

### MESSAGES FROM THE SELECTMEN

New London is having growing pains. The year 1963 brought us increased activity all down the line, mostly to the good, a little to the bad, and all indicating that further business, residential and local governmental expansion faces the town. Constantly in the back of our minds is the knowledge that Interstate Highway #89 will traverse New London within the next few years. It is our hope and aim to see that it does not bisect our town. Our experience with the State Highway Department has been highly satisfactory during the past year, and if this is an indication of the consideration we may expect when plans are finalized for the location of the new highway, then the coming of this new route should mean accelerated growth to the area.

Main Street was resurfaced by the State from Homan's Corner to Seamans Road on the Elkins Road. Route #11 is in the process of by-passing the village section of Elkins and this new stretch of road is scheduled to be ready for use by the Fall of 1964. By removing the fast, through traffic from Elkins Village itself, we foresee a safer and more pleasant residential and business section in that part of town. Considering this, Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Hayes and the Selectmen have reached an agreement whereby you will be asked at the 1964 Town Meeting to vote acceptance of a gift from the Hayes to the Town of the old dam at the mill pond of Roy Emery's mill. Mr. Hayes purchased this property a few years ago and razed the saw-mill, which was no longer in operation. The dam needs repair, which, after consultation with the Water Resources Board, we believe can be done at no great expense and will make an attractive approach to the Village and have value for fire protection to homes in the neighborhood.

1963 marked the 175th anniversary of the First Baptist Church in New London, the completion of plans for the construction of a new Saint Andrew's Episcopal Church on Gould Road, consideration of preliminary plans for a new church for Our Lady of Fatima Parish and the completion of a fine modern Physical Education building at Colby Junior College.

A highlight in Town development is the laying of the groundwork for "Bucklin Beach", on the shore of Little Lake Sunapee. For many years town officials have been aware of the need for beach facilities for town residents not having ready access to any of our lakes. The successful efforts of the Planning Board, the cooperation of the State Highway Department, and the generosity of Walter S. Bucklin, who gave the Town 360 feet of shore, and of Bernard Hoban, and Reverend Harold Kocher, whose properties were affected, should be appreciated by all townspeople. Other information on "Bucklin Beach" appears elsewhere in this town report, and you will be asked to raise and appropriate money for construction of proposed facilities for New London property owners, residents and their guests.

This work was done by the State Highway Dept. at a cost of about \$10,000 and will include fencing off the discontinued portion of the old road and the land between the old and the new road which has been returned to the Town by the State.

Of considerable interest was the moving of one of the old houses in Elkins to its new location on Little Lake Sunapee Road where it will be the permanent home of the New London Historical Society. The house itself was donated by Mr. and Mrs. Herbert D. Swift. Two acres of land were given the Society by Mr. Walter S. Bucklin, who also very generously gave the Society a substantial donation to launch a fund raising drive. When the drive reached the \$13,000. mark, the Society felt able to proceed under the able guidance of Mrs. Alford Tunis, assisted by Dan H. Allen, Carl Cochran and Lloyd Littlefield. The New London Historical Society is a non-profit corporation whose by-laws specify that should the organization be dissolved at any time, its assets shall go to the Town of New London.

You will be faced with more articles in the Town Warrant than ever, this year. Again, this results from growing pains at both the State and local level. Shall we continue our New London Municipal Court, or must our local cases go to Franklin to the District Court? We are fortunate in having qualified citizens who have been willing to officiate in a dignified manner that is a real credit to our town. Court is held Thursday mornings, and at such other times as may be necessary, in the courtroom of the Town Hall.

Shall we continue to salt town roads as we have done on an experimental basis this winter? This has been argued pro and con in other towns for many years. Our aim is to make our roads safer for our townspeople, our school buses and the increasing number of winter visitors. Do the possible sideeffects outweigh the advantages?

Do you favor the "Sweepstakes"? Shall we have a Town Building Code? Do you prefer holding Town Meeting at night instead of in the daytime? How about driveways and private roads? Do you want the Highway Department to continue this service as they have for many years or give it up? Do you approve of the changes proposed and recommended by the Planning Board for the New London Zoning Ordinance? The

Planning Board spends countless hours in considering and drafting such amendments and is rendering a real service, without pay, to the taxpayers.

President Eisenhower once remarked: "the people demand more and more services and they all cost money. If they want these services, they must expect to pay for them." How true this is, even in a small New England town, where we see it in conducting our town affairs just as well as we all see it in our homes and businesses. The 1964 Budget Committee made a concerted effort to hold the line on spending and is to be complimented for the intent of its desire to prevent, or at least postpone, what it considers unnecessary expenditures.

Speaking for the Town, and our hundreds of summer visitors, we wish to thank the New London Grange for the placing of an attractive Community Bulletin Board beside the Information Booth. Things like this help New London, as does the work of the Litterbug Committee of the Men's Division of the Garden Club. Encouraged by Mr. Wilbur Breckenridge, a New London resident who is State Litterbug Chairman, this group gathered truck loads of trash that had been discarded along the highways last winter. Our Police Chief has been notified to "get tough" with motorists who discard trash along the roadsides and with those persons who transport rubbish to the town dump without covering it properly. Note the warnings and one court case (\$50.00 fine) imposed last year! Your interest and cooperation will do more good than warnings and fines.

Construction of private buildings, not including institutional, amounted to approximately \$300,000, which is about the same as the year before. Under our present method of assessment, this adds about \$100,000, to our taxable real estate. Among the buildings erected in the past year, it is interesting to note the modern pole-barn with its milking parlor, pen stabling and bulk feed storage erected by Peter Messer, young dairy farmer, on King Hill Road and a new pole-barn for Ralph Gay, also on King Hill Road, for his riding stable and buying and selling of riding horses. In the business section,

Audio Engineering Corp. is now established in their own newly constructed quarters on Pleasant Street, which is an attractive addition to the area; a residence on Main Street was converted into an apartment and four retail store units, and Cricenti's market was again enlarged and modernized. New London continues to grow in many ways, and Building Permits issued by the Selectmen for 1963 list:

15 Residences

16 Additions and alterations

3 Private garages

9 Signs

2 Stables

2 Barns

4 Permits denied

1963 was gratifying to town officials in that the final payments on Highway Department and Fire Department long-term notes were made. This leaves the town with a bonded debt of only \$7,000 in the Sewer Department, which will be paid off in 1964 and 1965. The bonded debts of the School District and Water Precinct are separate from what we term "Town Debt" and are listed under the reports from the officers of these districts. The school debt, of course, is an obligation of the entire town, and the water debt of that part of the town, along with part of the Town of Springfield, which comprise the Water Precinct. With the steady growth of our town, the increase in taxable property, and substantial revenue from Colby Junior College and the State Dividends and Interest Tax, which last year reached a high of \$32,792.45, we feel New London is in a good financial position.

1963 brought our Road Agent, Henry Stanley, an award from the Civic Projects Committee of the New London Garden Club for the efforts of his department in making the grounds at the town garage more attractive. The year also brought another first place award for the 1962 Town Report in the New Hampshire Annual Report Contest conducted by the Depart-

ment of Government of the University of New Hampshire. Similar awards were made to New London for its 1961 and 1952 reports.

As this report goes to print, one of our Board members, M. Roy London, whose term expires in March, announces that he will not be a candidate for re-election. "Judge London", or "Roy", has been a good member of our board who joined us in May, 1962, at our request, to fill a vacancy. He leaves us reluctantly, he says, so the door may be open for a younger man to take an active part in town government, and to give him more time to devote to his many other personal and political interests.

- 26. To accept as a gift from Raymond P. Hayes a certain strip of land approximately 130 feet in length and 20 feet in width entending northeasterly from the old "Lamson Road", in the Village of Elkins, together with the stone dam thereon which impounds water for the Scytheville Mill Pond.
- 27. To discontinue all of the abandoned portion of the old Davis Hill Road lying South of State Highway #11 and extending from the present Davis Hill Road easterly to the intersection of State Highways #11 and #103A.

- 28. To continue the use of salt on Town roads.
- 29. To continue the plowing of privately owned driveways and roads, after the Town roads have been plowed, and to charge for this service.
- 30. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention. (This Article appears on the Official Ballot for vote)
- 31. To vote on the following question: "Shall Sweepstake tickets be sold in this Town?" (This Article appears on the Official Ballot for vote)
- 32. To vote on the following question: "Shall the Town of New London continue to maintain its existing Municipal Court so long as its present Judge remains in office?" (This Article appears on the Town printed ballot for vote)
- 33. To authorize the Tax Collector to accept partial payments of taxes in accordance with Chapter 36:1 of the 1963 Acts of Legislature.
- 34. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, if deemed necessary by the Selectmen.
- 35. To request the Selectmen to transfer Town Meetings from day to evening session. (This Article presented on petition by 24 signers)
- 36. To instruct the Planning Board to draft a uniform Building Code to be submitted for vote at the next regular Town Meeting. (This Article presented on petition by 60 signers)
- 37. To vote upon the Amendments to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board, which amendments are on file with the Town Clerk and may be inspected by all interested parties. (This Article appears on the Town printed ballot for vote in accordance with Chapter 5 of the 1963 Acts of the Legislature)

38. To accept as a gift, from James C. Cleveland, a plot of land located on the south side of Pleasant Street beginning at a point 845 easterly from Gould Road, provided the Town votes to extend the Commercial Zone to this point. The plot to have a frontage of 100 feet on Pleasant Street and a depth of 250 feet and to be reserved by the Town with no buildings thereon as a natural green-belt, or park, separating the Commercial Zone and the Residential Zone.

#### REPORT OF THE TRUST FUNDS OF THE TOWN OF NEW LONDON, N. H. ON DECEMBER 31, 1963

There are 238 Cemetery Trust accounts for the care of individual cemetery lots, each invested in a separate Savings Bank book earning interest. The Principal in these savings accounts totals \$21,735.32 and the unspent earnings \$5,331.21, which together make a total of \$27,066.53 in the Cemetery Trust Funds. This makes an average value of \$113.72 for each of the 238 Cemetery Accounts.

The Tracy Memorial Library has the support of four Trust Funds in our care, i.e., The Jane A. Tracy Trust Fund, The Sarah & Elizabeth Brown Trust Fund, The Ann Mary Jelly Trust Fund and The Kathleen L. Whitcomb Trust Fund, which together contributed a total of \$6,187.18 in earnings for the support of the Library during the past year. Every year these earnings have increased since the funds were started. All cash capital gains are put into uninvested funds, as received and earn interest which is turned over to the Library as income. The Kathleen L. Whitcomb Fund for the benefit of the Library, was invested in the Puritan Fund, during the past year.

# 1963 Report

During the past year most of our communications have been with the **Department of Defense** and the **Department of The Army**. Civil Defense is now under these two departments, and they are laying down strict requirements for the C.D. Directors to meet. They have made it quite clear that we meet them. New London has done so promptly because we had already been prepared in advance.

#### Weekly Radio Drills:

We have had our weekly drills throughout the year. Our C.D. Control Center is open each Tuesday night and anyone may attend these drills if they would like to see our Control Center in action. As always, I am available if you desire information. Upon request, I will come to your home to discuss any special information you may want on your particular preparedness plans.

#### Public Services Rendered:

August 4th: New London Horse Show — New London Civil Defense worked with the American Red Cross, under the direction of Mrs. Charles Woodworth by furnishing communications.

August 13th: New London Hospital Day — New London Civil Defense radios were used for Police communications.

October 23rd: Our local Fire Warden, Carlton Barton, called a special fire meeting to inform the New London firemen, police and Civil Defense of the serious danger that existed in our woodlands. As a result of the meeting an immediate Fire Patrol was started, and continued throughout the danger period. I am glad that I live in a community where such a cooperative effort is possible.

I do not know how others felt about this fire patrol when

our woodlands were so explosive but I felt just a little bit safer when I observed the fire truck go by with its flashing red light. I wish to thank, and I am sure you will also, the members of the New London Fire Department for its constant vigilance during the fire danger.

#### MUNICIPAL COURT

#### REPORT FOR 1963

The New London Municipal Court in 1963 had the largest volume of work in its history. There were 268 cases in all: 226 in the area of misdemeanors; 40 small claims; and 2 juvenile cases. The total amount of fines collected was \$3,400. Small Claims fees totaled \$60. Total amount paid over to the Town Treasurer was \$1,805.65.

The Court is grateful to the Town authorities for the improvement in the room in which sessions are held. We now have one of the best small courtrooms in New Hampshire, and the dignity of the Court sessions is much improved:

During the year 1963, the proportion of Court fines which the Town is entitled to keep was raised by State law, and the result of this increase was noted in the last four months of the year.

# REPORT OF THE TOWN HEALTH OFFICER

The duties of your Town Health Officer have been both varied and interesting in this, his first year of service. During the year a working liaison with the State Department of Public Health was established. Following are listed some of the duties which the Health Officer was called upon to perform: inspection of a new barber shop; inspection of a cabin camp enterprise; inspection of food handling establishments with the state inspector; all of these being made to establish conformity with the New Hampshire Public Health Laws. A number of complaints were investigated, most of which were for water pollution or other sanitary problems.

During the year, sanitary analyses of the water in Pleasant Lake, Little Lake Sunapee and in several town brooks were made. Analysis of the New London portion of Lake Sunapee is included in surveys carried out for the Lake Sunapee Protective Association. In 1964 these analyses will be extended to include Messer Pond and all brooks in New London. The purpose of these analyses is to determine if, when, and where pollution of our natural waters is occurring. By establishing testing now we shall be in a position to know, as our town grows, whether our water is becoming polluted.

The quality of our bodies of water, as indicated by the 1963 testing, is very good. The average coliform counts (a pollution indicator) this past year were as follows: Pleasant Lake 13 per 100 ml. in July; Little Lake Sunapee 4 per 100 ml. in September; and Sunapee 9 per 100 ml. Although good by lake standards (class A lake water may contain no more than 50 coliform organisms per 100 ml.), many families, especially summer people, consume our lake waters untreated. Standards for drinking water allow only one coliform per 100 ml. For this reason and for general public health reasons it behooves us to keep these bodies of water as pure as possible. It is hoped that citizens will continue to report possible health hazards and sources of pollution so that they may be investigated and eliminated.

Although the Health Officer conducts a laboratory service equipped to investigate pollution problems and performs water analyses for the Town and others on a fee basis, the Town of New London does not underwrite free laboratory examination of private water supplies at this time. This service is, however, provided free by the New Hampshire State Water Laboratory in Concord, where proper containers are provided for individuals to submit water samples.

In the coming year the New London Health Department will continue with the work already started and is hopeful of establishing or completing the following:

- 1. Establishment of an adequate system of collecting health statistics from physicians practicing in New London.
- 2. Expansion of the sanitary water analysis surveys of New London waters as mentioned above.
- 3. Establishing testing procedures for checking the ability of soil to absorb septic tank drainage particularly in housing developments.
- 4. Making available to all food handling establishments the New Hampshire Sanitary Food Code.
- 5. Establishment of a rabies prevention program.
- 6. Continuation of planning for the Bucklin Beach development with the Town Planning Board to assure compliance with public health and safety regulations.

The continued cooperation of all New London residents is earnestly solicited in the Health Officer's efforts to help keep New London a safe, healthful and attractive place to live.

Home visits were made on the following types of cases: communicable disease, maternity, arthritis, cancer, heart, crippled, diabetes, mental health, mentally retarded, and others. This is a partial list of services offered.

A chest X-ray clinic was held in Franklin in February. Anyone may be referred to this clinic.

Immunization clinics were held in the towns of Andover, Bristol, Franklin, Newbury, New London, and Sutton.

Your state public health nurse is in her office from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Monday through Friday. The telephone number is Franklin 69. Please call or write if any problem arises.

#### REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

To the Citizens of New London:

During the preceding year, your Planning Board, through a sub-committee consisting of James Shepard, Irving Dodge and Richard Chatellier, worked closely with the State Highway Department on the relocation of a portion of Little Lake Sunapee Road. The successful conclusion of this project served a dual purpose: the elimination of a safety hazard and the creation of a location for the Bucklin Beach development.

Another sub-committee, consisting of Harold Welch and Osear Colburn, has drawn up plans and estimated costs for the location and building of the Bucklin Beach facilities and this figure for construction and maintenance appears in the Town Warrant for your consideration.

As a result of a joint meeting of the Board of Selectmen, the Zoning Board, the Planning Board and representatives of the Water Precinct and Sewer Commission, several amendments to the Zoning Ordinance have been drafted. Acting in accordance with the new State Legislation, Chapter 31:63-A, the Planning Board held two duly advertised public hearings on January 21 and January 28 to hear expressions of opinion by interested citizens on these amendments and on a proposed change in the Zoning Map which involves the enlargement of the Commercial Zone on Pleasant Street. The full text of these amendments will be on file at the Town Clerk's office two weeks prior to March 10, 1964, when they will appear on the official town ballot for the election of officers.

Under the Land Sub-division Regulations, the Planning Board acted favorably on a request for an extension of Birch Lane by Mr. and Mrs. A. T. Kirk.

The Chairman of the Board wishes to thank Mr. Shepard, Mr. Dodge, Mr. Colburn, Mr. Welch, Mr. Chatellier and Miss Mary Barrett, Board members, for the many hours of conscientious thought and effort which they have devoted to the best interests of the Town.

#### ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

During 1963, the Zoning Board of Adjustment acted on six appeals referred to the Board by the Selectmen. The first was a request by Elizabeth Nichols dated April 6 for a variance relating to the use of property at the corner of Gould road and Pleasant street for a store. An open hearing was held on April 29. The request was denied by the Board since the property in question was in a residential zone and a hardship, as defined by the Zoning Ordinance, could not be proven.

The second was an appeal by John and Betsy Buttrick for a special exception to Article IX, Section C, to add more motel units to their existing motel on Route 11. A public hearing was held on April 29 and the Board approved the application since all requirements of Art. IX, Sect. C, were met.

The third case was an appeal by Robert M. Lovely for a variance concerning the size of a new sign to be erected on the Drug Store on Main street. A public hearing was held on May 27 and the Board approved the request since it was a continuation of a non-conforming use and therefore permissible.

The fourth was an appeal by Wallace and Merle Gray for an interpretation of Art. IX, Sect. H, concerning the use of the Wayside Chapel in Otterville as a craft shop and living quarters. A public hearing was held on May 27. The Board granted temporary permission with the understanding that within a year proof must be submitted at a public hearing that the property is primarily used as a residence.

The fifth case was an appeal by Edward Leskiewicz for an interpretation of Art. IX, Sect. C, concerning the erection of a building to be used as sanitation facilities for the camping area at the east end of Otter Pond. A public hearing was held on June 11 and the appeal was granted. However, the Board made it clear that this is a non-conforming use and thus the applicant has the right to build sanitary facilities required for and incidental to his present non-conforming use. The applicant, however, has no right to enlarge this present non-conforming use by building additional camp-sites or picnic areas, nor

by renting trailer space, nor by increasing his non-conforming business in any way.

The sixth case was an appeal by Nancy B. Kristl for an interpretation of Art. IX, Sect. A2, concerning the use of the former Brownell property on Bunker road as a riding school. A public hearing was held on August 7. The decision of the Board was that Mrs. Kristl may properly operate a riding school on Bunker road with the conditions that she provide adequate off street parking for vehicles and will not be offensive to the surrounding property owners in the form of lights, noise, dirt, or odors.

# REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- 2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
- 3. Never discard lighted eigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
- 4. Children-caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

#### INFORMATION BOOTH

#### Report for 1963

Another year of service to our traveling and summer elientele has been completed. The Information Booth was open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. six days a week, for a nine week period. A total of 1,750 cars containing 4,471 people from 29 states and the District of Columbia were listed. Fifteen cars with 43 people from three Canadian provinces, 590 pedestrians, 120 phone calls for information, two motorcycles and nine bicycles. We made 83 phone calls, mostly for accommodations or locating people.

Requests for accommodations, places to eat, things to see and do ranked first. Inquiries for routes and directions and shopping facilities ranked close second. The 1963-64 New Hampshire road map was much in demand and complimented for its easy readability and the detailed information it gave. A few of the questions would have stumped the experts but we always tried to find the answers. The booklets supplied by the state and surrounding areas furnished us with a wealth of detailed information. Our own Lake Sunapee Area booklet received many favorable comments.

In addition to furnishing information we try to lend assistance in any way that presents itself. Many harried mothers, trying to make a phone call in the nearby phone booth are grateful when we entertain the children, leaving mother free to complete her call. We act as a lost and found department and a depository for packages too large to carry while doing other errands. On occasion we have even done traffic duty and given suggestions as to a suitable gift for a hostess from a grateful guest.

Besides keeping the booth orderly and clean, we try to keep the area surrounding it free from litter, the bulletin board up to date, and care for the window boxes. In June the local Grange erected a large bulletin board adjacent to the booth. This was a tremendous addition as it made it possible to keep the building free of posters and advertising material which previously were plastered all over the outside and did not beautify the building. Now we are able to display posters and notices neatly, attractively, and all together. During the summer the building was painted and broken window panes replaced. This work was done by Alford B. F. B. Tunis, a member of the men's division of the Garden Club, who is interested in beautifying our Town.

The average local resident probably does not realize what this service really means to the traveling public and our summer friends. The gratitude and appreciation expressed for the help given and free booklets furnished would make one very proud of the part "Our Outing Club" and "Our Town" play in making this service possible.

We have both enjoyed it very much.

We have answered requests for special loans: Inter-library 7, New London Central School 247, Wilmot Schools 361, Sunapee High School 12, Kindergarten 48, Camp Tonawandah 14, Fernald Library 15, New London Manor 19, Baptist Church Sunday School 10.

To supplement the reading material in the Children's Room, we have borrowed 435 books from the Extension Division of the State Library, and 315 adult books for the reading room. Films for National Library Week, which were shown to 300 children, were loaned to us by the North Countries Film Service through the State Library.

The library has purchased 220 adult and 132 juvenile books, and has received 18 gift books this year. The reading-room table is well supplied with 55 adult magazines, with three magazines in the Children's Room. These are all available for circulation. The purchase of the World Book encyclopedia this year brings our reference shelves up-to-date.

The new heating system in the auditorium has increased the use of this room, and the following events have taken place there: The Woman's Club, the annual meetings of the Hospital Board and Red Cross, the Garden Club, Senior Citizens, five exhibits, and the Christmas party for Confraternity classes. There have been twenty meetings in the club room which is open for small committee meetings at all times during library hours.

The New London Service Organization has added these books to the military book shelf: "Strong Men Armed" by Leckie; "Nuremberg Trial" by Heydecker; "Alamein" by Phillips; "Harm's Way" by Bassett. These books deal with all aspects of military history, and are read with enjoyment by many of our ex-servicemen.

The reading-room entrance hall has been much improved and brightened by new vinyl flooring in a terrazzo pattern. The stairway to the children's room has been covered with new linoleum, with insets of sandpaper, which is proving to be a fine safety factor. The purchase of 200 steel folding chairs has contributed greatly to the general appearance and set-up of the auditorium.

The Board and Staff have attended two hearings on the library bill, HB306, the annual meeting of the N. H. Library Association, the National Library Week dinner, a book banquet and reference book class at the State Library, the N. H. Library Trustees Association, and a "Statewide Library Development Program" at Newport, N. H.

A new innovation this year has been book service for the patients at the New London Manor. Twice each month, books are picked up and exchanged for new ones. The people there seem to greatly appreciate this service, and the visits with the librarians.

In September, Mrs. Celena Todd joined our staff to help in the Children's Room on Saturdays, and to do substitute work at the desk.

The new public library laws (as enacted by the State of New Hampshire) were studied and adopted by the Board of Trustees on Nov. 12, 1963. Though the bill passed by the legislature carries no funds until 1965 — plans are going ahead next year for the development of a state-wide program, in which our library will take part.

National Library Week was celebrated in April and featured the theme "Fifth Freedom — enjoy it." The fifth freedom, to read, was depicted with exhibits of books, architectural models, pictures, letters and sculptures. A well-attended Open House was held on Monday, April 23, 1963, by the committee, led by Mrs. Lloyd Littlefield, and assisted by Mr. Vincent Wickham, Mr. and Mrs. William Roos, Mr. Charles Marston, Mr. Elmer Robinson, Miss Lorraine Bailey and Miss Martha Brown.

Relics and documents of the Sargent and Trussell families, with pictures of houses they built in New London, were on exhibition in the auditorium in July. The Sargents and Trussells were pioneer families and members of both contributed to the development of this town throughout its history.

The third pioneer family featured in the historical displays was the Gay family. Early members reached New London from Attleboro, Mass., in the 1780's and built the first mills at the outlet to Pleasant Lake. Pictures, a framed marriage certificate, and a model wagon were arranged by Mr. Tunis, president of the Historical Society.

A photograph display was set up during August by Walter G. Ensign, a summer resident. The pictures, primarily New London landscapes, included black-and-white and color studies.

A committee, headed by Mr. V. S. Wickham and assisted by Mr. Willis Ames and Mrs. William Roos, arranged an exhibit of New London scenes done by local artists in August. The Historical Society sponsored this display for two weeks.

The Vacation Reading Club, with 84 members, held its annual party the last Friday in August. The winners in the "Rainbow" group were: Heidi Hill, first prize, and Mary Blaber, second prize. In the "Explorer" group, the first award went to Anne Blaber, and the second to Gail Siesicki. A program was presented by two of the New London Barn Players, consisting of songs and games of the pioneers of America. Refreshments were served in the garden by the librarians and their helpers.

National Book Week was held in November with displays of new adult and juvenile books. The children of New London Central School, Wilmot Schools, and Kindergartens, and Springfield Memorial School visited the exhibit and enjoyed the two movies shown during that week. The winner of the contest, "Favorite Parties in Books" was Marie Manber, who was presented with a new book by the librarian. The attendance reached a new high with 550 adults and children present for the week. The staff was especially pleased that so many High School students were able to attend this year.

On Saturday afternoons during the school year, the preschool group have been instructed and entertained by the librarians and their helpers. The students from the "Home and Marraige" class at the college have been of great assistance during the spring months. The attendance has been good with 478 children.

Miss Kendra Lovell and Miss Nancy Parker gave the library valuable assistance as pages and in managing the Vacation Reading Club in July and August.

The Christmas season as usual finds us welcoming new and old friends to the gaily lighted library, and to the "world of books".

# NEW LONDON HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION, INC.

#### ANNUAL REPORT

September 30, 1963, ended the 45th fiscal year of New London Hospital, and the fifth year in its new building.

The year had several highlights, but greatest of these was the Expansion Fund Drive which almost reached its goal of \$190,000. This Fund, along with the U. S. Government Hill-Burton Fund aid, will be used for the addition of new in-patient rooms and out-patient facilities which are so greatly needed. The firm of Aderton-Trostle Associates of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, conducted the Fund Drive. Mr. James H. Cave served as General Chairman of the drive, Mrs. James C. Cleveland was Initial Sales Chairman, Mr. Frank Butler served as General Sales Chairman, Miss Dorris Smith was Listing Chairman, and Mrs. O. J. A. Grassi, Jr., was Summer Residents' Chairman.

The New Building Committee appointed by President Joseph O. Fleming included Mr. Eliot Foot and Mr. H. B. Harris, Jr., as Co-Chairmen, Mr. George Morse and Mr. Walter Roberts. Mr. Alexander Majeski has served as the architect of the plans for the new building.

Hospital Day has grown to such an enormous undertaking that it was impossible to find any person who could contribute the necessary time involved to direct this fair. Consequently, the Board of Directors voted to make the Chairmanship a paid position and secured Carlton F. Barton as Chairman, and Mrs. Barton as his secretarial assistant. The Bartons proved to be an excellent team and provided the leadership which gave a Net Profit of \$10,926.52 for the Hospital, in spite of inclement weather on Hospital Day, August 13, and the Capital Fund Drive.

The New London Hospital Association, Inc., has a membership of many, many people (anyone who contributes \$1 to the Hospital in goods or money during the year is a member of the Association.) The Association is governed by a Board of Directors which meets monthly with Mrs. Murray Sargent, Administrator, at the Hospital. The following served on the Board in 1963:

### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of New London:

### Enrollment

Our student population took a sizeable jump of 65 — broken down as follows:

Grades 1-6 164 Elementary Students
Grades 7-8 75
Grades 9-12 213
288 Secondary Students
452 **Total** 

A major portion of this year's increase occurred at the high school level — with the enrollment jumping from 167 to 213 in Grades 9-12. With the closing of Andover High School, 35 students are coming here from Andover and an additional 9 from Wilmot.

We were able to accommodate these students by adding only one additional staff member.

Our 6-year secondary unit (Grades 7-12) has nearly 300 students (288). This makes it possible to run a much more efficient operation — both academically and financially.

### Teachers' Salary Schedule

This is our first year of operating under a Teachers' Salary Schedule which was adopted in January, 1963, by the School Board. It appears to be working well from both the viewpoint of the teachers and the District. Only one staff member did not return this year.

The range for teachers with the Bachelor's Degree (4 years of training) is \$4,500 to \$6,750 over a period of ten years. Starting salary for those holding the Master's Degree is \$200 more than for the Bachelor's with a maximum of \$300 more.

### Tuition Charge — Rental Fee

For the first time this year, the high school tuition charge includes a rental fee of \$20 in addition to the State Average figure of \$449 — making a total per-pupil charge of \$469.

The 1964-65 tuition rate of \$490 is made up of the State Average cost of \$467 and \$23 per pupil rental fee. The rental fee — which must be approved by the State Department of Education — is based on 2% of the capital cost of the high school facilities as permitted by RSA 194:27.

### Evaluation for Accreditation

This has been an especially busy year for the staff as they prepare for the April visit of the Evaluation Committee set up by the New England Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. We can only hope that their many extra hours of service may bring about a better understanding of their part in the over-all program of providing up-to-date high school education for the youth served by New London High School.

### REPORT OF TEACHER CONSULTANT

A PLANNED PROGRAM OF TESTING in general ability and achievement continues as an important process of evaluation at all elementary levels. This program includes (1) general ability testing at intervals of grades 1, 4, 6 and 8; (2) general achievement at all elementary levels, and (3) individual testing for gathering additional information when requested by teachers, principal, or parents. The real significance of the program, however, lies in the uses of these results which include:

- 1. An attempt to note significant pupil performance in achievement as related to general ability. A referral to other agencies is made when these results indicate the need for further diagnosis and follow-up.
- 2. A provision for noting pupil growth from grade to grade in the major areas of reading, language usage, spelling, arithmetic, and study skills.
- 3. A provision for analyzing pupil responses to note those items in need of further teaching or re-teaching. This is perhaps the most important classroom use of these results.

MATHEMATICS continues to receive major attention in the curriculum. Following a series of steps aimed at helping teachers become better acquainted with the newer approaches in this field, including a series of in-service training films, our program will be extended throughout all elementary grades. This should provide for more effective continuity.

A SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM for elementary grade children throughout the supervisory union was initiated during the past summer. The READING program of twenty 60-minute lessons for nearly 70 youngsters (by voluntary enrollment) from grades 1 to 6 was aimed at giving some attention to various reading skills, providing extra practice and encouragement in small class settings over a four-week period. It is hoped that in the future the summer school program will be expanded to include classes in mathematics.

A READING WORKSHOP FOR TEACHERS was offered during the summer through the extension service of Keene State College. This three-week session provided teachers with a review of new materials and techniques in the teaching of reading in the elementary school.

SAFETY EDUCATION through materials from the Child Safety Council continues with emphasis on accident prevention, particularly as a responsibility of the home. Through the cooperation of local law enforcement officers, Child Safety Manuals and other related materials are distributed to youngsters at appropriate grade levels, primarily for home use in developing a safety-conscious community. These materials are made available largely through contributions from many local professional and business establishments.

EDUCATIONAL TELEVISION is used as another aid to teaching in the field of natural sciences for grade 5, physical sciences in grade 6 (New London), in the study of New Hampshire, Grade 4, and in art for those telecasts deemed appropriate by the art instructor.

ADULT EDUCATION continues to be a successful and de-

sirable aspect of the total educational picture. Operating on a self-supporting basis under the Newport Adult Education Program, enrollment has come from many interested citizens in many surrounding districts. This year's course offerings included two classes in oil painting, one class in bookkeeping, and one in woodworking.

CHILD GUIDANCE SERVICES are available for assistance in the solution of pupil learning problems — particularly those stemming from emotional disturbances. The New Hampshire Child Guidance Clinic in Concord, the Claremont Child Guidance Clinic, and the Hitchcock Clinic in Hanover have all been sources of considerable help to us.

I wish to express grateful acknowledgement of the continued support, encouragement, and guidance of many people within the school system and throughout the community in the sharing of these varied services and responsibilities.

### REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL TO SUPERINTENDENT GORDON B. FLINT

Dear Mr. Flint:

I submit herewith my annual report as Principal of New London Central School.

Ever since school opened in September, the members of the staff of New London High School has been carrying on a self-evaluation of the school in preparation for an evaluation by a visiting committee composed of administrators, teachers, faculty members of colleges, and members of the N. H. State Department of Education. This evaluation is required of all member schools of the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools if the school wishes to maintain its accreditation by the Association.

The purpose of the evaluation is not only to study the present educational structure of the school, but to find ways to improve the entire program. The 1960 Edition of the Evaluative Criteria published by the National Study of Secondary School Evaluation is being used for this study.

The Evaluative Criteria includes a thorough study of the many areas of a secondary school. These are:

- 1. A statement of the school's philosophy and objectives
- 2. The characteristics of the youth and community to be served by the school
- 3. The program of studies
- 4. The student activity program
- 5. The instructional materials service library and audiovisual
- 6. Guidance services
- 7. Health services
- 8. School plant
- 9. School staff and administration
- 10. Individual staff members
- 11. Statistical summary of evaluation
- 12. Graphic summary.

The self-evaluation is nearing completion and should be ready to be presented to the visiting committee by the middle of March. The visiting committee, composed of 12 to 15 members, will visit the school April 6, 7 and 8. At the end of their visitation an oral report will be given to the school, followed by a formal written report within a few weeks of the visitation.

The written report will contain the commendations and recommendations for the school. The recommendations will be used as a guide during the next two years to improve the program of the school. At the end of two years a re-evaluation of the school will be made to find out if the recommendations made by the Visiting Committee have been carried out successfully. The results of the re-evaluation will determine whether or not New London High School will maintain its accreditation by the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

The teachers have spent many long hours this past year doing the self-evaluation, but they will be the first to admit that the time spent should make New London High School a better school.
