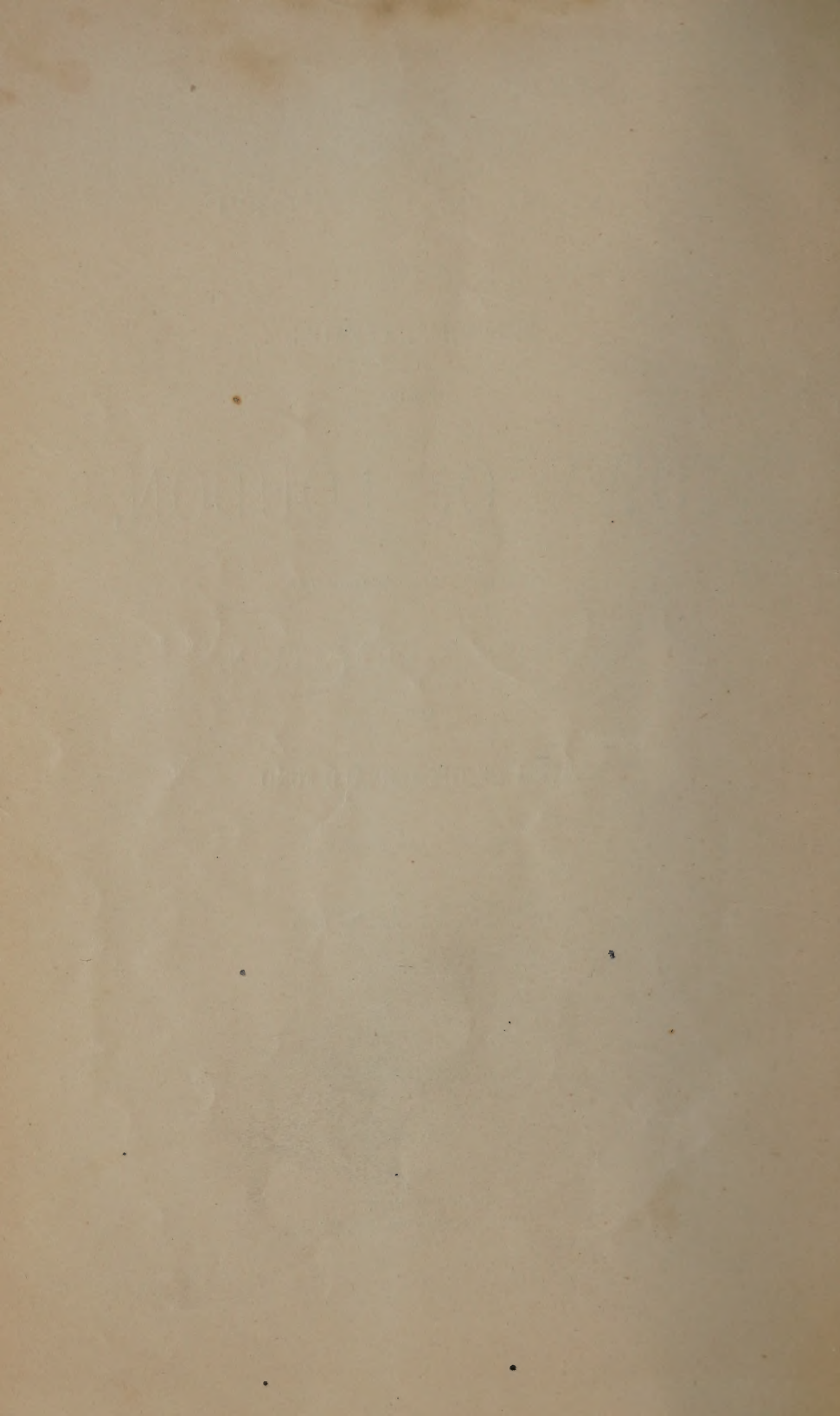

SCHOOL REPORT.

The board of education respectfully submit the following report to the citizens of Loudon for the year ending March 1, 1889:

We are assured that any lengthy dissertation upon the subject of our school system would be of no avail; so we would simply state that each term of school kept in town during the past year has been a success.

We have engaged the services of experienced teachers.

One teacher completed his eightieth term of school. Herein lies one of the advantages of the present system. Fewer teachers are required and the services of the best only are secured.

We do not propose to speak particularly for or against the town system, but we do say since we have the law let us make the best possible use of it while we are living under it. We are glad to report that some of our scholars have availed themselves of the privilege of going to the best schools in town. We will speak only in a general way of the different schools.

All have been successful. Some have come close up to the line of perfection. It is delightful to visit a school where a teacher needs no time to spend in discipline; but where all the pupils are working steadily up the hill of science. In such a school the teacher has nothing to do but to assist them in their search for knowledge.

We regret to say that this has not been the case in every school.

There have been some pupils who have manifested an indifference and waywardness very annoying to the teachers and destructive to the best interests of the school. Profanity and smoking by the pupils in or about the school room *cannot be tolerated*.

Let every parent and friend of our common schools unite in maintaining good order and thorough discipline. When this is done and the scholars are not allowed to absent themselves at their own pleasure, the success of our schools becomes a certainty. There is a law for those who are absent from school but we hope we shall not be obliged to enforce it.

The noblest institution of our glorious land is its free common schools where all may obtain a good, practical education. How many pleasing recollections cluster around the old school room. Shall we not guard it with a jealous care and see that no wayward youth destroy the good results for a single term?

We recommend the practice of witten spelling; careful attention to writing a short time each day, also the use of the word "method" for children just beginning to learn to read.

We hope the time is not far distant when our town will be able to furnish its schools with all necessary text books. If the present school law is allowed to remain upon our statute book and the school houses are properly located, we feel confident that our common schools will be established upon a firmer basis than ever before.
