# Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

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## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tilton, qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, on the twelfth day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for the term of three years, two or more Road Agents for the year ensuing, two Auditors for the year ensuing, and one Trustee of Trust Funds for the term of three years.
2. To see what disposition the Town will vote to make of the School and Parsonage Fund interest for the year ensuing.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to appropriate for Memorial Day expenses for the year ensuing.
4. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars for the maintenance of the District Nurse Association, jointly with the Town of Northfield.
5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid for highways and appropriate the amount required by law to secure same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to macadamize Pine St., Linden Ave., and Cedar St., from High St. to Pine St., raise and appropriate money for same.

7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Band Concerts this coming summer. Raise and appropriate money for same. By request.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars, jointly with the Town of Northfield, to pay the balance due on the Precinct pumper.

In return for this amount, it is understood that the outside districts have the privilege of calling the apparatus without charge.

9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for all purposes for the ensuing year.

10. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the reports of it's officers and agents for the past year.

11. To choose any other officers and agents for the year ensuing.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Several changes have taken place in the teaching force at the Union School due to resignations in June. Miss Ellen Hobbs of Manchester, a recent graduate of Plymouth Normal, succeeded Miss Sullivan in grade one, and Miss S. Katherine Baker of Hollis, also a recent graduate of Plymouth, succeeded Miss Gerrish in grade three. Miss F. Marjorie Cross of Manchester, a graduate of the 3-year course at Keene and an experienced teacher, was chosen to

fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Miss Aldrich who had been our principal for two years. Miss Marian Letson of Wollaston, Mass., a graduate of the 3-year Domestic Arts Course at Keene, succeeded Miss Starkey as assistant in the upper grades.

Mr. C. Edward Morton of Concord, a graduate of the 4-year Mechanic Arts Course at Keene, has the work in manual training with the boys of the 6th, 7th and 8th grades. Mr. Morton is with us two days each week. Last year no manual training was given as we were unable to secure a part-time teacher. We were fortunate in being able to make this arrangement for this year.

The only new teachers in the rural schools are Miss Mildred Towle, a graduate of Plymouth, at the Rand School, and Miss Marion Dearborn, a graduate of Plymouth, at Lochmere.

The school board and superintendent regret that it is necessary to report at this time the recent resignation of Miss Louise Emery, who has been with us six years. Miss Emery has worked with those children in the lower grades who, for one reason or another, fell behind in the regular class work. Her task has been one requiring much tact and patience. Her success has been marked. Both her fellow teachers and the children are sorry to have Miss Emery give up her work.

Mrs. Lurline H. McCook, who succeeded Miss Elizabeth Partington as district nurse, has taken up the school work with enthusiasm. She has given considerable attention to the underweight problem and has secured the interest of parents and the local chapter of the Red Cross so that all under weight children are served with milk at the forenoon

recess.

At the annual school meeting last March announcement was made of the generous gift of the school district by Mr. Obe G. Morrison of the Eastman property. Mr. Morrison has often shown his unselfish interest in the community and by this gift he met a real need. The school now has a much enlarged and adequate playground for which there has been a growing demand. The lot is well located and with proper development will admirably meet the needs of the community as a summer playground center. The Eastman house has been remodeled in part and a very attractive school-room made on the first floor. This room accommodates a group of first and second grade children, relieving the overcrowded conditions in these grades in the main building. This group is in charge of Miss Louise Blanchard. The upper grade girls have their sewing in two bright, sunny rooms on the second floor, and it is expected that the kitchen will be equipped for the teaching of cooking in the near future. The superintendent's office has been moved from the Union building to the Eastman house. This removal made available an additional room so that no longer is it necessary to use one end of the lower corridor at the Union building as a classroom. Unofficially the Eastman house is known as the Annex.

The boiler at the Union building has now been in use over thirty years. In the opinion of the inspectors for the



indemnity company "this boiler has about outlived its economic usefulness." The company strongly advises that serious consideration be given to its early replacement. The school board will insert an article in the school warrant under which it is hoped an appropriation will be made sufficient to replace the old boiler and to make such changes in the heating system as seem advisable.

The following table makes it convenient to compare the expenditures as proposed by the school board for the next fiscal year with the recommendations made by the school board and approved at the last school meeting for this current fiscal year. It should be kept in mind that the current fiscal year does not end until June 30.
