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The meeting was opened at seven o'clock in the evening, the fourteenth day of March and the Warrant read by the Moderator.

Balloting for Town Officers followed.

### ARTICLE 2

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000. to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

### ARTICLE 3

Voted to raise the Salary of the First Selectman from \$200. to \$300. 2nd and 3rd Selectmen \$150. each. All other town officers salaries to remain unchanged. Salaries to remain as voted unless otherwise changed at a succeeding Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 4

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. for summer maintenance of highways and bridges.

ARTICLE 5

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000. for the general expenses of the Highway Department.

ARTICLE 6

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$362.75 for Town Road Aid.

ARTICLE 7

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500. for winter maintenance of Highways.

ARTICLE 8

Voted to pass over the article.

ARTICLE 9

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. to be deposited in a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of new highway equipment with an amendment that this money be earmarked for a truck.

Voted by ballot — Yes 37.

No 20.

ARTICLE 10

Voted by ballot, Yes - 30, No - 13 to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350. for support of the Public Library.

ARTICLE 11

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20. for Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 12

Voted to pass over Article 12.

ARTICLE 13

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$51. for the Monadnock Region Association.

ARTICLE 14

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350. for the Fire Company.

ARTICLE 15

Voted to pass over Article 15.

ARTICLE 16

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$233. for the aid of the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, N. H.

ARTICLE 17

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 18

Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees as printed in the Annual Report.

ARTICLE 19

Voted to hold annual Town Meeting at 7:00 o'clock in the evening.

ARTICLE 20

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. in support of Article 20.

ARTICLE 21

Voted that this meeting be dissolved.

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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### WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at eight of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sums of money, including that required by law, the town will raise and appropriate for building and maintaining highways and bridges for the year ensuing.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the General Expenses of the Highway Department.

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$429.53 for Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$2,481.83.

6. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Winter Maintenance of highways.

7. To see if the Town will raise or borrow and appropriate any money for the purchase or hire of equipment for use on the highways or take any action relating thereto.

8. To see what sum of money, including that required by law, the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day, or take any action thereon.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$51.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the fire company or take any action thereon.



12. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for other fire protection, or take any action thereon.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$196.00 for the aid of the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, New Hampshire, or take any action thereon.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors or Committees heretofore chosen, or taken any action thereon.

16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to revalute the Town.

17. To see if the Town will vote the requirement that a permit from the Selectmen will hereafter be required to erect or locate any structure in Town, except a one family dwelling provided it is located on not less than one acre.

18. To see if the Town will vote that no trailer or mobile home be allowed to remain in the Town of Sullivan for more than seven days without obtaining a permit from the Selectmen.

19. To see if the Town will vote to have the Road Agent appointed by the Selectmen rather than elected at large as currently.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the reduction of town debt. This action to be taken by the Selectmen only if all appropriations for School purposes do not exceed \$25,000.00.

21. To transact any other business that may legally come before the said meeting.

Any books may be borrowed from the State Library by the librarian upon the request of a patron.

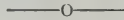

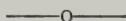

SULLIVAN, N. H.

March 9, 1961



The meeting was called to order and the warrant read by the moderator with balloting proceeding for the following:

1. For Moderator - Edward L. Jewett.
2. For Clerk - Mary K. Parker.
3. For member of the School Board for three years: Whole number of votes cast was 52, necessary for choice 27. Wayne A. Wyman - 39. Declared elected.
4. For Treasurer - Mary A. Hammond.
5. Voted to accept the appointed salaries of the school board as listed in the Town Report.
6. Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditor and Committees as printed in the Town Report.
7. For Auditor - Lucile W. Cordingley.
8. Voted that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$31,654.81 and to authorize and direct the school board to apply against said appropriation such income as is estimated by the school board exclusive of state aid, and upon the determination of the amount of state aid to be received by the school district, during the next fiscal year, to authorize and direct the school board to apply against such appropriation, the sum to be received from state aid, and with the school district clerk certify to the selectmen the balance as an assessment to be raised by the town for school purposes.
9. Voted to authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contract with Keene School District for tuition at KHS at the rate of \$515.00 per pupil for the school year 1961-62.

10. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to be used as matching funds for money available under provision of the National Education Defense law, such funds to be used for science and math equipment.

11. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 as the district's share of union support for educational TV station WENH.

12. Voted to table article.

13. Motion was made, seconded, that the district petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a cooperative school district which includes, in addition to this district, the following school districts: Swanzey, Troy, Fitzwilliam, Roxbury and Richmond. Whole number of votes cast was 59, necessary for choice 30. No - 13, Yes - 46. The motion carried.

14. For a representative to serve with the cooperative school board to prepare a financial budget for the operation of the cooperative district. Whole number of votes cast was 52, necessary for choice 27. Wayne A. Wyman - 29. Declared elected.

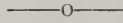
12. Voted to passover this article as the amount of \$250.00 for the capital reserve fund has been included in the total amount raised and appropriated in article #8.
