

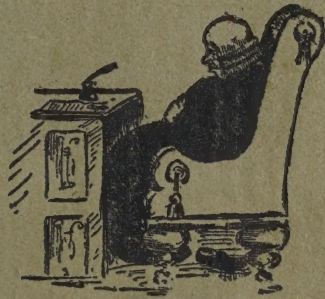

## Warrant for Town Meeting of 1909.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

} L. S. {

To the Inhabitants of the town of Wolfeboro qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Brewster Memorial Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of M a r c h next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Town Clerk, three Selectmen, two Auditors, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes and Liquor Prosecuting Agent for the ensuing year, and one Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.

ART. 2. To choosè all other necessary town officers and Agents.

ART. 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure S t a t e Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January session of the General Court 1905.

ART. 4. To see if the town will vote to sustain their Selectmen in purchasing a steam power for the Stone Crusher and adopt the same.

ART. 5. To see if the town will vote to sustain their Selectmen in acquiring, leasing and repairing the old Lady Wharf, so called, and adopt the same.

ART. 6. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation the recent issue of \$4,000.00 of Precinct bonds.

ART. 7. To see if the town will vote to sell the lot recently purchased of E. F. Cate to the town School District.

ART. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to purchase a Road Machine for the North side of the town, agreeable to a petition signed by C. Henry Nute and others.

ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways, bridges and sidewalks in addition to that required by law.

ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray town expenses.

ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on its indebtedness.

ART. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay each Fireman, legally returned, 1909, in addition to that required by law.

ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay James R. Newell Post, G. A. R., to defray expenses of Memorial Day 1909.

ART. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for laying Sewer on North side of Smith's Bridge, on North Main Street.

ART. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Public Library in addition to that required by law.

ART. 16. To see what action the town will take in the matter of furnishing aid and assistance to the Huggins Hospital of Wolfeboro, and to raise and appropriate money or pass any other vote relating to the granting of aid and assistance.

ART. 17. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of five per cent from the taxes of those who settle their taxes on or before the first day of August; a discount of four per cent from those who settle on or before the first day of September; a discount of three per cent from those who settle on or before the first day of October; a discount of two per cent from those who settle on or before the first day of November; a discount of one per cent from those who settle on or before the first day of December; and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ART. 18. To see what action the town will take in regard to accepting the provisions of the will of Josiah W. Brown, relating to the purchasing a lot for the location of a dormitory in the town of Wolfeboro.

ART. 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.





## A Partial Record of the Doings of the Town Meeting Held March 10, 1908.

Under Article 2 it was voted to indefinitely postpone.

Under Article 3 it was voted to leave the matter with the Selectmen.

Articles 4 and 5 were indefinitely postponed.

Under Article 6 it was voted to raise the sum of \$4,500 00.

Under Article 7 it was voted to raise the sum of \$1,500 00.

Under Article 8 it was voted to raise the sum of \$13.00.

Under Article 9 it was voted to raise the sum of \$75.00.

Under Article 10 it was voted to buy a steam roller and to raise and appropriate one half of the price in 1908 and the balance in 1909. The sum not to exceed \$3,150.00, and that Stephen W. Clow and Frank P. Hobbs together with the Selectmen be a committee to carry into effect this motion. It was further voted that the Stone Crusher be bought upon the same terms and conditions as the Roller and that the same committee be empowered to carry into effect this motion.

Under Article 11 it was voted to raise the sum of \$500.00.

Under Article 12 it was voted to raise the sum of \$200.00.

Under Article 13 it was voted to raise the sum of \$375.00 and also to give the water rates.

Under Article 14 it was voted to adopt the article.

Under Article 15 it was voted to accept the provisions of the Article.

Under Article 16 it was voted to refund the debt in accordance with the Article.

Under Article 17 it was voted to change the name of Sewall Street to Sewall Road.

Under Article 18 it was voted to pass over.

## Wolfeboro Police Court.

To the Selectmen of Wolfeboro:

I have the honor to herewith present the following as the report of the doings of the Wolfeboro Police Court for the year ending December 31, 1908, covering the period from July 27, to December 31.

From May until July 15, 1908, our town by reason of the resignation of the former Justice, Edward F. Cate, was without a Court, and several breaches of the peace were suffered for lack of the proper tribunal to adjudicate.

July 15, 1908, His Excellency Charles M. Floyd, commissioned as Justice of the Police Court of Wolfeboro, Fred. W. Prindle, whose term will expire May 8, 1924.

For failure to secure the appointment of an associate Justice the Court at present is incomplete, but it is expected to be able to announce in the near future that this deficiency has been remedied.

The Court has been able thus far to have given every case the proper hearings without delay.

The first Saturday of each month has been selected by the Court as "return day" in the office of the Selectmen at 9 o'clock A. M.

### Librarian's Report.

TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE WOLFEBORO TOWN LIBRARY:

The report of the librarian can be given only from Sept. 1, 1908, at which time the present librarian assumed the position.

At the time the last report was rendered to the Trustees, Feb. 15, 1907, there were in the town library 1,004 vols. Since then 286 vols. have been added by purchase, and by gift, 17 vols.

During the fall and winter the work at the library has been steadily increasing.

In the last 5 months, 4,749 books have been loaned from the two libraries, an average circulation of 949 per month. The amount of reference work done in the library room has been gratifying.

Within two years, the library has been re-catalogued, according to the Dewey system and in July, 1908, the card system of charging books was introduced. Since then 750 cards have been issued.

Our reading room is well supplied with periodicals. Through the efforts of the academy faculty, this room is now open to the public on Sunday afternoon at the usual hours.

The greatest need of the library is money for new books. It is a question how, with the means at our command, we are to meet the demand for books of all classes and duplicate those worn out by much use. By cooperating with the Brewster Trustees, we have the use of their library room heated and lighted without charge; so that the large part of the money appropriated by the town can be used for books and periodicals.

The librarian wishes to extend to the Trustees her appreciation of their faithful efforts for the library, and to thank the public for the interest which they have taken in her work.
