## Town Warrant.

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### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town hall, in said town on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, Three Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Three Constables, Three Highway Agents, Superintendent of Burial Grounds, Sealer of Weights and Measures, Prosecuting Agent and Two Auditors for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of schools, for the repairs of highways, for the building and repairing of bridges, for the payment of the debt and interest thereon, for the support of the town's poor, and all other necessary expenses for the year ensuing.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the suppression and extermination of the Gypsy and Brown Tail Moths.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of seventy-five dollars to be used in defraying the expenses of Memorial Day, to be paid the Quarter Master of John A. Logan Post, No. 21, Dept. N. H., G. A. R.

Art. 5. To see how the Town will dispose of the income of Common Island and Dow Marsh, for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. On the request of Fred L. Weare and others, to see of the Town will vote to return to the old Highway District system.

ART. 7. To see what action, if any, the Town will take in regulating the digging and shipping of clams.

ART. 8. On request of Fred L. Weare and others, to see what action the Town will take in regard to repairing the Highway from the Stephen M. Gove place, so-called, to the residence of Charles K. Miller, in said town.

ART 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
