



REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.



The past school year has been one of success. The advancement made by the majority of pupils marked. The Swedish system of physical culture which has been adopted in part of our schools has been beneficial in relieving the monotony of sitting, and resting the brain, giving new inspiration to the pupil who has become discouraged over a puzzling problem or rule. Through the efforts of the teacher and pupils at the Grammar School, a large unabridged dictionary has been placed in the school. The Village Primary schoolroom has been improved by new desks and seats, the Grammar room newly papered and painted, and we think our citizens can feel repaid for the generous appropriation made at the last meeting. Worthy of especial note, is the interest manifested by the pupils of the Grammar School in good substantial reading, also in the current events of the day. Many of the papers written would have given credit to older heads. Your Board hope to be able to supply the North and West Schools with maps and globes the ensuing year.

We regret to note the low percentage of attendance, and quote the following from a recent report of Superintendent Fred Gowing. "The work of the school is the business of the child, and every child should be impressed with the idea that his business can no more be neglected without detriment than the business of adults. Tendencies to tardiness and absence seem 'to run in families' along with family traits. The responsibility for negligence of school duties through absence or idleness rests not wholly upon the child, but quite largely upon the parent who knows, or ought to know, the general conduct of his child, and who by inaction, tacitly assents to such conduct."
