REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

The school room is the training ground of the true American citizen. The future security and prosperity of our land is dependent upon the education of the present generation.

Recognizing these truths, the law provides for the support of our schools, and compels the attendance of the children.

The work of the school is to educate. Education is the foundation stone of power and goodness. The higher education furnishes the polished scholar, the giant in intellectual achievement, and the leader of men. The common education furnishes the men and women who make up the rank and file in our country. In our Republic, with its democratic principles, the rank and file possess the power, and from them arise the leaders.

The common school provides a working education for all; it gives the beginnings, the foundational things in a true education and one may build on this foundation, gold and precious gems as he will.

The employment of the days in the school room determine the future life of the boy and the girl; "As the twig is bent the tree is inclined." Then the school should emphasize several things: the Bible, the American Flag, gentlemanly and lady-like conduct, and scholarship.

Our town schools have been well kept for the past year. Upon final examination, the scholars showed satisfactory, and in many instances, very marked progress. Discipline has been maintained with but little question, except in a single school; in this school some complaints were made by the parents: After a most careful surveillance of this school, the committee would say; the teacher was a stranger, young and inexperienced, but in the end she gave careful proof of her ministrations, for in the final examination the scholars showed the

most thorough mastery of their studies of any school which it was our privilege to examine. There is a lack in some of the schools of regular attendance. Scholars are often absent without any satisfactory excuse. This is a matter that the parents ought not to permit, and one which they can remedy if they will. The regard of the parents for the future welfare of the child ought to be sufficient to bring about the most regular attendance, so that the aid of the law need not be invoked.

The last legislature enacted the following law, to which we call the attention of parents and guardians:

"Sect. 14. Every person having the custody and control of a child between the ages of eight and fourteen years, residing in a school district in which a public school is annually taught, shall cause such child to attend the public school all the time such school is in session.

Any person who does not comply with the requirements of this section, shall be fined for the first offense ten dollars, and for every subsequent offense twenty dollars for the use of the district."

Under another section the State Superintendent is authorized to appoint deputies to enforce the laws relating to attendance. Deputies have been appointed and prosecutions commenced in several towns in this county. We trust that when the deputy calls in this town, no parent may be found who has been negligent in his duty.

We recommend that the sum of twelve hundred dollars be raised for the support of schools the coming year.
