TOWN WARRANT

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of money called for in the Budget and make appropriation for same.

4. To see what sum or sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

5. To see if the town will vote to buy the Ross Snow Plow now owned by George W. Morton and others and make appropriation for same.

6. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid Construction.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,476.00, to be used on the Humphrey's Ledge Road.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow an amount, not to exceed \$3,000.00, in anticipation of uncollected taxes.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to tarvia a certain section of the town highway leading from Glen Station to the State highway.

10. To see if the town will vote to elect two road agents, one for each end of the town, in the place of the present road commissioners.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to tar Grove Street, in Bartlett village.

12. To see what action the town will take in regard to the manufacture and sale of beer and other alcoholic beverages agreeable to the laws of 1933.

13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deed.

14. To transact any other business that may come before the meeting legally.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett:

The school district has been fortunate in being able to complete the hall in the grammar school under an arrangement with the Civil Works Administration. The total cost will be approximately \$3,470. Of this \$1,970 was paid by the C. W. A. and \$1,500 was borrowed by the school district and paid through the school treasurer.

The budget presented by the school board is practically the same as last year. There is a small increase in the cost of fuel. It is recommended that \$2,000 be raised for retiring notes the same as this year. About \$900 will be required for interest charges on debt.

It will not be necessary to raise any money for high school tuition in other towns.

The amount of \$845 should be raised under article seven for the continuance of transportation of high school pupils.

There is a strong sentiment in favor of adding another

teacher to the high school faculty. The superintendent recommends that this be done because (1) it will greatly increase the efficiency of the school, and (2) it will make it possible to offer a more varied program of studies. The cost would be about \$900 for salary of teacher, \$300 for seats and furniture and possibly \$200 to make the room suitable for combined recitation and laboratory purposes.
