SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Citizens of Madison:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the thirteenth in the

series of such reports.

All the elementary schools are now taught by graduates of the Normal School. The outline of work is the same as usual. Through medical inspection, noon lunches, playground activities and good classroom in-

struction, we are seeking to accomplish an all-round development for the boys and girls. Nearly all of our grammar school graduates go to high school and a good percentage of the high school graduates go to higher institutions. We are proud to have five young ladies from Madison High School, 1925, now in Plymouth Normal School.

Teachers

There are six teachers in the employ of the district:

High School—Stuart Edgerly, Headmaster; L. May

Quimby, Assistant.

Elementary—Beatrice M. Gregory, Mason School, 11 pupils; Margaret I. Glidden, Nickerson School, 13 pupils; Lillian M. Cole. Madison Corner School, 27 pupils; Florence W. Pearson, Silver Lake School, 28 pupils.

I earnestly wich some provision could be made for special instruction in music and drawing, and for a

school nurse to follow up the inspection work.

Character Education

Special attention has been given to character education. An approved Moral Code has been provided in each school and in several has been framed and hung on the wall. In addition to the training which comes through regular studies and play activities, special effort is made through club organization, noon lunch hour, special readings, discussions and study of the code to focus attention on character in citizenship.

Medical Inspection

This work is now done by Dr. C. M. Wiggin of Conway. Reports of defects are sent to parents. Through the kindness of Dr. Wiggin several pupils suffering from throat trouble were given surgical treatment. The good results of the dental clinic reported last year is shown in the decreased amount of dental defects found during the last inspection. Arrangements should be made for another such clinic.

Repairs

A fine piece of work was done at the Nickerson schoolhouse in painting the interior and dressing the seats. Other minor repairs have been done.

For next year we should consider inside painting and slate blackboards at Mason, better light at Madison Corner, chimney tops and building foundations.

Prizes

Several prizes have been won by high school students for composition work. The Lincoln medal was won by Albert Fortier. Two articles were printed in the student-written number of the Scholastic, The National Magazine for high school students. The one by Ruth Pearson on "Harold Baynes" received first prize and the article of "Fox Farming" by Carroll Welch was given honorable mention. Ruth Pearson received first prize in the Junior-Senior class for essays submitted in the state contest under the auspices of the W. C. T. U. and Esther Jackson was given honorable mention in the Freshmen-Sophomore class.

At commencement time Ruth Pearson was awarded the J. Franklin Burke Scholarship prize.

High School

Our high school met with a great loss in the death of E. C. Conner, the man who had done so much to build the school from the beginning to success. We hope his high standards of scholarship and accomplishment may be continued.

Our total enrollment to date this year is 36. The tuition income has decreased and it will be necessary to consider this when we make appropriation.

The fall and winter athletic activities have been under the coaching of Ralph Kennett and the team in basketball is showing itself superior in its ability. The English Club carries on its usual varied and exceedingly helpful activities. The Madisonian is still a very helpful production. Many schools wonder how such a small

school can publish such a fine paper and make it pay. The secret is in the spirit with which the school attacks the job and the fine support of interested citizens. Pupils strive to excel in writing English papers in order that they may be worthy of a place in the Madisonian.

Last June we graduated our largest class, there

being five ladies and seven young men.
