

We find the uncollected tax of 1914 to be \$1,511.46.



REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

Another year has passed and we are again called upon to give our annual report of the schools of Rumney, ending February 15, 1915, and we take pleasure in announcing that they are, as a whole, in very good condition.

We have maintained six schools of thirty-four weeks each. Owing to some of our teachers accepting more lucrative positions in other towns, we were obliged to make a change in our teaching force, at the commencement of the fall term. These teachers are now doing good work and the schools are fully up to the standard.

Some of our teachers have observed "Parents' Day" in their school, which we heartily commend. We hope a day will be set apart especially for the parents in all of our schools in the future. Parents will always be welcome to our schools, at any time. By these days parents are induced to be more interested in the school life of their children and they will try to do their very best to please their parents.

During the past year quite a sum of money has been expended for permanent repairs. The interior of the Mont View school house has been dressed over, new chairs purchased for three rooms, and two roomy cupboards placed in the Village school rooms for the books and supplies. Quincy school house has had new windows and a few other repairs. This school house should be repaired on the inside. It needs a new floor, new funnel and the ceilings cleaned and dressed over. It should also be re-seated. The seats and benches at the present time are mostly "cast aways" from the other school rooms. I hope a goodly sum of

money will be especially appropriated for this school house, making it compare favorably with the other school rooms.

The attendance in one or two of the schools during the winter term was not very good. For the school year ending July 15, 1914, the percentage of attendance was .99, for which we drew from the state the sum of \$170.00. It pays in more ways than one to see to it that our children are in school all the time. We have made our usual visits to the Bethesda Home and found the school doing good work and under the instruction of Miss Emily Harris, the teacher for the past two years. There are twenty-eight pupils at the present time.

We would make the following recommendations as to appropriations for the coming year: For High school, \$500.00; for text books and supplies, \$300.00; maintenance of flags, \$15.00.

In retiring from your School Board this spring, after a long series of years, I wish to extend my heartfelt thanks to all of our townspeople who have given me their hearty support; and especially to the children who have always extended to me a cordial welcome and have been kind and courteous at all times.
