State of New Kampshire.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookline in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at Tarbell's Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:—

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of the poor, paying the just debts of the Town, and all other legal purposes, the year ensuing.

Article 3 To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of schools the year ensuing.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the repair of roads and bridges the ensuing year, and say how the same shall be raised and appropriated.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the purpose of purchasing text books and other supplies in compliance with Chapter 13, Laws of 1889.

Article 6. To see what sum the Town will raise to meet the necessary expenses of the Brookline Public Library, or take any action in relation to the same.

Article 7. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, or committees or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 8. To see what action the Town will take in regard to observing Memorial Day, raise money for the same or take any action relative thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to widen the highway on the Milford road known as Bohanon's Fill, and extend the sidewalk to Dr. Holcombe's, raise money for the same, or act or do anything relative thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to repair the highway leading from George Burton's place, to the road that leads from the Hall Mill, to the N. B. Hutchinson place, and appropriate money for the same.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to build an engine house; purchase a lot; raise, appropriate, or borrow money; choose a building committee; or act in any way in relation to the same.

Article 12. To see if the Town will instruct its Highway Agent to complete the sidewalk between the barber shop and the Sawtelle corner; also lay flag stones across Main Street at the east end of the plank walk; appropriate money; or act in any way in relation to the same.

Article 13. To see if the Town will instruct its Highway Agents to have removed all wood, humber or other private property from the limits of the high way, and allow no one to place any private property in the highway limits, except for building or constructing purposes, or act in any way in relation to the same.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to repair their Town House so that they can do Town business in it, or make other alterations, or act or do anything in relation to the same, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to abate a portion of the tax on the mill broperty of William H. Hall for the year 1894, or act anything in relation thereto.






