TOWN WARRANT.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Newton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectmen for three years, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Auditors, Road Commissioners, Trustees of Public Library, Constables, Sealer of Weights and Measures, Measurers of Wood and Bark and Surveyors of Lumber, Health Officers, Fence Viewers, and all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for paying the town debts and defraying the interest thereon, for the support and maintenance of the Public Library, and for other necessary charges arising in said town.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25.00 for Memorial Day purposes.

4. To hear the reports of the Town Treasurer and Board of Selectmen to the Town Auditors, the reports of the Auditors, Agents, Committees, or other officers heretofore chosen or appointed, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance (The State will furnish a like sum.)

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$299.50 (in addition to \$599.00 required by law) for State Aid Construction in order to secure State aid of \$359.20.

8. To see if the town will determine the rate or amount of compensation to be allowed the collector of taxes for his services.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

10. To see if the town will vote to reconsider vote now on books regarding flagman at Russ Crossing and allow the B. & M. R. R. to install automatic signalling device.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

At 12.15 a recess of the Town Meeting of thirty minutes was declared by the Moderator and that any one in the meantime who wished can vote on the amendment: At 12.45 Town Meeting was resumed and the following resolution was offered by John E. Hayford, who moved its adoption. "That the Selectmen be authorized to pay the note due the Haverhill Trust Co., in 1922 at as early a date as they can so arrange and save paying interest on same," and it was adopted.

Article 2. The following resolution was offered by John E. Hayford, who moved its adoption. "That we raise all money as printed in the Budget and it was voted to adopt, which Budget is as follows:

Article 4. On motion of I. M. Heath, voted to accept the report of Selectmen and other Town Officers as printed.

Article 5. On motion of Charles E. Thornell it was voted that the Selectmen be authorized to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 6. See results below, on Constitutional Amendments.

Article 7. On motion of James W. Bagley it was voted to pass over this article.

Article 8. On motion of Charles Steele it was voted to adopt Article 8.

Article 9. The motion of George L. Cheney to pass over this article did not prevail. The following resolution was offered by Clarence E. Stafford, regarding the price of renting Town Hall:

\$2.00 per night when hired (and used for their benefit) by any church, I. O. O. F., Rebekah, Jr. O. U. A. M., Grange or Village Improvement Society in Town (or when in the opinion of the Selectmen, Town Clerk and Treasurer the hall should be let at this price).

\$1.00 per night for rehearsals when used by the above mentioned churches or Orders.

\$4.00 per night when hired (and used for their benefit) by any Town person or persons, any private club or orders in Town.

\$2.00 per night for rehearsals when used by above mentioned parties as stated.

\$6.00 per night when hired and used by any person or persons not a resident of Newton.

\$3.00 per night for rehearsals when used by above mentioned parties.

The lower hall alone shall be let at one-half of the above mentioned prices in all these cases, viz. number one, two and three, extra charge may be made if hall is used after 12 p. m. or in forenoon or afternoon at the discretion of the Selectmen.

Free use of the Hall may be granted in writing by, and if, in the opinion of the Selectmen, Town Clerk, and Town Treasurer, it is for the good of the Town's peoples. The Selectmen shall have the power and right to revoke the letting or use of the Town Hall to any person or persons, Church, Order, Lodge or Club, at any time if necessary and in their opinion it shall be for the good of the Town. Voted to accept the resoltuion. 54 Yes. 19 No.

Article 10. On motion of Charles Dart it was voted to raise \$1,500.00 as the share of the overdraft.

Article 11. After much discussion it was voted on motion of Chester Morgan "to raise such sums as is necessary for State Aid."

Article 12. On motion of John E. Hayford, it was voted to raise \$1,200.00 for State Aid Maintenance.

Article 13. The following resolution was offered by Rep. Benjamin S. Andrews who moved its adoption: "That the Town raise \$500.00 extra highway money to be spent in the Newton Junction district, between the town line of Kingston and Martin Fleming's corner, so called, to be spent under the supervision of the Selectmen," and it was voted to adopt the resolution. 49 Yes. None, No.

Article 14. On motion of Enoch H. Nichols it was voted to accept the provisions of Chap. 117, laws of 1917 on a section of the Raymond-Plaiستow road and set aside \$100.00.

Article 15. On motion of I. M. Heath, it was voted to pass over this article by a vote of 27 Yes. 24 No.

Article 16. On motion of Enoch H. Nichols voted to pass over this article.

Article 17. Voted this matter be left to the Selectmen and the amount of money laid out be paid out of the highway money, not otherwise expended.

John F. Germundson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: "That the committee elected and appointed as a committee to build a vault in the Town Hall be discharged and a new committee (be) appointed," and it was so voted.

On motion of John E. Hayford it was voted that the Selectmen write the executors of will of Emma S. Harris and see if they will allow any part of this year's interest be used for the purpose of constructing a fire proof vault in the Town Hall for the preservation of the Town Records, to be known as the "Gale Memorial Vault."

There being no further business the Town Meeting was dissolved at 3 o'clock when the election officers began the count of the ballots on the constitutional amendments, resulting as follows:

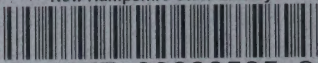
