Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 11

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the Fire Company.

Article 12

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for other fire protection.

Article 13

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the Town.

Article 14

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$230.00 for aid of the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, N. H.

Article 15

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

Article 16

Voted to accept the Report of Agents, Auditors, or Committees as printed in the Town Report.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to accept bids on maintenance of the highways.

4. To see what sums of money, including that required by law, the Town will raise and appropriate for building and maintaining highways and bridges for the year ensuing.

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$364.46 for Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$2429.73.

6. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Winter maintenance of highways.

7. To see if the Town will raise or borrow and appropriate any money for the purchase or hire of equipment for use on the highways or take any action relating thereto.

8. To see what sum of money, including that required by law, the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day, or take action thereon.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Old Home Day.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$51.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the fire company or take any action thereon.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for other fire protection, or take any action thereon.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$241.00 for the aid of the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, New Hampshire, or take any action thereon.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

16. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors or committees heretofore chosen, or take any action thereon.

17. To see if the Town will vote to hold the annual Town meeting in the evening and to set the time for said meeting.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before the said meeting.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The Sullivan library was one of four libraries to share in a one thousand dollar book fund called the Shieling Trust. This fund was established by an anonymous donor and is administered by the State Library. The books purchased with the fund are non-fiction.

The Bookmobile calls every two months, four-hundred fifteen Bookmobile books were loaned during 1959 and read by fifty-five patrons. Fifty books were loaned the library in 1959 from various sources other than the Bookmobile and read by twenty-five patrons. Most of these books were borrowed at the request of patrons.

Two hundred eighty books were given the library during 1959. Forty two new books were bought, twenty-four of these being children and youth books. Four hundred fourteen library books were loaned during 1959 and read by fifty-six patrons.

The Sullivan Public Library is open Wednesdays from eleven to four.

To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Sullivan qualified to vote in district affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the third day of March 1960, at 8:00 P. M. o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
7. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the District.
8. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the district will approve a high school tuition contract with the Keene School District for 1960-61 at \$480.00 per pupil or with other approved secondary schools.
10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to be used as matching funds for money available under provision of the National Education Defense law, such funds to be used for science and math equipment and improvement.

11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 as support for TV station WENH as their share of union support for educational TV.

12. To see if the district wishes to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to be deposited in the capital reserve fund.

13. To see if the district will vote and appropriate the sum of \$1050.00 to pay for the transportation of high school students from East Sullivan to Keene.

14. To see if the district will authorize the school board to borrow Thirty-two hundred dollars (\$3200.00) to cover the partial payment towards the purchase of a new school bus, and to apply the money raised for transportation in school budget item No. 16, Twenty-six hundred dollars (\$2600.00), against the purchase of a new bus.

15. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

March 5, 1959

The meeting was called to order and the warrant read by the moderator with balloting proceeding for the following:

1. For Moderator - Edward L. Jewett.
2. For Clerk - Mary K. Parker.
3. For Member of the School Board for three years: Whole number of votes cast was 33, necessary for choice 17. Mary K. Parker 20. Declared elected.
4. For Treasurer - Mary Hammond.
5. Voted to accept as written in the Town Report the salaries of the School Board and other officers of the district.
6. Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees as printed in the Town Report.
7. For Auditor - Lucile Cordingley.
8. Voted that the school district raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,354.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation as such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization funds, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated income and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. Voted to authorize the school board to enter into tuition contract with the Keene School District for 1959-60 at \$458.00 per pupil or with any other approved secondary school.
10. Voted to raise and appropriate \$100.00 to be used as matching funds for money available under provision of the National Education Defense law, such funds to be used for science and math equipment and improvement.

11. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 to pay for the cost of equipment and installation of the stand-by electric power plant at the school.

12. Voted to pass over this article.

13. Voted to raise and appropriate \$500.00 to pay a deficit appropriation caused by fuel purchase and playground areas at the new school during 1958.

14. Voted to raise and appropriate \$250.00 to be deposited in the capital reserve fund.

It was voted to dissolve the meeting.
