TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Benton in the County of Grafton in said state qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Benton on the tenth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To choose one Selectman for three years.

Article 4. To choose one or more Highway Agents for the ensuing year not to exceed three.

Article 5. To choose one Library Trustee for three years.

Article 6. To choose one Trustee of Trust Funds for 3 years.

Article 7. To choose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing year.

Article 9. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing year.

Article 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintaining of the town highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for state aid maintenance for the ensuing year.

Article 12. To raise such sums of money as **may** be necessary for State Aid construction for the ensuing year.

Article 13. To raise such sums of money as **may** be necessary for Trunk Line maintenance for the ensuing year.

Article 14. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on debt and interest.

Article 15. To see if town will vote to keep **cer-**tain highways in suitable condition as far as possible for automobiles during winter, and if so to see what action Town will take regarding equipment suitable for this purpose, and to vote necessary sums of money.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to construct, rebuild, resurface or repair a part of the highway leading from Churchill's Corner in the direction of Tunnell Stream Bridge, and if so voted to designate what portion, and vote the necessary money for same.

Article 17. To see what action Town will take regarding water boxes in the town.

Article 18. To raise such sums of money as **may** be necessary for Memorial Day.

Article 19. To raise such sums of money as **may** be necessary for other town charges for the ensuing year.

Article 20. To see if Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money on the credit of the Town until such time as the taxes may be collected.

Article 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise to fight Blister Rust.

Article 22. To see what action Town will take on purchasing proper tools for fighting fires, and to vote necessary sum of money.

Article 23. To choose all other Town Officers and transact all other business that may properly come before the meeting.

I have examined the accounts of the Selectmen, Town Clerk, Treasurer and Tax Collector and find them correctly cast and properly vouched and there remains in the hands of the Treasurer Feb. 1, 1931, \$2,395.04.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Benton:

I herewith present my first annual report as superintendent of schools.

During the year 1929-1930 the total enrollment was 23; the per cent of attendance, 91.26; pupils not absent nor tardy, 1; cases of tardiness, 4; school visits by board members, 2; by superintendent, 16; by citizens, 51. In addition to those in the town school the district paid tuition for 1 high school and 8 elementary pupils attending school in other towns.

The pupil on the roll for perfect attendance was Roger Carr; those promoted from the eighth grade to high school, Roland McKean and Clifton Tewksbury.

This year the enrollment has been 20. The teacher is Mrs. Ruby C. Beecher. I think the work is progressing well. There are, however, two improvements to the building which would add to the comfort and welfare of the children. These are storm windows for the north west side and more sanitary toilets connected with the school house itself.
