To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Tamworth on Tuesday, the Ninth day of March next at Nine of the clock in the foreneon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and a Selectman for three years.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for highways and appropriate money for the same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repairing highways and breaking snow for the ensuing year.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repairing and building bridges.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$3500.00 for Maintenance of trunk line.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day observance.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise in addition to the amount required by law for support of town library.

9. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home Day and appropriate money for same.

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Community Nurse for the winter of 1926-27.

12. To see if the Town will direct the Selectmen to contract with responsible parties to scrape the snow by tractor on the highway or on any part of the highway of this town and make appropriation for the same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to buy a piano for the Town Hall and appropriate money for same.

14. To see if the Town will vote to fix the Great Hill Road from Tamworth to Junction of Wonalancet road and make same safe and passable also to vote to raise money for same.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Citizens of Tamworth:

I herewith submit my third annual report as superintendent of schools.

Our school record for the year ending June 30. 1925 showed an average attendance of 134, an average membership of 148 and a percent of 91. The total registration was 175. It is gratifying to know that the number of pupils is increasing. Good boys and girls are the best heritage a town can have; and they ought to be given a chance for full development.

The work is being conducted on the usual lines. I wish there could be a special teacher of music and drawing and a school nurse to follow up the medical inspection work.

There are ten teachers in the employ of the district:

Beatrice W. Marston at Pequaket has seven pupils.

Lula M. Ball at Chocorua has sixteen pupils.

Grace E. Shannon at Downs has nine pupils.

Edwin A. Blackey at Whittier has seventeen pupils.

Florence B. Procter at South Tamworth has twenty-one pupils.

Amanda C. Sutherland at Bennett's Corner has fifteen pupils.

Ethel M. Gilman at Great Hill has seven pupils.

Hazel H. Evans at Tamworth Elementary has twentytwo pupils.

Gladys F. Corbett at Tamworth Grammar has eleven pupils.

Ruth E. Pingree at the High School has eleven pupils.

Character Education

Special attention has been given to character edu cation. An approved Moral Code has been provided in each school and in several has been framed and hung on the wall. In addition to the training which comes through regular studies and play activities, special effort is made through club organization, noon lunch hour, special readings, discussions and study of the code to focus attention on character in citizenship.

High School

The increased number of pupils in the high school is very encouraging. Eighteen were registered in the fall, every available seat being taken. Besides those in the village, pupils were registered from South Tamworth, Wonalancet, Chocorua, Pequaket and Downs. The work is being handled by Miss Pingree, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire. The district should be proud to support this school liberally at the March meeting. Ruth Fortier, who completed the two years' work last June, is now in Madison High School.

Teachers

I appreciate all the faithful work of the teachers. It would help them very much if more parents would visit the schools and observe the children's work. I wish more girls from Tamworth would go to Normal School and train for teachers. We now have two in full attendance at Plymouth—Edith Gilman ar.d Carrie Scammon both of Chocorua. Others are studying summers.

School Property

Continued fine work has been done by the school board during the past year in improving school property.

Playgrounds were secured and fenced at Whittier and Bennett's Corner. This makes it much safer for the children since they are not obliged to play in the state road.

Chemical toilets were installed at Whittier and at the Village which have made conditions much more sanitary.

The Pequaket schoolhouse was painted both inside and outside.

The Village, Downs, Bennett's Corner, Whittier and South Tamworth schoolhouses were painted outside.

A new steel ceiling was placed in the Bennett's Corner schoolhouse.

A new stove was placed at Downs.

During the coming year, attention should be given to the following:

Inside painting at Bennett's Corner; a ventilating stove at South Tamworth; painting at Great Hill and Chocorua; hard wood floor at Pequaket.

By a wise provision of the school board, wood is now bought a year ahead so that the district enjoys the economy of burning dry wood.

The Fair

The school exhibit shown at the fair last fall was very creditable. This will be a pleasing feature next fall, encouraging the pupils to better constructive work.
