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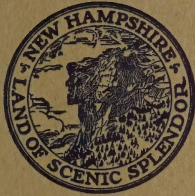

TOWN WARRANT

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the Town will elect two Road Commissioners.
4. To see if the Town will elect an Overseer of the Poor.
5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,474.50 to be used on the Humphrey's Ledge Road for State Aid Construction.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow an amount, not to exceed \$5,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of money called for in the Budget.
9. To see if the Town will vote to build a new bridge over Razor Brook and raise and appropriate money for same.
10. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
11. To transact any other business that may come before the meeting legally.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Citizens and School Board of Bartlett:

The high school has been strengthened greatly by the addition of a third teacher to the faculty. Mr. Harold Norton, a graduate of Bates College, was chosen for the position. Mr. John H. Huckins, a graduate of Norwich University, was elected headmaster, and Miss Jean Smith, a graduate of New Hampshire University, is the other member of our high school staff.

The additional teacher has made it possible to add new subjects to our course of study giving it more flexibility. The new subjects added are Economics, Business Law, Physical Geography, Biology, Advanced French, and a more modern course in Bookkeeping and Business Practice. There has been some extra expense for books and material for the new courses, and we need for proper accommodation of our larger classes about twelve new desks. The equipment for teaching science is meagre and should be added to substantially from year to year. Reference books and library material are below acceptable standards of high school work.

While this year has been to some extent a year of adjustment, the work of the high school is going on with effectiveness and with an excellent morale. More cooperation on the part of parents and pupils is necessary to raise our percentage of attendance which last year fell to 90% and is still too low. The average for a long term of years has been 95%.

The registration at Goodrich Falls last year was ten pupils and this year the school was closed. There was however a greatly increased registration at Glen which without the addition of the Goodrich Falls pupils exceeded the accommodations of the building. It was therefor arranged to transport pupils in grades five, six, and seven from this part of the town to Bartlett. This left the

Glen school still filled to capacity with lower grade pupils. By direction of the school board eighth grade pupils from Intervale and Glen are transported to Bartlett village. An extra trip for the school bus between Glen and Bartlett was necessary and added \$150 to the cost of transportation.

The budget submitted by the school board for next year is based on a continuation of the same arrangement and provides for three teachers in the high school, for a music teacher one day a week, and for the nursing service. On the last two items a liberal allowance in the allotment of state-aid money is made by the state board of education so that the net cost is considerably less than the amount of the budget requirement. The state-aid promised for next year is \$2,515.00.

Article seven of the warrant calling for a deficiency appropriation is made necessary by unexpected repairs which had to be made to the boiler in the grammar school.

We are pleased at this time to express our appreciation to Mr. and Mrs. Scott Simpson for their gift to the Grammar school of a large silk flag bearing the seal of the state of New Hampshire, and of their donation of pictures for the adornment of the walls of the several classrooms.
