THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Clarksville in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Clarksville on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot or major vote all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and if so appropriate money for same.
4. To see if the town will vote to purchase a Snow Plow and Tractor for the purpose of plowing roads and if so appropriate money for same.
5. To elect a delegate to attend a Constitutional Convention to be held in Concord, in month of June, 1930.
6. To see what action the town will take in regard to purchase of Snow Fence.
7. To see what action the town will take regarding building a bridge over Pond Brook at foot of long hill near R. Rick-er's.
8. To see if the town will vote to build a road from main highway to entrance of Perry Cemetery, also to purchase a suitable gate at the entrance from highway.

9. To see what action the town will take in regard to laying out a new road from main highway to Frank Fearon's.

10. To see what action the town will take in regard to making alternations on room adjoining Town Hall for a Town Office and purchase suitable equipment therefore.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Superintendent's Report

During the year ending February 1, 1930, I have made 43 visits of inspection and supervision to the schools of the town.

For this last complete school year ending June 30, 1930, the attendance has been 94% with an average of 355 half days in school for each pupil. This record compares quite favorably with that of 1920 when the percent of attendance was 83 and the average half days for each pupil was 272. In the matter of attendance the schools are certainly showing great improvement.

Not only is the attendance improved but pupils should now be receiving better instructions as it is now required that teachers shall either be normal school graduates or have had considerable experience.

Standard tests have been given in the schools and pupils have been examined orally in the different subjects in order to ascertain whether or no a suitable progress is being made.

A class of six pupils was graduated from the eighth grade in June and five of these are now continuing their school work in the high schools of Pittsburg, Canaan and Colebrook. This year it seems now that there will be only one pupil to graduate.
