Statutes and amendments thereto, relating to sidewalks and sewers, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- ART. 13. To see if the town will vote to adopt Chapter 124, of the Public Statutes, as amended by Chapter 76, of the laws passed at the January session, 1905, relating to dealers in old metal, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- ART. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the town Public Library, in addition to that required by law.
- ART. 15. To see if the town will vote to establish an Electric Fire Alarm System, and to raise and appropriate for the same.
- ART. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction and equipping for a suitable drinking trough at "Goose Corner," agreeable to a petition signed by Herbert H. Abbott and 13 others.
- ART. 17. To see if the town will vote to lay out a new street beginning at a point midway between the house of A. L. Mason and Frank E. Hersey, on the main road to Ossipee, in Wolfeboro Falls, and running westerly, back to the house of Eli Davis, agreeable to a petition signed by A. L. Mason and 13 others.
- ART. 18. To see what action the town will take relating to the money raised for Old Home Day, 1905, and not expended.
- ART. 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# A Partial Record of the Doings of Town Meeting Held March 13, 1906.

Under Article 2 it was voted to leave the other necessary Town Officers to the Selectmen to appoint.

Under Article 3 it was voted to raise the sum of \$583.00 in order to secure State Aid in making Permanent improvements on Highways.

Under Article 4 it was voted to raise the sum of \$1000.00 for regains of highways, bridges and sidewalks in addition to that required by law.

Under Article 5 it was voted to raise the sum of \$3000.00 for Town expenses.

Under Article 6 it was voted to raise the sum of \$1500.00 to pay on the indebtedness of the Town.

Under Article 7 it was voted to raise the sum of \$13 00 in addition to that required by law to pay each firemen legally returned.

Under Article 8 it was voted to raise the sum of \$75.00 to pay to James R. Newell Post G. A. R., for Memorial Day Exercises.

Under Article 9 it was voted to raise the sum of \$100.00 in addition to that required by law for Town Library.

Under Article 10 it was voted to raise the sum of \$300.00 to be expended for concrete sidewalks on North Main Street or elsewhere, the abuttors paying half of the cost of said walks.

Under Article 11 it was voted to build a steel and concrete bridge, with proper abutments over Smith's River on Main Street in the village of Wolfeboro, and to raise and appropriate therefor a sum not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4000), which sum shall be raised as follows: One Thousand Dollars by assessment this year and the balance borrowed on the credit of the Town, as needed, which shall be repaid One Thousand Dollars annually. It was also voted that William F. Pinkham, James H. Martin and Willis H. Tucker be the Agents to carry into effect the foregoing vote.

Under Article 12 it was voted that the Selectmen be authorized to deposit such part of the surplus of the Water Works revenue, as they deem best, in New Hampshire banks, not more than \$1000.00 in any one bank.

Under Article 13 it was voted to raise the sum of \$300,00 to be expended in building docks and wharves for public use.

Under Article 14 it was voted to raise the sum of \$200.00 to exterminate the Brown-tail moth.

Under Article 15 it was voted to pass over the Highway District reduction.

### To the Selectmen of the Town of Wolfeboro:

In presenting their annual report, the Board of Library Trustees wish to bring more prominently before the minds of the citizens the importance of the public library and its needs. The present condition of the library, and what has already been done, is most clearly stated in the report of the librarian, hereto annexed, to which we invite your attention.

The strongest preventive of crime is education: and next to the public school system, the public library is the most powerful agent in the world for spreading ideals of good citizenship. Every resident of Wolfeboro is urged to make use of the library, to consult its resources, and to ask advice of the librarian, who will gladly outline courses of reading, either for recreation or study.

With a view to making the library still more accessible, the hours have been lengthened on Saturday afternoons; we hope to take still further steps in this direction as fast as the needs of the public require. When the improvements in cataloguing and delivering, now under way, have been completed, the usefulness of the library will be many times multiplied.

We are extremely fortunate to have an enthusiastic, expe-

rienced librarian.

In order for the library to keep pace with the times, new books must be added constantly. A certain sum is fixed by law for the support of the library, but the trustees feel that this amount is not sufficient to get the best results, and they urge that a generous additional appropriation be granted for the coming year.

# To the Board of Trustees of the Wolfeboro Town Library:

The report of the Librarian for the current year, 1906, and a brief sketch of the history of the library is herewith presented.

The Wolfeboro Town Library was established by vote of the town at the annual town meeting in March of 1900. The first hundred dollars' worth of books was given by the state, and consisted of 108 During the year 1900, there were added by purchase, 242 vol. From 1901 to 1905, by purchase, 498 vols. 71 vols. During 1906, by purchase, 79 vols. vols. By gift,

Making a total of 1004 vols. in the library February 15, 1907. These figures represent the bound volumes only; there are besides, and as yet uncatalogued, several hundred volumes of State and United States documents, and pamphlets received from various sources.

It is impossible to estimate the usefulness of the town library alone since all the records of work done include both the Town and Brewster libraries; indeed the two are practically one

library as far as the public is concerned.

During this year, 9041 books have been loaned for home use. These figures do not include the large number of books and magazines used for reference work in the room. Nineteen hundred and six has seen a greater number of people using our reading room and consulting our reference books than any preceding year since the library building was opened. One reason for this increase is the fact that the library has now a fair working assortment of reference books. A new Encyclopedia in 20 volumes has been added within a few months. There are in the reading room a good number of the best magazines and newspapers. These are put into general circulation as soon as they are taken from the reading tables.

Books are circulated in the outlying districts through the schools; but in this line only a small beginning has been made and the librarian is anxious to do more as soon as the number of books on our shelves will make it practicable. For the convenience of people living at a distance, the library is being opened

an hour earlier on Saturday afternoons.

Two years ago, all of the children's books were placed in one alcove. The arrangement has proven the best possible both from the children's and the librarian's standpoint, and from seeing the enjoyment of the children looking at books and pictures sometimes for an hour at a time, the librarian has come to wish that we might have a separate children's room and many hundred more books.

For two years past, the library has been able to give some assistance to the women's club by reserving for it a special table, on which has been placed all the material the library could furnish for club purposes.

Twice exhibits of pictures have been hung in the reading

room. Along this line we wish to do more

Plans are being made to re-catalogue and re-classify the books during the coming months. It is believed that this will place the library on a better working basis and add much to its usefulness by making all its resources available.

We greatly need more books on every subject, both stan-

dard works and those of current interest.

The librarian wishes to express to the Trustees her appreciation of their encouragement and sympathy, and their kindly consideration of her suggestions.

Sentence has been suspended as to fines in three cases.


One jail sentence has been imposed.
