Report of the Public Library.

Aside from the regular routine of Library business for the current year, the committee have purchased screens for the windows and door, and a rack for umbrellas, which is used in other parts of the town hall building as occasion requires.

A supplementary classed catalogue was printed in June containing a list of about 300 books that had been placed on the shelves since the complete catalogue of 1901, was issued. With each order of new books received since this supplement was printed, slips containing a list of the same have been issued as soon as the books were ready for distribution. These supplements and supplementary slips have been distributed gratuitously.

In order to take an inventory of books and to select those needing repairs or rebinding, it was necessary to call in all books that were out at the time and to close the Library for one week. During this week the Reading Room remained open.

There has been 113 books of fiction and 44 books of biography, travel, history, in all 157 volumes, added during the past year, also 62 volumes have been rebound and put upon the shelves. 12,141 books and magazines were issued to readers during the past year, of which 8,188 were fiction, 1,272 literature and 2,681 magazines. Of these books the largest number in any month, 1,210 was issued in January and the largest number in any day 153 was issued January 28.

The attendance upon the Reading Room for the past year was 9,332. The average daily attendance was 28½, average Sunday attendance 11, largest daily attendance 65, largest Sunday attendance 21. There are upon the Reading Room tables, 24 monthly, 1 bi-monthly and 1 quarterly magazine

and 9 weekly and 3 daily papers. A slight change in the list of magazines seems advisable from the fact that a few of the heavier Reviews are read but little, if at all, with this change in view the committee would be glad of any suggestion that those interested might see fit to make.

Statistical Report.

PARENTS AND GUARDIANS:

We herewith present for your consideration the itemized report of our Treasurer for the fiscal year ending February 15, and the statistical report of the schools of the town for the year ending August 1, 1904.

The census of school children was taken by Charles Stearns in the month of October last, and shows these facts: Whole number of children between the ages of five and sixteen years, 372: boys, 173; girls, 199. Children between the ages of ten and sixteen who cannot read and write, none.

We take this opportunity to briefly say that our schools have maintained a fair standard in teaching force and student work with little friction. There has been, however, occasion to forcibly impress upon pupils the necessity of properly treating school and other property which has been kindly received and heeded. On earnest request of pupils and parents it seemed best to retain Mr. Frank Barber as principal of your grammar school, and to add to his duties the charge of the sub-grammar school with an assistant.

After many years of service and experience in outside schools, it seemed just to give Miss Hancock the position of assistant in the sub-grammar school, and Miss Higgins the charge of the Labert school. This gave opportunity to transfer Miss Stearns to the Monument school, and to introduce two new teachers, our High school graduates, Miss Hannah Higginson at North Hinsdale, and Miss Elizabeth Belleville at Chestnut Hill. The vacancy caused by the resignation of Miss Mary I. Stearns, was filled by appointing Miss Mabel Temple, our own Normal graduate, to that position with a view to encouraging more of our young people and teachers to take Normal courses. We regret the illness of Miss Florence King, for many years an efficient teacher of Greek and Latin in our High school. Mr. Charles Temple substituted for her during September, and she was obliged to lay down

her work for the balance of the year after the holidays. Miss Razez, a graduate of Mount Holyoke college is most acceptably completing her year.

There has been a change in the teachers of music and drawing during the year made necessary by our combination with Northfield. We believe these subjects important and to be successfully taught by Miss Simmons and Mr. Soulee.

We do believe that our schools speak our common interest in them and sacrifices for them. If there is anything defective in them it is due to lack of training, large classes, and incomplete equipment made necessary by economy.

Your Board has endeavored to perform its duties with the utmost fairness and consideration of all interest. It has visited schools in other towns and cities, and has put itself in touch with the best educational forces with a view to future development of our school system in due time.

We desire to express our thanks to the teachers, pupils, parents and guardians for their hearty cooperation. We will welcome any suggestions you may wish to offer.
