



TOWN WARRANT

State Of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Benton qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, the fourteenth, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, a Town Treasurer, Auditor, Tax Collector, one or more Highway Agents, not to exceed three, and all other necessary Town Officers and Agents for the ensuing year.
- 2 To hear the Reports of Officers and Agents heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 3 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Officers salaries and expenses, for the repair, maintenance and construction of highways and bridges, for the observance of Memorial Day, and for all other necessary town charges and expenses for the ensuing year.
- 4 To see what action the Town will take in regard to securing State aid for highways, and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for that purpose.
- 5 To see what action the Town will take to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- 6 To see what action the Town will take in regard to keeping the Town Highways open for motor traffic during the winter season and to make the necessary appropriation therefor.
- 7 To see if the Town will vote to dispense with delivery of the Inventory Blanks until April 1st.
- 8 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the school board and citizens of Benton:

I herewith present my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The records show that during the year 1931-1932, 28 pupils were enrolled at Benton Street School. Of these, 2 were non-residents paying tuition. The per cent of attendance was 93.62; pupils not absent nor tardy, 5; school visits by board members, 3; by superintendent, 22; by citizens, 17 by school nurse, 10.

The district paid tuition for 5 elementary and 2 high school pupils attending schools in other towns.

The five on the roll of honor for perfect attendance were Foster Carr, Roger Carr, Winifred Eastman, Harold Tewksbury and Horace Tewksbury.

This year the enrollment has been 32. The teacher is Mrs. Ruby C. Beecher.

Though the school is somewhat crowded and though one teacher has to handle the work of eight grades, standard tests show that an excellent quality of work is being done in this school.

It is to be earnestly hoped that in spite of the depression every effort may be made to keep our school up to its present standard. Much can be done by parents in keeping the children clean, giving them simple food, and seeing that they have plenty of sleep.

I am pleased to call attention to the improvements made in the toilets last summer. I also wish to take this opportunity of expressing the thanks of the district to Mr. J. M. Leonard of New York for his present of a very fine globe.
