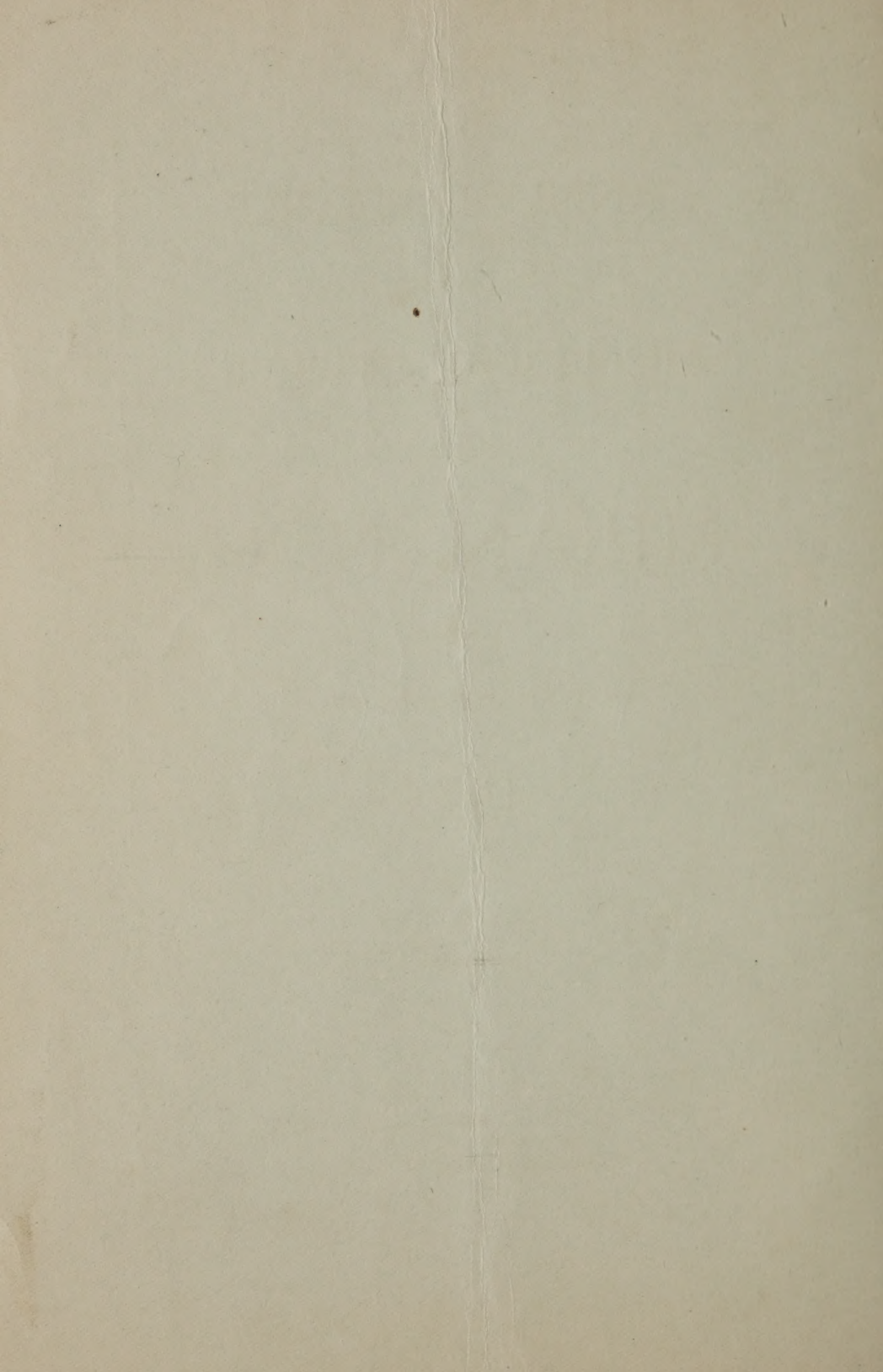

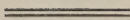

## State of New Hampshire

---

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan, in the County of Coos, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Knights of Pythias Hall at West Milan, in said town, on Tuesday, 13th day of March, 1923, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To chose all necessary town officers.
2. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the, and other necessary charges arising within the town.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for breaking roads, winter of 1923 and 1924.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid construction.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line maintenance.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid maintenance.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, to be applied on the River road, on the east side of the Androscoggin River, from Dummer line to Berlin line.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of books and supplies for the Public Library.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day, and appropriate the same to the Grand Army.
11. To choose by ballot one Trustee of Cemetery Trust Fund, for three years.
12. To choose two Trustees of Public Library, one for two years and one for three years.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair cemetery fences.

14. To see if the town will vote to establish a police court at Milan.

15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from what used to be called the Charles Kimball place to the Solan Lumbert place from any further use to the town.

16. To see if the town will vote to change the road leading to Henry B. Lang's, where it intersects with the main highway leading from West Milan to Berlin, over Hodgdon hill, 40 feet in a southerly direction from the present traveled road.

17. To bring in your ballots upon the question as to whether the amendment proposed by the convention to revise the Constitution shall be approved.

18. To see if the town will vote to buy a tractor, and appropriate money for the same.

# School Superintendent's Report

---

To the School Board and Citizens of Milan:

I herewith present for your consideration my second annual report as Superintendent of your schools, together with statistical table for the last complete year ending July 1, 1922.

During this last school year the Superintendent has made a total of 164 visits of inspection and instruction to the seven different schools of the town, an average of 23 visits per school for the 36 weeks of the school year.

At the beginning of the year the work for the various grades was outlined, the daily program fixed, and at subsequent visits the work of different classes was examined to see that they were holding to the program and that a good degree of progress was being made. The school registers were also inspected at each visit to make sure that they were being properly kept and that the attendance was being maintained at as high an average as could be reasonably expected.

As pupils, classes and methods of instruction will vary somewhat from school to school, it is difficult for an absolute degree of uniformity in progress to be expected in every school, yet approximately the work done by grades in the different schools has been the same.

At various times during the year standard tests in different subjects were given either directly by the superintendent or by the teacher under direction of the superintendent. In the majority of cases the pupils have done well with these tests. An effort has been made in spelling to master the 1,000 most common words in the English language as given by the Ayres Spelling Scale.

All the schools were continued for the year of 36 weeks with no changes in the teaching force.

In accordance with the law the pupils were examined during the year by a nurse, any physical defects noted and the parents notified of such defects. Many of the parents have taken an interest in this medical work and physical defects noted in their children have received remedial attention.

Some new supplementary reading has been introduced in the various schools in order to stimulate in the pupils a desire to

master the printed page and also to familiarize them with the best in literature. Many of the geographies were worn and somewhat obsolete, not having been revised for some few years. These books have been replaced by a modern up-to-date text.

During the summer repairs were made on the village school building. This building is now wonderfully improved and as regards heating, lighting, blackboard space and general sanitary conditions is now in excellent shape.

The lighting at West Milan was also rearranged to conform to the State requirements. Both of these buildings were painted.

The school buildings of the town are now all in good condition with the exception of the Hodgdon Hill school, which needs more windows, blackboard space, and should have the walls repainted.

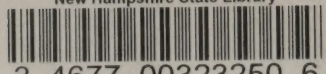
